
















'Another' Easter Cake Recipe

First prepare the kitchen for action! Heat the oven to 300°f or 150°c then have close to hand the following ingredients:-

	11b/450g	Dried mixed fruit
	8oz/225g	Butter or Marg
	6oz/175g	Soft Brown Sugar (or similar)
	12oz/350g	Self-Raising Flour
	½ tsp	Mixed Spice (optional)
	½ tsp	Bicarbonate of Soda
413	1 tbsp	Treacle
	2	Eggs (size 3)
	½ pint	Cold water
	2oz/50g	Cherries or Apricots or Dates
		(freedom of choice)
	2oz/50g	Walnuts or almonds
		(freedom of choice)
rea	se a 8/9"/23cm	- approx' 3" deep round baking tin

- - Put all fruit, butter, sugar, treacle, water into large saucepan bring to boil and simmer for 15 minutes leave to stand and cool completely (a chance to go out, fetch the children, ring a friend or clean up the mess you've just made! - your choice)
- Beat in flour, spice, bicarbonate of soda, eggs cherries (or similar) & walnuts (or similar) until evenly mixed. Spoon into prepared tin level surface
- Cook in preheated oven until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. (2 hrs approx') Turn out on a rack to cool.

Slice, serve with butter & a cuppa tea or coffee

Bawdeswell Parish Council Minutes of meeting Monday 5th February 1996

LAST MEETING: Agreed and signed

MATTERS

ARISING: The chairman reported that arrangements are being made for a Public Meeting to set up Neighbourhood Watch and a date will be publicised soon

CLERKS REPORT

Finance: Agreed cheque for £55 to Mr Walton for framing pictures; £109.86 to the auditors Cooper & Lybrand; £1.90 for a new NCAPTC handbook; £50 for School Pond Project and Clerks salary of £75 for February. The Clerks business telephone bill was agreed and sum of £4.61 will be paid from petty cash. Cheques received £14 for Recycling credit and £384 grant from Breckland D.C. towards the Play Area Fencing. Breckland D.C. confirmed the Parish will receive £6,000 precept and £1,265 in Support Grant for 1996/7

Planning: Application received from Powleys Office Furniture to alter the old post office to a dwelling, with windows and front elevation to match adjacent house. No objections

Correspondance: National Spring Clean Week is 12-21 April, a Village Clean-up will be arranged. Breckland will send a publicity pack nearer the time

The Grounds Maintenance contract with Norfolk County Services (who cut the grass on the recreation ground) was renewed for the coming year

Traffic speed controls. Following various meetings and letters, highways have now installed signing to mark the turning into The Street, off Reepham Road and have agreed to monitor and review the request to extend the 30MPH limit and improve the signs along the Reepham Road

A detailed request for a bold sign to show the location of the Village Hall has been sent to the highways; a reply is awaited

Breckland D.C. are considering introducing Dog Waste Collection bins and sought local views. The emptying service would be free if the bins are provided by the Parish Council. Suitable sites proposed were:- Common Lane entrance, Bawdeswell Heath Car Park, Recreation Ground and Billingford Lay-By. Costs and further details will be required before a final decision is made

Play Area Fencing During the preceding weeks the fencing had been erected around the Play Area and 5-a-side pitch, to keep dogs out. There was a lengthy discussion about problems which had occurred during this work, which included damage to the underground electricity cable to the Village Hall and the lack of concrete around some of the fencing posts. The Contractor, Mr Debenham was present at the meeting. The posts now have some concrete to help stabilise them and a bill is awaited from Eastern Electricity for the cable repairs. May Gurney will be asked to come out and inspect the completed work and following a favourable report, the invoice will be paid. Mr Debenham agreed to carry out any further work, if specified by May Gurney and to have the Eastern Electricity bill passed to him to resolve

On receipt of written confirmation of this agreement an interim payment to Mr Debenham of £200 was approved (Since the meeting Mr Debenham has independently agreed to further work to improve the fencing, so May Gurney inspection was no longer required)

School Report Mr Shreeve is still away and is not expected to return until after half term. Details of the School Pond Project had been circulated and were discussed at some length. It had unanimous support as an asset to the school and a valuable support to the National curriculum. It was agreed to allocate £50 to help with the cost and as this is a long term project, to consider a further request for funds is necessary, next financial year. The Clerk will also forward any information on grants, competitions and awards which arrive in the course of her work, which might help with the funding

Recreation Report The Parish Council was concerned about the lack of fund raising events to support the running costs of the Village Hall. It was hoped that some action would come from the recent questionnaire sent out with the Reeve's Tale and the Clerk was asked to make a complaint about the delay in clearing up the bonfire site, which is an unsightly mess on the car park

Any other business As all Councillors had not yet read the information on Bye-Laws, it was agreed to defer this item until the next meeting


