





The Reeve's Tale August/September 1994 Foxley Parish Council

The meeting held on Thursday 7th July was attended by Mr C Skinner, Mrs H Parnell-Cook, Mr P Davis, the Clerk and three parishioners.

Finance - it was agreed to transfer the Parish Council account to Lloyds Bank as they offer an interest bearing current account.

Planning - the official notification of planning permission granted for the erection of a dwelling at Plot 1, Turnpike Farm, Foxley West was received. There was strong opposition to the design of this building from the Parish Council which once again was ignored by the Breckland Planning Department.

Foxley Wood - concern is growing over the amount of traffic using The Street to get to Foxley Wood. Plans for a new road and car park were passed in June 1993 however work has not yet commenced and it is felt that there should be another attempt to divert the increased volume of traffic into the back of the wood by using the Reepham Road in Bawdeswell. Several complaints have been received about the number of forty-seater coaches now using The Street; about the reckless driving of a specific sub-contractor's van working in the wood; about the misleading NNT sign featuring a duck thus causing tourists to believe that they are going to Pensthorpe, only to find that it is 'only a wood'; and about the state of the sewage disposal system at Warden's Cottage where effluent is discharged directly into a ditch. A meeting was to have been arranged between the NNT, Highways and the Parish Council but this never took place. The Clerk will write to Breckland Planners, the NNT, Highways and if necessary the Department of the Environment to report the number and nature of the complaints and request a site meeting to discuss the problems that the increased volume of traffic will bring to the narrow, winding street of Foxley West.

The next meeting of Foxley Parish Council will be in early September, the date to be arranged. Please see the notice boards for details.

The Reeve's Tale August/September 1994 Digest of Bawdeswell Parish Council Meeting held on 11th July 1994

Councillor Sparkes queried why this entry is only a digest rather than full minutes. As full minutes are rather lengthy, the Clerk produces this summary of points raised and decisions made, so that there is room for other items in the Reeve's Tale. The Parish Council would like more parishioners to attend meetings, when they would receive a full account in person. Meetings are advertised on both notice boards in the village.

A victory - after prolonged correspondence Customs and Excise have finally agreed to a VAT refund of £297.93 for the Village Hall.

Our Trees need a drink - the new trees planted around the Recreation Ground need watering over the summer, to ensure their survival. If you live nearby and can help or have a bowser to loan, please contact the Clerk on 688753.

The trees which were to be planted on the site of the paper bank and those which have failed will be replace in the autumn.

Planning - there were no objections to the application from Mr and Mrs Wright to build an extension to Moor Cottage, off the Reepham Road.

Play Area Inspection - the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents carried out an inspection of the Play Area on 6th June 1994 and have confirmed that it meets the current safety standards.

Post Office - see full notice in this Reeve's Tale.

Breckland District Local Plan - the draft of this document is now out for consultation. It forms the planning and development guidelines for the whole district until 2006! There is a small chapter on Bawdeswell which was circulated to all Councillors for comments. The full plan is held by the Chairman at Bawdeswell Store and there is an exhibition and Public Meeting to discuss the Local Plan on Tuesday 2nd August at Mattishall Memorial Hall, South Green, Mattishall.

Recreation report - Councillor Sparkes reported that the accounts are reasonably healthy and that further consideration is being given to setting up a permanent bar. The Youth Club have said they will send a

representative to join the Committee and there is a diary of forthcoming events to be advertised.

Highways - it was noted that Paradise Lane has been resurfaced at last! Some of the verges around the village, especially along the Reepham Road, need to be cut back to make it safer for motorists.

Speeding/Road Safety - Councillor Duncan felt it was time for another speed check along the Reepham Road and the Clerk will query whether the frequency could be stepped up. Parking on the verge near the entrance to Hall Road, along the Reepham Road, is still a hazard to motorists as it blocks their vision when turning out. The Clerk will check with the police to see what can be done.


