

Foxley Church: The Future

Our village church building dates back to Saxon times. As you will all know, the numbers attending any of the three regular services per month has been low for many years now. The trouble is that age and circumstances changing, mean that we cannot fill the church posts to keep going.

It was decided at a meeting of the Parochial Church Council on 31st.May, that in principle, we should approach the Diocesan Churches Trust, with a view to their taking over responsibility for St.Thomas'.

One of the first steps is to consult the village and there will be an item on the Agenda for the Parish Council Meeting on 27th.July to this effect. This will be followed by a letter to every household in August and finally a village meeting in September.

This is to give early notice of something of a major change. It is a route down which our neighbouring St. Andrew's Themelthorpe has travelled and our decision is taken with a heavy heart. Come to hear more and make your view known, should you wish. *John Harvey, Churchwarden*

Bawdeswell planning update

There has been a large amount of understandable disquiet regarding the planning applications for the Two Fields Way site. The first application for 36 dwellings was agreed by the Breckland Planning Committee despite really strong objections by the Parish Council and many of our parishioners. However, the Breckland Planning website still shows this as being undecided because there has not been an agreement between the developers and Breckland regarding monies the developers must pay under Section 106.

The second application for 44 dwellings on the same site, made by the same developers, is awaiting a date to be agreed for the matter to be dealt with again by Breckland Planning Committee. Apparently this could be in July or August. Bawdeswell PC has already lodged its objections to this application as have even more parishioners than did for the first application. It seems a ludicrous situation, but the developers can make as many applications as they like, and they could end up choosing any of their successful applications. The Parish Council sympathises with all those who feel strongly about these applications and for whom the uncertainty seems to be lasting forever. We will continue to monitor the situation closely and do all we can on Bawdeswell's behalf.

Number 11 is Jonathan Coe's eleventh book, and like many of his books it explores contemporary British values in a wryly comic and satirical way. Published in 2015, it is a novel that inventively weaves many themes and narratives including austerity Britain,


greed and madness, excessive wealth, cult British TV and comedy and horror films, shared memories, stand-up comedy, obsession, and spiders! The Number 11 of the title crops up throughout the novel - house numbers including Downing Street, the circular 11 bus route in Birmingham, the eleventh level of a basement, a table number, a storage locker (I am sure there are others).

There is a large cast of interrelated characters who populate the five sections of the book. We are connected with some of the characters and narrative threads by a young 'ordinary' woman, Rachel, who is six when we first meet her and whom we follow into her twenties. Through her family, friendships, studies and work we encounter the innocence of childhood, bittersweet memories of grandparents, financial struggles and depression, the extremely wealthy and confident, obsessive academics, autocratic media editors, migrant workers and an intellectual detective amongst others. This might sound a bit grim but as the book is written with such a lightness of touch with comedic set pieces and jokes, and is imbued with strong story telling and compelling characters, it is a joy to read. The weaving of the subplots is exhilarating and the use of day to day cultural references is superb.

Although this book reprises the comedic 'state of the nation' approach of Coe's 1994 novel What a Carve Up (which satirised Thatcherite Britain) and also features the surviving members of the grotesque Winshaw family, Coe is keen that it should not be considered a sequel. The novel acknowledges cult films, especially Quatermass and the Pit from the 1960s, and the ending references schlock horror films where we think it's all over...but is it really?

The Book Club meets in the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading "Notes from an exhibition" by Patrick Gale for discussion at our meeting on 6th July and will read "Waterland" by Graham Swift for discussion at our meeting on 3rd August. Neighbourhood Plan

It was agreed that a Neighbourhood Plan was not in the best interests of the village but that the existing Statement on future development should be recirculated for review at the next meeting.

Traffic issues

Junction of the B1145 with the A1067

Concerns were raised about traffic issues at the junction of the B1145 and A1067. It was agreed that traffic is increasing and would increase further following the completion of the Northern bypass and following the approval of the 36 houses at Two Fields Way.

