In addition to the usual business, this was also the Parish Council's Annual General Meeting.

The Chairman introduced the meeting by reviewing the activities of the past year, in particular the use of the Village Hall, which has done well overall, in its first full year. He especially thanked Councillor Wright and Councillor Cunliffe for all their hard work at the Hall. Councillor Farthing stood down as Vice-Chairman and the Chairman thanked her, the other councillors and the Clerk for their support throughout the 

Andy Battley was re-elected as Chairman, Bill Cunliffe was elected Vice-Chairman.

The minutes of the previous AGM and the financial accounts for the year were agreed. The balance remaining to transfer to 1994/5 was £1040.18.

### The Post Office

The closing date for applications to run this service has expired and there is one proposal under consideration by the Post Office, from Mr Shepherd at Bawdeswell Garage. If agreed, this will run for five mornings a week and would plan to open some time in June.
