Revised proposal for the Sparham Deanery: April 2016

We have been seeking, without success, to appoint a part-time Team Vicar Designate for the proposed Reepham/FLEBBS/Wensum groups of parishes. This failure comes after nearly a year of advertising, including six months on the diocesan website and four advertisements in the Church Times. We now have to question whether a new advertisement for a similar part-time post in the Foulsham/Elmham proposed Team Ministry is sensible.

The agreed plan has been to create two Teams, one with 1.5 clergy posts (combining the Benefices of Elmham and Foulsham) and the other with 2.5 clergy posts (combining the Benefices of Reepham, Wensum and FLEBBS); this was to respond to the request that we do not divide the existing Benefices.

A new proposal with four full-time posts, rather than three full-time and two part-time, would draw on a much greater number of potential clergy candidates. One possibility would be to create one Team Ministry across the entire Deanery but that would create too large an area across which to sustain meaningful relationships. If we are to maintain the idea of two Teams, it will mean abandoning the principle of not dividing any of the current benefices. The obvious candidate for dividing is FLEBBS, given its central position. A new proposal, therefore, would be:

There will be a formal process of consultation following the development of a draft Pastoral Scheme. This will include two opportunities for PCCs to comment on the proposals and is unlikely to be concluded much before the end of 2016. However, if informal agreement could be obtained, it would allow us to advertise the Team Vicar posts sooner so that the parishes are not left without pastoral care.

The significant difference between this and the previous proposals is that Bawdeswell, Bylaugh and Foxley will join The Elmham and Foulsham Groups. These two groups have already agreed that Sally Kimmis should be the Team Rector Designate but the parishes of Bawdeswell, Bylaugh and Foxley have not been given this opportunity. There would, therefore need to be an opportunity for the three parishes to appoint Representatives who would have a formal meeting with Sally.

Team 1, as described above, is different from the current proposal, only by the exclusion of three parishes. There has, therefore, already been the necessary consultation with all the parishes to agree that Margaret Dean will be the Team Rector, should agreement be reached for this new proposal.

The Pastoral Scheme will dissolve the role of Priest-in-Charge of FLEBBS, and Lyn Page would have the opportunity to apply to be one of the two, newly created, Team Vicars. All the PCCs of the parishes with the group would appoint Representatives who would be part of the appointment process together with the Team Rector and



In The Children Act, Ian McEwan references some of the

impossible legal dilemmas faced by judges in the high court of England. Fiona Maye is a judge in the family division of the law courts; experienced, revered and extremely competent, she faces difficult judgements and complex cases on a daily basis. McEwan's calm and dispassionate prose style and effective use of technical detail allows us to enter through the doors of the Inns of Court alongside Fiona and to gain some understanding of this rarified world which is inhabited by people who serve judgement on impossible and challenging issues. However when engaging with the messy, uncontrolled outside world Fiona is fallible - or at least the 'real' world is not as knowable and controlled as her legal universe. We join her life at a point when her husband has challenged their marriage, but not his love for her, and she is called on to make an emergency

judgement in a case where a young man, not quite 18, will die without the blood transfusion denied him by his religion. In order to determine her judgement she goes to meet the boy in hospital, setting off a sequence of cause and effect which she cannot have predicted and does not have control over. The law consumes Fiona's time and emotions but she remains faithful to it and produces intelligent, cogent decisions at all times regardless of extreme difficulties elsewhere in her life.

McEwan clearly admires the judges that he has met and has stated that their choices '...are often limited to the lesser harm rather than the greater good'. Furthermore he considers that '...what is lawful is not always identical to what is right' and that there is no consistency in the law despite having sentencing guidelines, as judges themselves differ. Having had the opportunity to share their company when socialising over dinner and having read some of their judgements he was struck by their interaction, the beauty of their writing, and the omniscience that reminded him of novelists' attitudes to their characters. He used this experience as the inspiration for this novel, and by introducing much research and real examples of judgements made in the last few years, many of which the reader will recall, he brings verisimilitude to the book.



