



Our new physical education equipment in the school hall has now been completed, by adding new safety and agility mats to go with the climbing frame and trestles. The children are really enjoying using all this gear.

We congratulate Bawdeswell and Foxley Playgroup on their first year's successful operation in their new building on the school field; the children in Class 3 enjoy their-turns to help with the little ones on Wednesday mornings.

The Breckland Sports sessions run last term proved very popular with the children. New activities for this term include a cycling proficiency course for the older children, and a short tennis club. We are doing the Ten Step Athletics awards, and football practice continues, by popular demand!

Looking ahead, we will have a Book Fair in the school hall from 3.15pm on 4th, 5th and 6th May, and there will be another Nearly New School Uniform Sale on Thursday 27th May straight after school, combined with a second visit from 'Kiddies Klobber'. In June we are holding a Barn Dance on Friday 11th, and following the success of last year's event, we are having another Technology Day on Saturday 26th.

DIGEST OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON 5th APRIL 1993

The Old Toll House

Mr Gurney attended the meeting and read out his letter to the Council. In short. it is owned by Trustees who would like to restore it but it would cost over £30,000 and only small grants have been offered. It's early history is not clear but it is believed that it may be relatively modern and only takes it's name from the site of the original Toll House. The Trustees will be keeping this issue under review and the Parish Council pledged their support if needed.

Rats are more self-change of the velocity of locative flow self-control to at

The Council had expressed concern about the increase in rats down Common Lane.as one of the adjoining landowners, Mr Gurney explained methods used to control rats but also that 1992/3 has been a particularly bad year with a marked increase in numbers. Environmental Health will be asked to give advice for the public to discourage rats near houses and gardens.

Social Housing

Peter Whittall from Breckland District Council came to give advice on this issue. He explained that Breckland have now transferred all their Housing stock to Peddars Way Housing Association, who are committed to provide 100 new houses across the district in their 1st year. If Bawdeswell wish to help provide more rented housing for local people they must first show that there is a need. It was therefore agreed to have a local survey with a questionnaire delivered to every house. Breckland will provide the forms and analyse them. If there is enough demand it may be possible to negotiate with a Housing Association to build a small scheme. Mr Whittall stressed that this could take time but the principle was felt to be worth it.



The members of the Parochial Church Council were re-elected, and a number of fund raising events for 1993 were discussed.

The first of these, a "ducks and daffodils afternoon" was held at May Tree Farm on Sunday 4th April. Teas were served, Robin and Sandi Taylor arranged a treasure hunt, and there were Jane Ewing won the stalls and competitions. competition to guess the weight of the cake and Ann Middlemas won an Easter egg by guessing how many buttons were in the jar. Several people solved the treasure hunt so name was drawn out of the hat, and this was Robert Hendry of Paradise Road; his prize was a basket of fruit. Mrs. Stewart won the competition to name the chocolate and SO won Altogether just over £240 was raised, including a number of donations. ST. THOMAS' CHURCH FOXLEY

The Annual Vestry Meeting was held in the Parish Church on Thursday 30th March followed by the Annual Parochial Church Meeting. The Rector, Rev. Grahame Humphries was in the Chair and there were 8 parishioners present. Mr. John Harvey and Mrs. Nan Garrod were re-elected as Churchwardens and Mr. Frans Gladwell and Mesdames Harvey, Humphries, Joice, Parfitt and Waters were elected to the P.C.C. Mr. John Harvey was to take over as representative to the Deanery Synod; there were now 20 on the Electoral Roll of the Parish.

in his report the Rector referred to the encouraging start to the Roof Fund Campaign and said that 4 splendid events had taken place in an atmoshpere of great friendliness and had involved people from the wider village community; initial apprehension at the prospect of raising so much moneyhad given place to optimism. Throughout the year the established pattern of worship had proceeded and Mr. Humphries thanked the wardens and other helpers who had maintained the church and assisted in its worship. In the Diocese great changes were in prospect and it wass certain that there would be fewer clergy in the future. It was his guarded hope that there would be continued stability in the benefice.

The Secretary, Mrs. Harvey, reported a good attendance, in general, at P.C.C. meetings. The years discussions had been dominated by anxieties about the Church fabric; major decisions had had to be deferred until after the impending report by the Diocesan Architect. Fund raising had been a major topic but the Christian commitment to the welfare of others had not been neglected and at Harvest Festival the minimum had been spent on flowers so that the money saved and the entire collection that day could be sent to Crisis in Africa, a total of £130.00.

The Rector and Mrs. Garrod had both attended the Deanery Synod during the year, which, amongst -10 -

other issues, had been much occupied with the report of a working party inot Diocesan resources, its proposals for reorganisation and the response toit from the parishes, as well as the projected ordination of women to the priesthood and the pressing need to involve the young in Christian life, a depressing proportion of whom now have no contact with a church.

Mr. Harvey gave a report on the Fabric and stressed the necessity for regular good housekeeping if great expense were to be avoided in the future. He also reported on a Crime Risk Seminar, arranged by Norfolk Constabulary, which had provided much useful advice in these lawless days on the risk of burglary of chuch property, which has increased on a massive scale, and also of fire, both accidental and through criminal arson. Mr. Harvey then propoased a vote of thanks to the cleaners and flower arrangers who keep St. Thomas' in so beautiful a condition, and the meeting ended with the Grace.
