For some parishes, that will mean a reduction in the number of services held each month. The new pattern does ensure that at least three services of Holy Communion are held across the Team each Sunday and provides a variety of Services of the Word in both traditional and modern language.

Book Club "This Must Be The Place" by Maggie O'Farrell

The story opens in 2010 in the wilds of Donegal where Daniel Sullivan is living with Claudette Wells, a reclusive former film star who thinks nothing of firing a gun if strangers get too close to her house. Why is she so fiercely protective of her privacy and what made her disappear at the height of her cinematic fame?



Daniel is reeling from a discovery about a woman he last saw twenty years ago and is about to make an exit of his own. It is a journey that will send him off-course, far from home. Will his love for Claudette be enough to bring him back?

As the story unfolds the reader is taken back and forth through the initially confusing time line of Daniel and Claudette's lives. Key issues in these lives, their interactions with previous partners, the complications of issues with the children from those partners and the complex interactions of these family members.

As they struggle to deal with the personal loss and tragedy of each of their separate lives the story crosses continents and time zones creating a portrait of an extraordinary marriage, the forces that hold it together and the pressures that drive it apart.

This is a well told, fairly credible story that the book group members generally enjoyed and which generated some interesting discussion.

The Book Club meets in the 'Lounge' outside the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading "The Noise of Time" by Julian Barnes for discussion at our meeting on 7th December and will read "The Mistletoe Murder and other stories" by P. D. 

PARISH COUNCILS

Bawdeswell Parish Council Meeting held on 2nd November

Present: B.Cunliffe (Chair), J. Mallen, J. Lilwall, R. Read, A. Smith and A. Toomey. Mrs. J Boxall (Clerk), District ClIr G. Bambridge Members of the public: 2

The Parish Council expressed their disappointment as they did not feel that District Cllr Bambridge had represented the views of the Parish Council in recent planning matters. An explanation was received for actions taken.

Recreation Ground

Since the Parish Council awarded a grant for a lining machine, one has been donated to the Football Club. The PC therefore approved the use of the grant award for temporary flood lighting equipment.

The Chairman of the Football Club updated the Council on the current situation regarding storage. They propose to obtain a container (20 x 8ft) and requested permission to site it in the corner of the recreation ground. The PC approved in principle, that a storage container can be placed within the curtilage of the recreation ground subject to consultation with neighbouring properties and documentation confirming that the container is the Football Clubs responsibility in terms of liability and maintenance. It was agreed a 'contract' would be drawn up.

The Clerk circulated details of a DC11 grant available from Breckland. It was agreed to submit an application to cover repairs to the climbing frame surround and log crossing. Additional bark and sand is also required as well as a replacement bench for the one that was removed. Repairs have already been made to the tractor and some on the log crossing.

Complaints were received about dog mess on the recreation ground and bags filled with dog's mess being left lying around. The Parish Council will consider whether it is necessary to restrict dogs on the recreation ground should the situation not improve.

It was confirmed that the Village Hall Trustees agreed to permit the defibrillator to be positioned at the Village Hall subject to the PC accepting responsibility for maintenance. A £200 budget for maintenance and replacement item was agreed.

Finance - Expenditure for the year to date was £13809.22, income to date was confirmed as £20,696.08. The Parish Council continued to consider the precept requirements for 2018/19. The precept will be set at the December meeting. A Parish Council gets its funding by receiving a small amount of the local Council Tax from Breckland District Council. This is referred to as the Parish Precept.


