In this area this service is now provided by the East Anglian Ambulance NHS Trust.

To improve their response times in an emergency they would like to introduce a scheme which identifies each house using an Ordnance Survey map reference number. This is particularly helpful in rural areas like this, with remote houses, lack of street numbering and vague signposts.

The Trust have written to the Parish Council, who fully support this initiative and have agreed to help implement it in due course. It will involve the delivery of self-adhesive labels to each house which are to be attached to the telephone (An example of a label used on an existing scheme is printed below). These will be delivered at the same time as your Reeve's Tale.

There is no date for the start of the scheme yet but expect further information and a reference sticker in the near future.

During the year of 1993-1994 we have held seven meetings at which a wide range of subjects affecting our village were discussed. Some seven planning applications were considered, including a fairly major one from the Poultry Farm in Foxley West. Although attendance from the villagers is not very good we are very grateful to those 'diehards' who do attend and for the contribution to the discussions that they make.

In general most of the discussion during the meetings was taken up with routine, but nevertheless important matters about footpaths, the state of the roads, rubbish in the lay-bys and so on - all this has to be discussed and the necessary authorities contacted and we hope eventually acted upon. I notice that only this week the white gates at the main road to Foxley West have been repaired.

I am very pleased to say that November saw the closing of the chapter regarding the War Memorial, with a service of rededication held on Remembrance Sunday. The weather was atrocious, but a good number of village residents and the scouts who did the work turned out.

This year we were sorry to accept the resignation of Mrs Gladys
Dewing as our Parish Clerk, but we seem to have fallen on our feet as
we have been fortunate to have the services of Mary Ann Konoba. As
Mary Ann has been a Village Clerk before the handing over has not been
too traumatic (for me at least!). Thank you, Mary Ann.

As the insurance for the Village Hall has shot up by almost £100 this year it was agreed at a meeting with the Village Hall Committee and the Parish Council to share the cost. Unfortunately the Village Hall needs a lot of work done to it to bring it up to Public Health standards and it was unanimously agreed that our 'Project' for 94-95 should be to help the Village Hall Committee as much as possible.

Our year ended with a visit from Mrs Floering-Blackman, our County Councillor, who gave us an insight as to the County's plans for the gold Afuture.

One of the planning applications submitted was for Foxley Wood to have a new road and coach park built through it. As those who live on the Street know, the traffic has greatly increased and it was suggested during the year that perhaps a new entrance could be created along the back road between Themelthorpe and Whitwell crossroads so that the majority of traffic could be fed from the main Reepham to Bawdeswell road. I would like to see this line of enquiry investigated further or it may be too late to alter any plans.

Finally may I thank the rest of the Councillors for the help and support they give to the Parish. Very often it seems as if we sit here for no purpose, but if we don't do anything to help ourselves we can have no grounds to complain if things are not as they should be or we wish them to be.



Chairman's Report (John Fletcher tel 688629)

The year 1993/94 has been generally uneventful with consistent bookings for Table Tennis. The hall was used on several other occasions, one of which caused considerable annoyance to local residents. The insurance costs of village halls have risen dramatically in recent years. The Parish Council and the Village Hall Committee now share

these annual costs.

The event of major significance was a visit from the Environmental Health Inspector in January to view the kitchen. He indicated that a number of standards were not high enough for current legislation. He did not immediately close the kitchen down but requested a programme of improvements which would bring the kitchen up to the new requirements. The ceiling was so bad that the Committee decided to suspend further bookings that involved the kitchen until remedial work of agricultural store and erection of new store at had been carried out.

Quotations were obtained for the necessary changes (ie new sinks and drainers; new units; a hand basin and water supply; materials for replacing the ceiling and other works and for redecorating the kitchen) and the possibility of obtaining grants toward the costs was investigated. The starting point of a grant from the Parish Council has not yet been resolved, the Council having tentatively offered goods in lieu of cash. The response of the District and County Councils will depend on the outcome of this offer. The base of the b

The ceiling has now been removed to reveal a totally unacceptable timber structure above. This will have to be strengthened or replaced before new plasterboard can be fitted. And they stall and addisplaced canon

The response to an appeal for help or money in the Reeve's Tale was nil, although three villages and the table tennis team had indicated previously that they would help. A more detailed action plan now has to be drawn up so that the kitchen can again be used. Although we have relatively few bookings which need the kitchen, the income is necessary to keep the village hall alive.

It is hoped that the works can be completed this year, but it is a heavy


workload on, as usual, a few people.

I am sure that as improvements are made to the Village Hall, however slowly, it will be realised that it is an asset to the village. In the longer term there are a few new residents who may wish to help.

Footnote: as nobody came to the AGM, which was advertised in Foxley, this report is included so that residents might know that work is proceeding. Help is always required - even cutting the grass around the village hall would improve its image. It can't all be left to the Committee Members who all have other commitments as well. Following the disturbances and annoyance caused to residents by an 18th birthday party earlier in the year, no further bookings will be taken from anyone under the age of 21 years. <u>Post Office</u> - The District Postmaster visited the Garage to assess the suitability of the premises for a part time Post Office, on Thursday 9th June. Results awaited.

<u>Highway Matters</u> - An apology is still awaited from Highways for the spring mowing of the grass by the Village Sign which meant there were no daffodils this year.

The Council previously requested that the 'lake' at the entrance to Common Lane be filled in. This is being dealt with by County Hall and some action/a reply is expected shortly.

<u>Ambulance Services</u> - The local Trust who now provide this service wish to improve the response times in rural areas. The Council agreed to support and help with this scheme. More details in this Reeve's Tale.

Recreation report - There are now three regular bookings each week at the Village Hall, including the Youth Club, which has reopened on Tuesday evenings (for 11's and over). Various summer events are planned including two Cricket Matches and a Jumble Sale (2nd July).

<u>Village Hall Driveway</u> - There was a query from a parishioner as to whether a contribution was due from the user of the right of way along this drive. The Clerk will check the deeds and report back to the council.

<u>Planning</u> - Despite objections from the Council and local residents, planning permission had been given for the new house on the land at the back of The Gables. The reply from Breckland Council made clear that local views had been reported and considered but that the Planning Committee took a different view. Permission was also given for the small Pavilion for the Bowls Club.
