George died here in Pembrokeshire South Wales on the 31st May 1943, I have the full details."

A photo was sent and the following reply received:

"G.H. Parke; RAOC aged 20 died 31 May 1943. Son of Herbert and Martha Parke of Bawdeswell.

After repeated warnings Parke failed to keep to the correct path on a firing range near Tenby, killed instantly by an explosion. He was attached at the time of his death to the R.E.M.E. and had been a butcher's assistant living at Norwich Rd Bawdeswell East Dereham."





BAWDESWELL BOOK CLUB

For our meeting at the beginning of March we read Eat, Pray Love, by Elizabeth Gilbert. It seemed a good idea at the time as the film was being shown in the Village Hall and seeing the film could act as a media comparison in our discussions, we thought. The conclusion we came to was that neither the book nor the film were worth the time spent on them! Perhaps we are too old and cynical. The New York writer Elizabeth Gilbert who had been fairly successful by the time she was 30 found her life unhappy, she needed more self-fulfilment so took herself off to 3 countries beginning with the letter "I" - Italy, India and Indonesia - "I" being what the journey was all about when it wasn't about "me". Her publisher stumped up the funding for the trip on the condition she wrote about it and as, reportedly, six million people have read the book and the film rights were sold, that was a very good investment. Our group felt miffed at having helped finance her year's holiday, although to be fair in our case the funding was by Norfolk County Council Library Service who can ill afford to squander their funds at the moment. To be fair there were some interesting parts to the book; she struggled and eventually succeeded to empty her mind to meditate in India and experienced some enlightenment. From the Bali section we learned something of that island's history and culture. The reader gained more insight from the book but there was not enough plot or action for the film to make much of those sections, however, the food and scenery in Italy were good to see, which added to the book's account of the 4 months spent there. Book Club members' partners taken to see the film were not keen to read the book or complimentary about the film either. On the whole, though, it was felt that we had read a couple of worse books. The Book Club meets in the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 7.30 pm. New members are always welcome. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are reading Our Man in Hayana by Graham Green, for discussion at our meeting on 7 April. A black and white version of the film is going to be shown in the Village Hall on the 12 March at 3 pm. At our meeting on 5th May we will be discussing The Testament of Gideon Mack

Ongoing issues from previous meetings

Adams Pit: The Parish Council had been successful in obtaining a 'Your Partnership, Your Decision' Safer and Stronger Communities grant of £1,225. Following a meeting with the NCC ecologist, a draft Business Plan for phase 3 with works involving a cost of £2,086 out of funds available to the Trustees of £4,156 was agreed subject to some fine tuning in the light of Mr Stocker's advice.

<u>Possible Provision of Allotments:</u> The Chairman had explored further options, including meeting a representative of Reepham allotment holders to investigate the potential availability of allotments in Reepham to Bawdeswell residents. The Chairman will arrange to meet the chairman of BALGA to discuss the options as the PC currently see them.

<u>Parish Council Elections:</u> Key dates are that nominations close on 4th April and Polling Day is 5th May. The Annual Parish Council Meeting (the first meeting of the newly-elected Council) was arranged for Monday 16 May 2011 at 19:45, to be followed by the May Parish Council Meeting. The Clerk will arrange to distribute publicity to encourage residents to stand via the school, Post Office and Village Hall.

<u>Project Bawdeswell:</u> There is to be another open meeting on 29 March in the Village Hall. The project is now looking at developing community-based fund-raising for the new hall, in addition to the buy-a-brick campaign. It is hoped to be able to put forward a planning application by June.

<u>Highways:</u> The Community Rangers will be in this area in the week commencing 4 April and can be asked to attend to minor highway maintenance – please contact the Clerk.

Any Other Business of Interest to Parishioners

<u>Arrangements for 2011 Annual Parish Meeting:</u> To be held on Tuesday 10 May at 18:30. Format to be the same as in 2010 with slots for County Councillor, District Councillor, Chairman of PC and school head. All local organisations are to be invited. Tea and biscuits will be provided and a cash bar is to be open.

Police in Dereham are advising **off-road motorcyclists** to act responsibly or face having their bikes seized.

The warning comes after two bikes were recently confiscated. A pit bike was seized by officers on Thursday 3 March in Hall Road, Dereham. Another biker had already received a Section 59 warning, the second warning meant having the bike seized on Saturday 5 March. An off-road vehicle can be automatically seized, if individuals are caught riding in a public right of way or a highway.

BAWDESWELL & FOXLEY WINDMILLS

In times past there were windmills on the edge of both villages.

Bawdeswell had a Smockmill, a type of windmill that consists of a sloping, weatherboarded tower, usually with six or eight sides. It is topped with a roof or cap that rotates to bring the sails into the wind. This type of windmill got its name from its resemblance to smocks worn by farmers in an earlier period.

Bawdeswell Smockmill stood on the former Bawdeswell Common, to the south side of the Billingford Road, near its junction with the present A1067, and was built c.1753 along with a bakehouse. Two pairs of common sails with 24 feet of cloth per sail powered 2 pairs of 4ft French burr stones and a flour mill. The Mill became part of the Evans Lombe Estate (Bylaugh Hall) and when it became uneconomical or disused in 1852 its demolition was ordered.



From 1836 the miller was William Elvin. It appears that he built a red brick towermill nearby at Foxley in 1845, but still lived at Bawdeswell Mill House. He is thus given in directories as at Bawdeswell till 1858. He is said to have made his way to Foxley Mill each day across the fields.

Foxley towermill lay to the southwest of the village (Mill Lane today) and was five storeys high, with a date stone being placed above the door. Four patent sails were used to power 2 pairs of French burr stones and a flour mill although the mill was advertised as being capable of driving a third pair of stones if they were installed. In 1899 the mill machinery was dismantled and many years later was reduced to three stories with a flat roof, as it stands today.

Wensum Valley Birdwatching Society

I often receive calls from readers debating if they should come along to one of our events (I know you are out there!). Such was the case when Natalie phoned about the Wensum Valley walk and decided to join us for the day. I asked her if she would write a few words on her impressions of the event. 

Dear Everybody, hello again.

The earthquakes, the tsunamis and the nuclear problems in Japan have been frightening. I found myself reacting to the three kinds of disasters in different ways.

In the earthquake, the buildings, people and objects were shaken about. Office workers cowered under desks, or tried to protect their work stations, or left the buildings. The threat of aftershocks made people stay in the open. The greatest danger is from things falling on you, and areas of damage and safety can be quite close together.

Tsunamis are different. The power of the waves swept away everything in their path. A metres tall wall of water and wreckage spilled across the agricultural floor of Japan. The only safety was in being somewhere really high, or escaping the area. It's a battle you can't win.

And radiation is a battle you can't see. Part of the human reaction to threats to nuclear plants is to say: do away with them, regulate, make them safer: we can decide. We can't stop earthquakes or tsunamis, we can do something about nuclear proliferation. But the frightening thing about radiation is its longevity. Earthquakes lasting even a few minutes are unusually long. The tsunamis lasted a few hours. Radiation lingers.

In the face of the death of tens of thousands crushed or drowned or eventually diseased, the woes of this nation seem small by comparison. The rebuilding work in Japan will be colossal. Yet the woes of each place represent disasters on different scales to a number of individuals.

Easter is for Christians the story of the disaster that happened to one person and his group of friends, and how a much greater good came out of it. It has inspired many people to do good things for others, and to seek to bring hope where everything has been swept away.

All of us can put energy into helping others who have lost everything, and those for whom the world is unsteady, overwhelmed, or poisoned.
