





NURSERY VOUCHERS



Earlier this year it was announced by the Government that they were planning to introduce a Nursery Voucher Scheme.

The scheme will be launched in pilot areas. Parents will receive vouchers worth £1,100 in their child benefit books to be used for pre-school education for their four year olds from the start of the Easter 1996 term.

The vouchers are able to be used towards a five day a week part-time place in nursery schools (either independent, voluntary or state). Vouchers will also be able to be used towards the cost of a full time place in any playgroup.

Vouchers are redeemable in both private or public sector schools - if you choose a private scheme then parents will be able to top up the value of the voucher from personal funds.

At the time of going to press, it has not been announced where the pilot areas will be, although the scheme goes nationwide in February 1997. More information from your local Citizens Advice Bureau.

Clerks salary paid on standing order of £70. Cheque received from Breckland D.C. of £24 for glass recycling & direct debits of £354.97 and £176.64 for VAT refunds. Demand received from Breckland D.C. for £52 for Parish Council election costs. As the nominations received, matched the number of vacancies, there was no formal election so the clerk was asked to check whether a charge is payable.

Correspondence The Clerk was asked to investigate the possibility of having a Can Bank at the Village Hall and check with the School who already do some recycling. Play Area Fencing, after weeks of trying, it has proved impossible to find anyone willing to install this fencing. It is important to have it properly stretched and tightened, and therefore more than a minor DIY task. May Gurney who have made the fencing, are keen to be paid and have the materials in store awaiting further instructions. It was agreed to pay the cost of the materials and Councillor Wright would try to find a local fencer, cheaper than the original quote. Recreation Committee Councillor Wright reported that the new committee is working well and there is great optimism and enthusiasm for proposals to extend the Hall using National Lottery and Sports Council funding.

PARKING CHANGES AT NORWICH HOSPITALS

From October 2nd, 1995, there will be changes to the parking facilities at both the Norfolk & Norwich, and West Norwich Hospitals. The Changes are designed to make it easier for patients and visitors.

Charges have been introduced, to contribute towards the cost of operating the car parks. Staff, and patient/public parking areas have been separated, providing over 200 spaces for patients and the general public in pay and display car parks at both hospitals.

Patients attending the hospital for an appointment will pay 70p for up to 4 hours parking, if displaying a patient parking voucher in their vehicle. This will be issued by the hospital. For anyone else visiting the hospital, the charges are:

up to 2 hours £ 1.00 up to 3 hours £ 1.50 up to 4 hours £ 2.50 4-5 hours £ 5.00

There are special areas for disabled drivers, who may park free for up to 3 hours, and also for dropping off or picking up patients or visitors.

Fully trained car park staff are available on each site between 7am and 9.30pm, to patrol the sites and offer help when required.


Launching Out with Noah's Ark