The Annual Parish Council meeting was held at 7.30pm where Cllr Bill Cunliffe was nominated and elected Chairman of the Parish Council following Cllr Shannon's decision not to stand again. Cllr William Mason remains Vice Chairman. Cllr Shannon remains a member of the Parish Council and thanks were extended to him for all his hard work as Chairman. Cllr Shannon in return thanked his fellow Councillors and Clerks for their support during his time in office.

8. Planning

REFERENCE: 3PL/2015/1424/F

PROPOSAL: Residential development of 36 dwellings

LOCATION: BAWDESWELL: Land off Hall Road

APPLICANT: Sovereign Group Limited

The Council referred to their adopted policy on development. There was concern over the unsustainability of the development, the development being outside the settlement boundary and lack of infrastructure to support the development. There was reference to the recent objection submitted by the PC to becoming a Local Service Centre (LSC) and concern that approval of this application would create danger of having LSC status imposed. It was confirmed that the PC have always objected to applications outside the settlement boundary. It was recognised that there would be a settlement boundary review later in the year at which time there may be pressure to include the proposed site within the village boundary. Concern was raised over drainage and the existing problem with the sewerage system. District Cllr Bambridge confirmed the application would go to planning committee due to its large scale nature. There was reference to Breckland's lack of land supply and how this may affect the outcome of the application should it be refused and go to the Planning Inspectorate.

Members of the public expressed concern over lack of infrastructure, electricity supply issues and sewerage concerns. With the exception of 7 people who abstained from the show of hands, the remainder of the public in attendance recorded an objection to the planning application.

The Council agreed unanimously to strongly object to the application. It was agreed to reiterate the Parish Council's policy on supporting sustainable development inside the settlement boundary, to reiterate arguments against becoming a Local Service Centre and concentrate on highlighting concerns about lack of infrastructure, sewerage and access (Highways). It was agreed to query ownership of proposed amenity land. The Council submitted their objections to Breckland Planning and a copy of the submission can be viewed on the website

The Parish Council are continuing the fundraising efforts to try and raise the £7,920 needed to refurbish the driveway and grant applications have been submitted and donations continue to be made. 

Church News

Letter from Lyn

I am writing this letter with sad news. A few weeks ago I was informed by +Johnathan, the Bishop of Lynn, that Archdeacon John Ashe and the Rural Dean ,Tim Dean, would propose a new Pastoral Scheme which would result in a reorganisation of local benefices. This reorganisation results in the benefice of FLEBBS being split up. The Church Wardens were informed on the same day by the Archdeacon.



On the following day, at the chapter meeting, the new Pastoral Scheme was discussed along with the consequences of my post as Priest in Charge of FLEBBS being dissolved. At that meeting, the Archdeacon concluded that this new Pastoral Scheme should be progressed. Tim Dean concluded by explaining that the next step was to send the new scheme to the Parish PCCs for a short review period, until 21st May 2016. Advertising for two new Team Vicars would follow with the intent that interviews would be held in July, and appointments made in August of this year.

After the appointment of the two new Team Vicars there is a further period of review; 30 days with the Diocese of Norwich and 30 days with the Church Commissioners in London. It is the Archdeacon's intention to formalise the new Pastoral Scheme while advertising and making the new appointments so that these reviews can happen. After these reviews have been completed the new Pastoral Scheme can be put into effect and the FLEBBS benefice dissolved along with my current post as Priest in Charge.

I have asked the editors to print a copy of the details of the new Pastoral Scheme as presented by the Archdeacon and Rural Dean (see page 15). It explains the planned parish re-ordering into benefices and describes the two new leadership teams of stipendiary clergy. If you have any comments or questions about this new scheme, please contact the Archdeacon or Rural Dean directly.

I am currently assessing my own options and await the details of the newly created posts.
