

Foxley Defibrillator

Foxley Village Hall is hoping to buy a defibrillator that will be housed outside Foxley Village Hall. For the next few months all future fund raising events will therefore be towards the purchase of the defibrillator.

Defibrillators are a simple and effective method of administrating life-saving treatment to a casualty suffering from cardiac-arrest and can be used on both adults and children over the age of 1 years old. Defibrillators are extremely safe to use as they will only allow a defibrillation shock to be delivered to a casualty if one is required. Prompt delivery of defibrillation can result in survival rates as high as 75% (Resuscitation Council, UK). Having one close by could mean the difference between life and death.

Although defibrillators provide clear step-by-step instructions on how to use them it is hoped that there will be an opportunity for all residents to be shown how to use the defibrillator once it has been installed.





Book Club

We read a variety of novels over the last two months due to the difficulty of getting enough copies of the books, but also to help 'fit in' reading amongst our festive responsibilities. Some had larger turkeys to cook than others! Our first choice was to read "A Christmas Carol" by Charles Dickens or "Hotel du Lac". The second was to read a book by Ernest Hemingway.

These books are wildly different, but they all conjure up 'times past' through the author's descriptions. And boy, isn't life today different from the late 19th century, the Twenties in Paris and the early Fifties. It's not that past times were worse or better, but they were very different. Previously, it would seem, charity, valour and chivalry were qualities more highly valued than now, and there were clearer boundaries underlying many prejudices and rigid class distinctions.

"A Christmas Carol", written in 1843, is a well-known ghost story. I must confess previously to have only known it by watching film adaptations, especially The Muppets. I loved Dickens' words, his descriptions are a delight to read. I'm in praise of anyone who can liken someone's face to a lobster kept too long in a cold cellar.

Anita Brookner won the Booker Prize in 1984 for "The Hotel du Lac". Edith Hope has been persuaded by friends to leave London whilst 'the scandal' dies down. Leaving her intended husband outside the Registry Office was not considered a good idea, nor was her relationship with a married man. Getting Edith to flee the gossip to an out of season Swiss hotel gives us the chance to visualise everything she sees as she spends the days waiting to return; the guests, the hotel, the lake and surroundings.

Ernest Hemingway lived an amazing life, one which would be hard to replicate in these days of fast travel and even faster news bites. He pushed his living to the extremes until he could push no further and ended his own life. A criticism of his writing in today's world is that he appeared to be a describer of events and people rather than showing empathy or passion for his subjects. Perhaps fighting in the First World War and taking part in the Spanish Civil War is responsible for that.

Our discussion on these books ranged from Bull Fighting and Deep Sea Fishing to War experiences - I'm sure anyone listening in the Bar will have been intrigued!

We meet in The Old Workhouse on the first Thursday of the month at 8pm. On Thursday 2nd February 2017 we will discuss "Burial Rites" by Hannah Kent. 

Letter from Sally

I have always thought that the best thing about February is that it is short! The joy and excitement of Christmas are far behind us, and January seems to go on forever, with dark skies and – some years – seriously cold weather.

But over the years, I have come to realise that February is a transitional month. We begin to see the first signs of spring as the snowdrops raise their glorious heads. That must mean that the earth is beginning to warm up and soon we will see the almost flagrant outburst of daffodils, followed by other beloved spring flowers. And that is so reassuring – after the apparent 'death' of winter, new life bursts forth again.


The Church marks this time by going in the reverse direction – turning away from the new life of Jesus in the stable at Bethlehem towards looking ahead to his death on the Cross of Calvary just outside Jerusalem. This 'turning' begins with the celebration of the infant Jesus being presented at the Temple by his parents Mary and Joseph (Candlemas: marked this year on 29th January). Mary and Joseph meet two holy people – Simeon and Anna. Simeon rejoices that God's promise that he will see the Messiah before he dies is fulfilled in Jesus. However, he warns Mary that 'a sword will pierce your own heart'.

We look back on this story with hindsight – we know where it is going. And we brace ourselves to face Calvary and prepare ourselves to stand at the foot of Jesus' cross once again.

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, 1st March. We mark it with a service of Holy Communion with the Imposition of Ashes. As we do so, we begin a period of self-examination in the sure and confident hope that Jesus will rise again from the dead. Then, at Easter, we can truly celebrate new life and hope, for ourselves and for the world.
