




Editorial Welcome again to the pages of your local magazine. I hope that you have had a good Easter break.



Bawdeswell Parish Council Minutes of Meeting held in the Village Hall on Monday 6th March 1995

Present - Councillors Battley (Chairman), Sparkes, Farthing, Cunliffe, Johnson, Strickland and Wright, and three parishioners.

Apologies: None.

Minutes - Agreed and signed.

#### Matters Arising

Regarding the maintenance of the churchyard and cemetery, it was confirmed that Mr George Brookes has agreed to take on this work. A mower and strimmer are available and it may be necessary to provide goggles and ear defenders. As Church Warden Miss Joice agreed to pay for the petrol and the Parish Council will pay for up to 2-3 hours work per week (in the season). The Clerk will now contact the Reverend Humphries who will discuss the detail of the works with Mr Brookes. The Community Service Volunteers visit due shortly would hopefully help to keep things tidy until this new arrangement is in place.

#### Clerk's Report

Finance - Agreed cheque no. 100176 in the sum of £50.00 to the Clerk for Petty Cash and no. 100177 in the sum of £73.86 to the Norfolk County Association of Parish and Town Councils for annual subscription and stationery.

- The Clerk's business telephone calls for November - February in the sum of £3.31 were approved, to be paid out of petty cash.

#### Correspondence

- This meeting marked the end of the term of office for the current Councillors, as elections are due on 4th May 1995. The Chairman thanked his colleagues and the Clerk for their support and hard work. The Clerk reported that no-one had come forward to be new Councillors and as the deadline was the following day, she agreed to take nomination papers from all the Councillors for re-election, for delivery by hand.

- The Audit papers for 1994/95 have been received and notices will be posted by the end of the month.

Dog fouling on the Recreation Ground.

The Clerk had asked the District Council about Bye-laws: they said they had no plans to introduce one which would cover sports grounds and play areas in villages but noted our concerns. Other villages had also made enquiries so the Clerk will put in a formal written request for a new bye-law.

In the meantime the lowest quotation for fencing off the five-a-side pitch and play area was from May Gurney in the sum of £767.22 plus VAT. (This is to supply only as the installation will be done by volunteers, but does include two gates for pedestrians and mowing machines).

As only £90.00 has been received in donations, there was a long discussion, including those parishioners present, about whether to proceed with the fencing, bearing in mind the shortage of Parish Council funds.

On balance it was decided to buy the fencing and have it installed but continue to appeal for donations and apply for a grant from Breckland District Council, so that the children's areas are protected in good time for the summer holidays.

Councillor Strickland provided some information on Toxocara which could be put in The Reeve's Tale.

- Two quotations have been received for hedge trimming around the Recreation Ground but the Clerk will need to clarify their pricing basis as they range from£90.00 to £234.00 per annum.

School Report Miss Joice reported that all was well. The number of pupils is still just below 100 and there are no plans to expand further at this time.

#### **Recreation Report**

The Treasurer gave a brief report on the state of the accounts. The final amounts will be confirmed after interest is added but are roughly £600 in the current account and £3600 in the deposit account.

Any Other Business Councillor Sparkes handed over some deeds and paperwork concerning the Village Hall, to the Clerk for safe keeping.

#### Foxley Church

Recently a letter from the Churchwardens and Foxley P.C.C. was delivered to every house in the village, inviting all residents to a meeting in the Village Hall, which, it is no exaggeration to say, was to decide the fate of the Parish Church.

The P.C.C. had realised that, despite raising £6500 in the last few years, and a generous offer of a grant from English Heritage, the money in hand still fell far short of the sum required to pay for the re-roofing of the nave and the other work necessary, and, without which, the Church would soon not be safe to use for services.

The meeting was told by Mr John Harvey, Churchwarden, that, if the work could not be started within a year, the grant offer would lapse and the likely future of the Church would be redundancy and eventual ruin. The small congregation could not bear the full burden of paying its dues to the Diocese and its own running expenses, as well as maintaining the fabric of the ancient building. The Church has stood at the heart of the village for many hundreds of years, and in every century since the records started, improvements and additions had been made: was our generation to be the one that allowed at least nine hundred years of Christian witness in Foxley to die?

Happily there was a generous and positive response from the thirty or so villagers present and promises of help from several others. Suggestions were made for a whole series of fund-raising events. Foxley is going to be a very busy place this summer!

Ideally it would be wonderful if everyone could make a contribution to saving our Church: a number of those present were enthusiastic about joining an 'Envelope Scheme' through which regular gifts could be made to the Fabric Fund. This would enable those with little time or energy to spare to do their bit. Anyone interested should contact Mrs Joyce Waters on Bawdeswell 688558.

Appropriately there will be an opportunity to 'raise the roof' in a different sense on Sunday 7th May at 6.00pm when we shall be singing 'Songs of Praise' to celebrate the fiftieth anniversary of our deliverance from warfare. Do come and join us!
