Saturday 14th May in Foxley

Now that the six bells in Foxley Church have been restored, a team of experienced bell ringers, under the auspices of the Norwich Diocesan Association of Ringers (the NDA), will attempt to complete a 5,040-change peal in Cambridge Surprise Minor. The team will be led by Michael Clements, a national-level bellringer, from Norwich. The last time such a peal was recorded was in 1950.

Bell ringing is an art particularly associated with the Church of England, which restored it in the 17th century after the medieval bells were lost at the Reformation. It is specially linked to Norwich and Norfolk, as one of the first new sets of bells was installed over 300 years ago in St. Peter Mancroft church in Norwich. The English form of the art is only found here and in a very few English-speaking countries elsewhere, so is special to our English heritage.

Six bells give a choice of 720 possible combinations (or changes). The complete peal consists of seven repetitions of the 720 possible changes, each time in a different order, indicated by the peal title.

The complete peal is expected to last nearly 3 hours and will begin after the Village Lunch. During this time the six ringers will be ringing continuously without a break, and concentrating on keeping up their own part in the peal. This imposes considerable physical and mental demands on them, both as individuals and as a team, and requires great skill and long experience.

If the peal is successfully completed without any mistakes, it will be recorded in the records of the NDA and the national body, and will be publicly acknowledged in the magazine "Ringing World" and on the Bellboard website.

Michael Clements' visit is a special compliment to Foxley village and its church, and may not be repeated for some years. It comes from his personal interest in our bells, which led to the NDA giving the church a £6,000 grant towards the total restoration cost of more than £40,000, and to his work in training our team of ringers.



Just imagine if you were living in the middle of a long war. You can trust no one but you begin to notice great atrocities. Do you turn away, pretend it's not happening? Or would you begin to intervene, subvert what is going on, probably putting your own life in danger. This is the dilemma of this book.



The story took us to Berlin. We become immersed in the life of Sigrid Schroder. She is an ordinary woman trying to survive but as it is 1943, she is having a tough time. Her husband is a soldier, he's away, she's not sure where, but his rare letters make her think he's near the Russian border. She lives with her motherin-law, hunger is ever present and suspicions abound. Informers are everywhere. Travelling around the city means that security passes are checked constantly, woe betide anyone who can't prove who they are. Worse if you can't prove you're of the right parentage. Constant fear is round every corner. Sigrid has been the model German soldier's wife, working, surviving, keeping her head down.

Circumstances force her to confront the atrocities that are becoming highly evident. It's probably not the time to engage in a love affair with a Jewish man, especially one dealing in stolen property. But war creates different situations. What we may see as casual promiscuity can be important if you're not sure there will be a tomorrow. Intense liaisons can provide the proof that you're still alive, if only for a short time. Attempting to make a difference will endanger her own life.

I don't want to spoil the story, I hope you might want to read it. We found we had a lot to discuss; the historical background, the protagonists and the situations that develop for the characters to find their way through. And especially trying to answer the question that the author asks the reader - What would you do?



Bawdeswell Parish Council Meeting 4th April 2016

Present: D. Shannon (Chair), W.Mason, J. Lilwall, J Mallen, R. Reed, T. Smith, B. Cunliffe, Mrs. J Boxall (Clerk).

Planning application 3PL/2015/1258/F for a permanent Gipsy/Traveller site adjacent to the Old Workhouse Paddocks on Reepham Road, Bawdeswell Over 100 people attended the meeting with limited support for the proposal. Members of the public expressed their concerns. To summarise, Bawdeswell Parish Council is firmly of the opinion that the planning application should be refused on the grounds that there is no definitive need for such a site in the proposed location which is agricultural land in open countryside, outside of the settlement boundary of a small rural community which lacks the key facilities and support services necessary. The site is not in any of the Breckland preferred locations, and the extra vehicular traffic involved with the application would pose serious and dangerous highways issues (the Parish Council understands that Norfolk County Council Highways have already raised an objection). The proposal is therefore in conflict with: the current Breckland Core Strategy, in particular Policy CP2; the new draft Local Plan, in particular PD09; and the current PPTS.

The PC's full submission can be viewed on the PC website.

Future planning application

The PC are aware that a planning application was submitted to Breckland on 1st April for 36 houses on the field opposite Two Fields Way. The PC will consider this application once they receive the plans and associated documentation.

Recreation Ground Car Park

The cost of the car park refurbishment is £36,158 + VAT and the Parish Council have received donations from residents totalling £8,366.50, (a HUGE THANK YOU again to them!). A grant from Breckland District Council of £11,400 has been awarded and with other monies pledged from the Village Hall Committee and the Bowling Clubs, the Parish Council approved putting £14,991.50 from PC funds into the project to enable the renovation of the car park to commence. Works are expected to take a month and the work will be undertaken as soon as possible ensuring minimal disruption to hall users. The driveway is expected to cost an additional £7,920.00 and the PC agreed that the driveway costs should not delay work to the car parking area. It is hoped that the additional money for the driveway can be obtained through donations, fund raising and exploring further grant funding opportunities.
