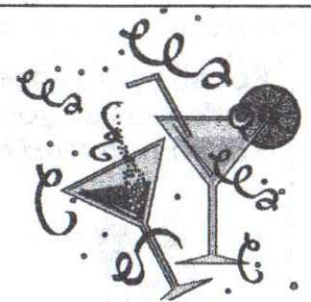

We had a tremendous start to the new academic year with record results. Of those attending Year 11 last year, 63% got 5 A\* to Cs and above in their GCSEs. But even more importantly the average point score, which represents how every pupil did was our highest yet. So well done to all of those pupils; we look forward to seeing them and their parents at Awards Evening on 30 October.

**Present:** Mr.J.Harvey (Chairman) Mr.N. Mears (Vice Chairman) Mr. Driver Mrs. R. Waller Mrs Slattery.

**Minutes:** The minutes of the last meeting on Tuesday July 2nd 2002 had been previously circulated and were accepted and signed as a true record of the proceedings.

**Matters Arising:** *6A 4 Bus Shelter* Investigation of grants will continue, as information so far received would leave a considerable shortfall.

*Traffic Matters A1067* No official notification had been received about the implementation of the 50mph.

*6B 8d Village Appraisal* The questionnaire 'Focus on Foxley' has been completed and will be ready to be distributed in early October.

### **Correspondence**

- a) Community Waste Advisor. Mr. Peter Cockburn has been appointed to the post to help Breckland Council with the new recycling scheme. He will be speaking at the Elsing Parish Council meeting on Monday November 11<sup>th</sup> at 7.30 in the Village Hall. All local people are welcome to attend.
- b) A letter had been received from the Bawdeswell Heath Trust to ask if the Council would provide a bin for dog droppings at the end of the lane leading from the car park on the Bawdeswell/Billingford Rd. A decision will be made when information on costing and emptying has been established. When the 20mph is implemented the providing of bins will become mandatory in the village.
- c) Mobile Police. PC Christopher Howes has been appointed to the Western Mobile Police Station as a full time Police Officer. He is not a replacement for the parish liaison officer but an addition so that the service can be improved. Times for the visits of the Mobile Vehicle are November 21<sup>st</sup> and December 19<sup>th</sup> from 9.30 to 12pm by the Village Hall.
- d) Breckland Air Quality Control. Air quality is reported as good for the area. The next review is December 2003. A copy of the report is available from Zanda Waterford 01362 656350
- e) DEFRA Parish Councils & Planning. In the new streamlining of planning arrangements parish councils will not lose their right to be consulted.
- f) Norfolk County Council. They are concerned that pupils over 16 who are eligible for transport are not applying. A poster was displayed but if any information is required ring 01603 223800.
- g) Document on the Freedom of Information Act. Discussion was deferred until the next meeting until Councilors have had time to read the document.

### First Time Sewage: Chapel Road Foxley West

Sarah Cawston of the Environmental Health Department has written to Anglia Water to recommend Foxley be considered for connection to the main sewer. Her investigation found a high water table and many surface ditches in the area polluted with septic tank effluent creating a smell and a health hazard. She is investigating where the contamination is occurring. Anglia Water will be contacted.

Mr. Wharton said that Foxley would not come under 'First Time' as there is a sewer in The Street. What had been a drain had been designated a sewer when Anglia Water took over.

### Ditches

Mr. Warren the land drainage officer is arranging for a survey of the ditch upstream towards Foxley Lodge because of flooding.

**AOB** a) Bonfires: Parishioners are asked to consider the effect of smoke and smell on their neighbours when they light bonfires. Smoke can be particularly distressing for people suffering from respiratory disorders.

b) The huge lorries going to Foxley Wood are causing concern. Work will come to a close very shortly and the clerk will discuss the future with Mr. Milton of the Norfolk Naturalist's Trust.

c) A drain is blocked by Church Farm. Mr. Fanneran of Highways will be contacted.

## BAWDESWELL HEATH TRUST by Bill Flynn.

**VANISHING HEATHLAND:** Comparison of aerial photographs of Bawdeswell Heath taken in 1946 and 2002 tell their own story of how the open areas of the former heath have been overgrown by the incursion of mainly regenerating silver birch. (See magazine website.) The disappearance of hedgerows from nearby fields is also very noticeable. We may not save the hedgerows but we could salvage the remnants of the heath.

**COUNTRYSIDE STEWARDSHIP SCHEME:** Our application to join this scheme was submitted in late April and after prolonged negotiations, it is anticipated that a decision will be made by DEFRA in our favour within the next few weeks. If our application is accepted, the work to restore and regenerate selected areas of the heath can be started.

**BAWDESWELL HEATH TRUST FUNDS:** Income from the Trust from its former sources has seriously diminished and its main expenditure is now the mandatory premium for its public liability insurance, which mainly covers public access to the heath. It is possible that many of the regular users of the Heath may wish to help the Trust to continue to provide the existing recreational facilities, by making some sort of donation. A donation box will soon be available in Bawdeswell Stores, by kind permission of Mr A Battley, and further information is available from the Trust honorary Secretary, Miss M Joice.

**ROUTINE MAINTENANCE:** Once more we are being assisted by occasional visits from the probation service, who provide conservation tasks for people who are doing community service. This year again their efforts are being concentrated on clearing vegetation along the stream, footpath clearance, and removal of fallen trees.

**THE LITTER PROBLEM:** Over the past few months there appears to have been a noticeable increase in the amount of litter discarded by heath users, also by fly-tipping. It has been managed recently by collecting the litter, bagging it and disposing of it in home domestic bins. In view of the new system of waste collection by the local authority, this will no longer be permissible. Advice has been sought from Breckland DC and the situation is under review.

**DOGGY DROPPINGS:** Some concern has been expressed recently over the subject of dogs fouling footpaths and play areas on the heath. The question has been asked as to what we should do to encourage dog owners to clear up dog waste and should we provide receptacles for the disposal of such matter. Breckland District Council has agreed that they would have a liability to regularly clear such bins if they were installed. The Trust is negotiating with Parish Councils, both Bawdeswell and Foxley concerning the provision of waste bins at both access points to the heath.

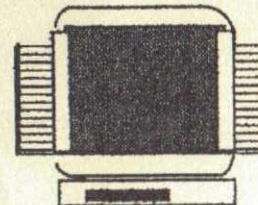
