



BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL-Digest of Meeting Held on 7th Nov 2011

Councillors Shannon, Beane, Kirby, Lilwall, Mallen, Mrs C Boer and 1 parishioner. Present: Ongoing Issues From Previous Meetings

Adams Pit: No further work has been undertaken since the last meeting. However, a group of volunteers will be planting the second tranche of hedging/trees that have been ordered from Felthorpe Nurserv over the next 2 weeks. Once the remaining bills have been settled, the Clerk will submit the match funding grant application to Norfolk County Council for the final phase of work on the Pit.

Possible Provision of Allotments: The Chairman of the Parish Council and Javne Bowen (representing BAGLA) met with Karen Kenny, the Eastern Area Representative from NALGA, on Monday 31st October 2011, to discuss set-up costs and issues surrounding the possible development of an allotment site down Elsing Lane. While the meeting did not provide definitive costings, it was useful as a means of highlighting the pros and cons of the potential site and the likely work involved in setting it up as a community wide. sustainable resource for the village. Subsequently, the Parish Council unanimously agreed to press forward with the possible negotiation of a long term lease with the landowner of the Elsing Lane site. The Chairman, in association with BAGLA and Karen Kenny, will now draft a business case for the creation of this community resource, both to support any future negotiations with the landowner and funding grant applications.

Village Sign: The new village sign is planned to be unveiled on 20th November, and the Parish Council would like to thank Ailsa McColville for leading on this project and Mr and Mrs Thatcher for producing such a wonderful new village sign.

Improvements to Public Transport to Dereham: Unfortunately, the proposed pre-bookable bus service from Bawdeswell to Dereham that Norfolk County Council hoped to launch in November has had to be postponed by an associated delay in the introduction of the Foulsham feeder service to meet the X29 service in Bawdeswell. The latter is now under review but, if it goes ahead, it is unlikely to be introduced before April 2012. Despite these setbacks NCC officials have confirmed that discussions are underway with West Norfolk Community Transport about going ahead with the Bawdeswell element of the service in any event, and while these decisions are clearly price dependant, money has already been allocated in the budget to support this service. NCC should receive a guote from West Norfolk Community Transport for the extra Bawdeswell service by mid-November and NCC will update the Clerk again then.

Any Other Business of Interest to Parishioners

New Village Hall Update: Following the sudden death of Phil Hague, members of the Parish Council would like to pay tribute to the professional skill, unswerving support and time Mr Hague put into this project, without which Project Bawdeswell could not have achieved as much as it had. Feedback from Breckland District Council officials on how the design appearance of the new village hall could be improved have been taken on board and incorporated in new village hall plans which will be resubmitted to Breckland for planning approval shortly.

Annual Audit of the Parish Council Accounts: The Clerk reported that Mazars have returned the annual audit for the year ending 31st March 2011 and, on the basis of their review, they confirmed that information in the annual return was in accordance with proper practices and no matters had come to their attention warranting any concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements were not met.

The next Parish Council meeting will take place on Monday 5th December 2011. At this meeting the Parish Council will debate and set the Precept for 2012/2013; something that should be of interest to all parishioners. The Clerk is also continuing with her efforts to try and arrange a visit by the PCSO to discuss anti-social behaviour within the village at this meeting.

The Children's Book, by A S Byatt This is a complex and many layered this book; it concentrates on the Wellwood family and their friends who live an apparently idyllic Bohemian existence. The book is about the relationships between these people and others but it is just as much about the age they live in from 1895 to 1919, with historical events intertwined in the story. The main characters are influenced by the morals and manners of the age they live in. The background is lush and decadent as the Victorian age gives way to the Edwardian era and eventually to the Great War. The book opens with Philip Warren hiding in the store rooms of the South Kensington Museum (now the V&A). He is brought before Prosper Cain and Olive Wellwood, a "successful authoress of magical tales". Although not revealed until later in the book Olive's background is not that dissimilar to Philip's and she helps him to join the successful potter Benedict Fludd and his eccentric family. The story revolves around the Wellwoods and their cousins, the Fludds and the family of Prosper Cain. The relationships between the characters are convoluted and nothing is as it first appears. With few exceptions the older men in the book are often rather unpleasant and the women self-absorbed, but the characters become more likeable and the pace of the story quickens when it moves onto the younger generation in the second part of the book.

Members of the Book Club had quite mixed reactions to it: some loved the wonderful descriptions – others felt that they slowed down the pace of the story and detracted from its effectiveness. Some found the first part of the book a little slow and with lots of characters it took a little while to get into the story however others really enjoyed it. Although I initially found the book difficult with so many children and families, don't be put off by that it soon becomes easy to work out who is who and follow the twists and turns of the story. Without doubt The Children's Book has one of the most beautiful book covers of recent times: can you judge this book by it's cover? I loved it and hope that you will too.


