Dear Friends,

The year to mark 900 years of Christian witness in the Diocese of Norwich has started. Both Churches have copies of the events guide which show the variety and scope of all that is on offer. Many of these will be taking place at Norwich Cathedral like the Flower Festival in July and the dramatic presentation "Fire from Heaven" in early August. In just a few days time on Friday 9 February "Any Questions" will be broadcast live from the Cathedral and in April "Mastermind" will see the famous black chair in the same building. The Bishop's Pilgrimage around the Diocese has, of course, been underway since last Spring and we look forward to having him with us in Sparham Deanery during Holy Week. He has chosen All Fools Day (April 1st) to visit Bawdeswell! A vital part of his week with us will be the evening Bible Studies which will be based on the Resurrection appearances of Jesus as recorded in St. Luke's Gospel chapter 24. This gospel has formed the bases for the bible studies throughout Bishop Peter's year on the road. We will be holding our usual series of services during Lent around the Deanery, beginning on Ash Wednesday at Weston Longville. Our series of sermons will be appropriately be on some of the main themes from St. Luke. Details are given in the list of services in the Reeve's Tale, you will be most welcome to any of these.

Every six years Church of England parishes are required to prepare a brand new membership list (known as the Electoral Roll). Bawdeswell School Wildlife Pond Project

It was decided some time back that it would be pleasant if the pond planned for school grounds could be constructed thus continuing the nature area project started in 1993 on the school field. After initial discussions between the staff and Ken Walton it was decided that a feasibility study be undertaken. Ken produced this along with a detailed design document which was submitted in draft form to the staff and governors of the school for comment. After minor modifications this was agreed and presented to parents at the parents/governors meeting. The project is underway and approval has been granted by NCC Education. Unfortunately the Council will not fund the project so it is being undertaken as a fund/build project with Ken Walton as project leader thus lieving the teaching staff of the extra work load. Over 60 equests for sponsorship both county and national have been issued and their response is awaited but in the meantime local fund raising has commenced by the children themselves. Matters arising - The Clerk was asked to contact PC Jackson to chase up information on the Neighbourhood Watch meeting proposed for February

Clerks Report -

Finance: Agreed cheque for the Public Works Loans Board and Clerks Salary of £75 for December and January

A decision was needed on the level of precept for 1996/7 as the deadline was during Christmas holiday. It was decided to leave it at the same level and to try and build up some reserves to pay off the loan for the Village Hall driveway early, so that the precept can come down as soon as possible, as there are now only three payments remaining

It was agreed to authorise framing of the art competition results, so that they can be put up in the Village Hall, at a cost of £55

Correspondence: Bawdeswell Heath - The November trustees meeting had heard proposals from the County Woodlands Officer, Mr Harris for a management scheme which may attract some grant funding but require an initial investment of £1000. Mr Gurney, Chair of the Heath Trustees will come to the March meeting of the Parish Council to explain the proposals in detail

School Report: Mr Shreeve is still away and is making slow but steady progress. Mrs Parker was praised by the Governors for her work in his stead and other temporary teaching arrangements are going well

Recreation Report: Bonfire Night celebration had gone well and raised £220 after expenses but there was still some clearing up to be done. There was some concern over the lack of fundraising plans and whether basic costs would be covered this year

Any other business: The Chairman gave details of complaints about rubbish and noise problems around the village sign. They are part of an on-going problem of some 18 months now, which started on the shop forecourt and some of those involved are banned from the shop. The Police have been called and should be called again if incidents cause nuisance and there has also been some vandalism to the Village sign itself, which will be repaired

Further problems were reported in Blackhorse Close with noisy dogs which are now being dealt with by Breckland Environmental Health.

Councillor Sparkes asked whether it would be possible to have a prominent sign directing people to the Village Hall, off the Reepham Road. the Clerk will investigate the cost and maintenance implications.

Miss Joice expressed appreciation of the good work being carried out by Mr Brookes in the churchyard and it is hoped that this can be extended to cover the Cemetery too. The Chairman agreed to discuss this with Mr Brookes




