



In 1968, the Ford auto factory in Dagenham is one of the largest single private employers in the United Kingdom. In addition to the thousands of male employees, there are also 187 underpaid women machinists who primarily assemble the car seat upholstery in poor working conditions. Dissatisfied, the women, represented by the shop steward and Rita O'Grady, work with union rep Albert Passingham for a better deal. However, Rita learns that there is a larger issue in this dispute considering that women are paid an appalling fraction of the men's wages for the same work across the board on the sole basis of their sex. Refusing to tolerate this inequality any longer, O'Grady leads a strike by her fellow machinists for equal pay for equal work. What follows would test the patience of all involved in a grinding labour and political struggle that ultimately would advance the cause of women's rights around the world.

Before the meeting Mr Gordon Bambridge asked permission to leave early as he had another meeting to attend that evening.

1.5.11 Apologies None

2.5.11 Election of Officers: Chairman - Proposed by JM seconded by NM, the Council unanimously elected Nigel Hatch as Chairman.

3.5.11 Co-option of Committee members JM nominated John Harvey seconded by NM, Mr Harvey accepted the role as Councillor for Foxley. NM nominated Dennis Barrett seconded by JM. Mr Barrett accepted the role as a councillor. Vice-Chairman - Proposed by DB seconded by JH. All councillors signed the declarations of accepted. All councillors signed the declarations of acceptance forms.

4.5.11 Minutes of Last Annual Parish Council Meeting: The minutes of the last annual Parish Council meeting held on 12th May 2010, were agreed and signed.

5.5.11 Chairmans Report

In 2010 we followed our normal pattern of five Meetings for the year-May,July,October,December & February. Twice in the last three years, my report has paid tribute to outgoing Parish Clerks, both outside Foxley, but giving us much valued service.

So, let me start by saying what a delight it is that Emma Buck of Mill Road, Foxley, took on this role a year ago and has been busy keeping Councillors up to date with all that gets downloaded from Breckland, as well as chasing up the various departments at District and County level, when we try to get things done. She has taken a job, which is far more complex than hitherto, with great enthusiasm and her help and support are much appreciated.

The Local Development Framework led to the conclusion that Foxley was not suitable for further development, being a very small village and not having any Services.

Growing the village would merely put more traffic on the roads and new housing is better suited to where there are shops and schools. This is how things rested after the last Administration left office. We shall keep an eye on any changes emanating from The Localism Bill, which could open the way for Developers.

With Foxley's new sewerage scheme operating, most of our Parish discussions have been on the mundane level of :- state of roads, speeding, paths, signs, litter and dog mess, village sign and grit bins. However, one matter that did take up much discussion was that of a contribution to the childrens' Play Area at Bawdeswell. We had to balance the fact that we do not have our own playground, which would in itself be very costly to maintain (even if land once offered were still available), with the fact that several Foxley families make good use of Bawdeswell's excellent facilities. We feel the right balance has been struck: £500 is being given with a 2nd similar payment next year.

Finally, as outgoing Chairman I do express my grateful thanks to my Vice-Chairman Nicky Mears and fellow Councillors, for their time and contribution to Parish Affairs this past year; also, to Gordon Bambridge (District Councillor) for his input and advice.

Fund Raising & Get Together Events

Funds in excess 3,000 have been raised and distributed to the big "C";St Thomas' Church;EA Air Ambulance and other charities.

Residents and friends regularly hire the hall for private functions and Foxley Bowls Club; Jaycee Bridge Club, The Keep Fit Association Class and Dereham

Table Tennis Club continue to use the facilities.

Fund raising events, private and club hirings contribute to an excellent annual income enabling the committee to maintain this popular building to a very high standard.

At this time it is fitting to wholeheartedly thank all VH helpers (they know who they are) who unfailingly offer their time to support the committee in many different ways. Maintaining the hall, running events etc would not be possible without them.



From the Rector

Dear Everybody, hello again.

One of the things that increasingly annoys me, I'm sorry to say, is when weather forecasters cheerily call hot sun "good weather" and rain "bad weather". I look now on fields that are desperate for rain, a garden that is parched and a dry vegetable patch. How could rain be bad?

The Met Office has bases in Exeter and Aberdeen, so presumably they are aware of the needs of the countryside; but by the time it gets to TV or radio, it seems to be all about whether leisure and social events will be rained off. Those who complain when rain spoils a picnic probably also complain when the price of food goes up. It seems difficult to believe that a few short months ago we were complaining about the nation's inability to deal with snow.

The Norwegians, who are used to considerable amounts of rain and snow, have a saying that I often quote: "There's no such thing as bad weather, just bad clothes for the weather you're having." It's refreshingly adaptable. And different people have different needs from the weather; one traveller may pray to have a flat calm to motor across the English Channel without feeling queasy while someone in a sailboat whistles for a wind to get safely and fast across the shipping lanes.

In nature-based religions, and you read it in the Old Testament as well, droughts were often seen as the result of divine displeasure. In fact, weather extremes of any kind that were dangerous to humans seemed the result of offending the deity. We're lucky to live somewhere that extremes are rare, in a society where failed crops don't mean starving people, and in a country where few people die each year from weather events.

Although I'm asked to pray for the weather before weddings and fetes, we don't connect the weather and God that much now.

As I'm off on holiday (back by the time that you read it) of course I want sunshine on me and rain on the fields either side of the road. Contrary beings, aren't we? I should be adaptable, and not see getting the weather I don't want as a personal affront. What is short-term bad for me may be to the greater good of all. I'll just pack a mac.
