














Mr John Ames



The death of Mr John Ames of Barwick House, Bawdeswell, in early December is a sad loss to our village community. John had served that community faithfully and well over so many years. He had served on the Parish Council for many years and as Chairman for much of the time. But it was through John's committed and dedicated involvement in the life of All Saints Church that I best knew him and valued his friendship and positive support. When I came to the parish in 1984 he had already been churchwarden for a number of years and, although

he had had major surgery for cancer in the previous twelve months, was determined to give of his very best. He could always be relied upon to fulfil his duties and to undertake many practical tasks in maintaining the fabric of the church and the care of the churchyard. For ten happy years he continued in his endeavour and when, in 1994, he said he would have to stand down as churchwarden we unanimously appointed him churchwarden emeritus.

His love of local history led him to get all the details together regarding the identity of the two airmen who were killed when their plane crashed onto the church in 1944. John personally made the memorial plaque which now hangs in the church to their memory.

His presence, his smile and his practical support will be greatly missed. Our thoughts and prayers are very much with Irene and the family for the days that lie ahead.



I feel that these people leave us with no alternative but to fence in these areas that affect the children. I will personally make a donation to start a fund to pay for this and through the Village Hall and Parish Council, will start some kind of fund raising events to achieve this. Hopefully at least parents with children will support this and can get in touch with me to help.





Bawdeswell Parish Council - Minutes of Meeting held in the Village Hall on Monday 5th December 1994

Present - Councillors Battley (Chairman), Sparkes and Wright. Apologies - Councillors Farthing and Cunliffe. Minutes - Agreed and signed.

Matters arising - As there had been no requests for an election, Mrs Edna Johnson was co-opted to fill the Councillor vacancy.

-Councillor Sparkes asked for the full minutes of these meetings to be included in the Reeves Tale.

Sometimes space is short and it would not be possible to increase the number of pages in the Reeves Tale without incurring extra costs. The Clerk will check possibilities with the Editor.

The Parish Council also feel that the cost of the Reeves Tale should be printed on the cover to encourage people to pay if and when they can.

Clerk's Report

Finance - agreed cheque no 100170 in the sum of £1102.73 to Public Works Loans Board and no 100171 in the sum of £52.88 to Nigel Curtis for work to Adam's Pit. No 100169 for £8.50 to Trident Map Services was cancelled (see reason in minutes).

Cheque for £25.00 received from Mr Dawson as a contribution to the works to the Village Hall driveway.

-The Council reviewed the current financial position and future needs in order to set the Parish Precept Requirement for 1995/6. Costs had been unexpectedly high in the past year due to the tree planting, the Village Hall standing charges and ground maintenance rises. All of these activities were felt to be unavoidable and valuable and yet had not been anticipated in the original budget. There were also some items that the Council would have liked to do but the reserves have now been used up. In order to meet existing commitments for 1995/6 and maintain a healthy budget it was agreed that the precept should be set at £6000. The Village Hall Management Committee had sent in a request for financial support of £283.88 now and £1500 for 1995/6. The Parish Council did not have resources to meet these amounts now, but agreed to look at this request again in April, when the precept is confirmed.

Correspondence

- Reply sent to Mr and Mrs Whybrow about the Recreation Ground hedge and invitations to tender for regular trimming work sent to Gurneys and Harrolds.

- Reply awaited from PCC about churchyard and cemetery.

- Common Lane footpath - still no satisfactory reply from Highways; it was agreeed to hold this item for Councillor Floering-Blackman.

- After months of correspondence with the East Anglian Ambulance Trust and rather fruitless enquiries to find the best way of helping to identify and reference addresses, it was decided to refer the scheme back to the Trust to resolve. The Clerk will send copies of paperwork to the Chairman and cancel the maps order.

- The Old Toll House. Both County hall and Breckland had been very helpful on this issue. A leaflet is on its way on the guidelines for action within a Conservation Area. which can be reconsidered at the next

meeting.

Planning - Application received for Mrs Y L Wright to stand a mobile home in the ground of The Old Rectory, planning ref no3/94/1189/F. No

objections made.

- A copy of a letter from Mr and Mrs Vince of Wood Farm was read out; they were concerned about the possibility of more Turkey Sheds at the site on the junction of Reepham Road and Furze Lane. These comments will be kept on file in case there is a planning application. There were no further reports to this meeting.

Next Meeting Monday 6th February at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.


