



# Digest of Bawdeswell Parish Council Meeting

held on 7th February 1994

Dog Warden Service

Mr Keats, the Dog Warden for Breckland District Council, came to give a talk on the service and advice on the problem of dog fouling. He felt that the best solution to this problem was through education so that people fully understood how anti-social and dangerous dog mess can be especially where children play. He donated some notices to be posted around the village.

The Management Committee submitted a comprehensive report on their activities and finances for the first year of the Hall. In general, fund raising activities and booking have not produced as much money as hoped and the committee are discouraged by the lack of enthusiasm from the village. There is the AGM coming up soon to review plans for the future, which may well conclude that extending the Hall will be deferred indefinitely, unless there is more support from the village. The Parish Council agreed to meet the annual standing costs of £838 for this year and a similar sum for 1994/5, so that profits can be spent on improving the Hall.

Recreation Ground Planting Scheme

Three tenders had been received for the reinforcement of the boundary hedge and driveway planting. It was agreed to accept the lowest price from Nigel Curtis so the work can go ahead.



# Foxley Village Hall Appeal

The Environmental Health Officer (EHO) from Breckland Council has condemned our kitchen facilities, despite the fact that catering hardly ever takes place in it.

However, to conform to legislation and to retain our licence, certain conditions <a href="https://example.com/have">have</a> to be met.

The choice is quite simple! Either we refurbish the present kitchen or we rebuild it within the main body of the hall. Either of these would involve great expenditure. The cruel part of all this is that we were saving nicely to upgrade the heating system, a long overdue venture which has handicapped better use of the hall in the past.

The least cost option is to strip out the present kitchen and replace as necessary the ceiling, the sink unit, the cupboards and surfaces, also to add a separate sink for hand washing (with hot water on tap) and redecorate.

The appeal starts here. With <u>your</u> help in the form of labour we can overcome this problem by sharing it. Please remember that the village hall is for <u>all</u> the community and everyone within the village is entitled to lend a hand to keep it going.

For a few years now, the committee has consisted of three people. We would be very pleased to welcome new faces.

An offer to help with this will not however place you under any obligation for the future, if that is your wish.







Bawdeswell Primary School

We welcome Thomas Webb who has moved into Foxley and will be joining us full time after half term in the Infant class.



The governors have decided that we will have a separate class for Reception children (those aged 4+) in September, as we have enough children on our waiting list to have a class for this age group alone, instead of our usual setup of an Infant Class for children in Reception and Year 1. We hope that we have advertised sufficiently widely the need to put your child's name down on our waiting list if (s)he will be 4 by 31st August 1994 and if you would like him/her to come to Bawdeswell

School. Please get in touch with us straight away if your child isn't on the list, as we need to confirm to parents their child's place by the end of March.

The new reception class for September (Class 1) will mean that Class 2 will be for Years 1 and 2, Class 3 for Years 3 and 4, and Class 4 for Years 5 and 6 (subject to any significant changes in numbers).

Despite the spectacle of ducks swimming in the goal mouth of our football pitch because it had rained so much, the children have been able to keep up their football practices and play two matches, one against Foulsham and one against Reepham, plus an 'internal' game where two Bawdeswell teams played each other. The netball club have been to Foulsham to hold a joint training session, and hockey club is a great favourite thanks to Mr Shaun Hill!

This should relieve the congestion, as well as providing extra workspace.