The lorries parked near the junction outside the garden centre were also causing concern as vehicles are unable to see past the lorry to overtake.

The issue of cars parking on pavements in The Street, outside The Bell and on the Reepham Road was discussed. The cars are obstructing the pavement making it impossible for pedestrians and people with prams/wheelchairs to pass. The Parish Council are keen that the current issues with parking/access in The Street do not impact on the bus service which currently travels through the village.

Following discussion it was agreed that the PC would write to the District and County Councillor and Highways with concerns and request a review of the junction.

1. Election of Officers:

The present vice chairman J Harvey declared his intention to resign from the council after 26 years' service to the council

Vice Chairman: N Hatch - Proposed by D Barrett, seconded by N Mears, unanimously elected

2. Minutes of Last Annual Foxley Parish Council Meeting dated 19th May 2016 were agreed and signed.

3. Chairman's Report: It has been a busy for our council as apart from our usual problems we have had three major items to deal with.

We have had the continual problem of the uncontrolled dog in The Street, which had resulted in a number of unpleasant incidents with parishioners and visitors. Whilst we have pressed both Breckland and the police to try to resolve this matter, it seems they are powerless to act until a more serious event occurs. However, the problem does seem to have abated somewhat in the last two months or so and it is hoped the owner now exerts more control over the dog and continues to do so.

A planning application for 5 dwellings adjacent to Lawrence Place was rejected and we then had an application for the largest single number of dwellings in Foxley we have ever had, namely 24 in Old Fakenham Road, which the applicant subsequently reduced to 18. A parish meeting resulted in almost unanimous rejection of these proposals, and at the time of writing we await a decision.

It is with great regret and sadness that it seems likely we shall see our longest serving councillor depart the village in the not too distant future, we shall say more about that when the time comes but I hope we can find at least one new face to keep our numbers up. Although we are not much more than a "talking and lobbying shop" I feel the village would be much the poorer without a parish council. Nicholas Mears, Chairman

There are a number of regular events held in the hall: including coffee mornings, indoor bowls, table tennis and the bi-monthly FAB meetings. We would like the hall to be used more often and hope to attract other clubs and activities in the future.

The finances of the village hall are sound, with \pm 154.22 in petty cash, \pm 612.44 in the current account and \pm 5,329.68 in the reserve account.

Letter from Sally

Dear Friends,

In July, the Church celebrates three figures who played a key role in the life of Jesus.

Firstly, we have Thomas the Apostle (3rd) – "doubting Thomas". Thomas who had to see for himself the resurrected Jesus and be able to touch his wounds, before he could believe in the Resurrection. His doubts echo ours, perhaps, yet, when he does meet Jesus, Jesus says: 'Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.' John 20:24-29

There is a tradition that Thomas travelled outside the Roman Empire and got as far as the states of Tamil Nadu and Kerala in present-day India, and is still venerated there today.

On 22nd July, we celebrate Mary Magdalene. Much-maligned in the early Church, and portrayed as a woman of ill-repute, Mary is the one accredited with the first encounter with the risen Jesus. She wanted to cling onto him in that confusion of grief and joy, but Jesus said to her: Go and tell my brothers that you have seen me and that I am ascending to my God and your God. John 20:11-18. Because of that, Mary is now often described as 'The Apostle to the Apostles'.

We don't know what happened to Mary. It seems that she retired to a life of prayer, possibly to Ephesus, or – one legend has it – to Aix-en-Provence.

Then, on 25th July, we remember James the Apostle. James and his brother John, jockeyed for position at the right and left hand of Jesus in the kingdom of Heaven (encouraged by their mother, Salome). Matthew 20:20-28. Well, James came to a sticky end – Herod ordered his execution by the sword. Allegedly, his body was cast adrift in a boat and landed in northern Spain, to be buried in a 'field of stars'. You can visit Santiago de Compostela today, or make the 100km pilgrimage walk to his shrine.

Whatever we make of these characters, or their stories, we have to acknowledge that they were, and are, shining lights of a life of devotion. Examples to us all!
