





Update on planning matters in Bawdeswell

Although the planning application for 36 new dwellings on the Two Fields Way site (3PL/2015/1424/F) was granted last year, it is still shown as 'undecided' on Breckland's website pending 'legal matters'. This involves the Sect 106 situation and the ownership of the two 'public' pieces of land on the site which Bawdeswell Parish Council want control of to prevent the site being expanded.

It was therefore quite a shock to discover last week that another application, (3PL/2017/0035/F) had been received by Breckland for 44 dwellings on the same site at Two Fields Way. Although the company making the application has changed, it is believed that the same developer is behind both applications. From the layout of the plans it appears that the two on site 'roads' stop at the far end of the development thereby providing easy access to the field between the site and the Fakenham Road. This would be perfect for further development should that field be owned by developers in the future.

Bawdeswell Parish Council objected, unsuccessfully, to the original application on the grounds that the site is outside the Settlement Boundary, and that Bawdeswell does not have the infrastructure to support 36 new dwellings. Our school is always full or close to being full, we have no doctors' surgeries in the village and no public transport to the two closest surgeries. There are very few employment opportunities in the village, our Post Office is only open twice a week for three hours and the bus service provides transport to Norwich and Fakenham daytime but not evening, and only once a week to Dereham. Anglian Water has a history of complaints regarding the service they provide to the Hall Road area. Breckland has no power to improve these services but they do have the power to turn our lovely village into a building site.



Breckland is now saying that it has a 'Five Year Plan' which means they have reached their target for new dwellings. This effectively should mean that all applications which are outside the settlement boundary should not get planning permission. Further bad news last week was a report in the Dereham Times that although Yaxham had successfully fought against being designated a Local Service Centre, Bawdeswell is to be designated a LSC subject to ratification by Breckland Council.

When Breckland warned us that Bawdeswell was being considered for LSC status they said it would mean our quota for new dwellings would be a total of 32 for the next 20 years. This was quickly increased to 36 to coincide with the Two Fields Way application. Many villagers were at the meeting in the church when the LSC situation was discussed with a Breckland representative.

Bawdeswell have asked Breckland to justify making us an LSC when we have already reached our quota of 32/36 dwellings. To date we have not received a reply. I can only assume that they do not intend to stick to their present quotas.

I urge everyone to put a comment on the Breckland Planning website, as many of you did for the last Two Fields Way application, and show Breckland that we do care about the future of our village. Bawdeswell Parish Council is in favour of small developments within the Settlement Boundary which our limited services can cope with, but 44 new dwellings outside the Settlement Boundary is unacceptable.

If it is easier, please write your comments in a letter, quoting the planning reference 3PL/2017/0035/F, and put it into my letterbox at 1 All Saints Court, The Street, Bawdeswell, and I will deliver them to Breckland Council Office.

The loop system to help the hard of hearing is now installed and is working well. We are grateful to those volunteers who worked on that particular project. The old village sign will soon be installed in Reception.



Book Club "Burial Rites" by Hannah Kent



Set 1929, and based on fact, the novel explores the last few months in the life of the last woman to be executed in Iceland.

A crofting family, who farm in a remote part of Iceland, are chosen to host a convicted murderess, Agnes Magnusdottir, whilst she awaits execution. The reader is transported to a bleak and hostile landscape where the sun hardly appears to rise. The host family live a hand to mouth existence and Agnes is, understandably, an unwelcome guest. The family know little of her other than that she and two other perpetrators have been convicted of the murder of her former employer.

Initially she remains mute, speaking to no-one other than a visiting priest. The reader however is privy to her thoughts and can see a compassionate side to her which is at odds with the family's perception of her as a brutal murderess. By working hard she slowly gains the trust of one family member, Margret. One bleak night the two women start conversing and Agnes recounts the tragic and moving story of her past and her involvement in the crime for which she has been sentenced. It is no surprise to the reader that the circumstances behind the crime, and Agnes' involvement in it, are not as may first have been thought.

The writer, Hannah Kent, learned of the existence of Agnes Magnusdottir during a visit to Iceland as a teenager and felt compelled to research her life, and the mystery surrounding the crime, with the limited evidence available. The outcome is a beautifully written work of fiction woven into the few surviving facts. Hannah Kent does not portray Agnes as a victim nor necessarily as a heroine but creates a believable character with strengths and flaws. I don't think I would have been the only one to shed a tear at the end of the book when the time came for Agnes to be taken to her place of execution.

The turnout at our last meeting was one of the largest in recent times and with one exception the group agreed the book was a totally compelling read. I have to say I found it a perfect book to read in the bleak mid-winter!

We are reading "Hitman Anders and the meaning of it all" by Jonas Jonasson for discussion at our meeting on the 2nd March and "Mothering Sunday" by Graham Swift for discussion at our meeting on 6th April. 



Matters arising

Following further enquiries about the schedule for the phone box repaint, BT confirmed that the phone box was being considered for decommissioning and that a public consultation had already taken place without any previous notification to the Parish Council. It was agreed to write to Breckland questioning why the PC had not been consulted on the matter.

An update from Breckland re Section 106 agreement for amenity land at Two Fields Way was requested. It was reported that a further planning application was being processed for 44 houses on this land which may affect the amenity land and agreement. Letter to be sent to Breckland to reiterate initial request for PC ownership of amenity land and to seek assurance that the specification for the amenity area will be met.

It was agreed to seek further information with Open Space Society regarding adopting the Village Green.

Planning

Replacement dwelling at Pigmans House, Wood Farm, Reepham Road, Bawdeswell -

The Council agreed to object to the application on the grounds that the existing structure could not be considered as a dwelling and the application should be considered as new development. There are no agricultural connotations and the site exit onto the Reepham Road is dangerous.

Erection of 2 storey detached dwelling at Land Adjacent to 6 Reeves Close, Bawdeswell, Norfolk -

The Council agreed that their only objection was that the dwelling was outside the settlement boundary and the Council needed to remain consistent with their policy.



Letter from Sally

Dear Friends,

At the very end of January, I was delighted to be able to announce the beginning of a new Interim Ministry across the churches of the Heart of Norfolk Team. The Revd Canon Christopher Davies, formerly Vicar of Wymondham Abbey, has joined us for a period of up to 12 months and will be taking services and getting to know our village communities at coffee mornings and other gatherings. I am handing over to Christopher now, to introduce himself and reflect on the season of Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday, 1st March.

I am delighted to have this opportunity of returning to parish ministry and I am much looking forward to working with Sally and getting to know the communities that make up The Heart of Norfolk. I have been ordained for over 30 years and have served in inner-city, suburban and latterly a market town parish (Wymondham). In coming to The Heart of Norfolk I feel in one sense that I am coming home as the first part of my working life was spent as a farmer in a rural part of Hertfordshire.

Much has changed in the church during those 30 years but one thing which has remained constant for me, wherever I have served, is the need to set aside some time to nurture my relationship with God. Although I was taught in my theological training always to set aside some time each day for some serious theological reading, the realities of a busy parish mean that such a discipline often gets squeezed. I feel I cannot justify sitting with my head in some tome when a parishioner should be visited or Holy Communion taken to someone who is housebound.

In Lent I always try extra hard, however, to do some spiritual reading and I am currently setting aside half an hour each day to read around the subject of worship. I have already had a salutary lesson and have been reminded that worship isn't about spectacle. For those of us who regularly participate in worship, particularly "from the front" be it leading intercessions, reading, welcoming or acting as sides-persons, there is the feeling of being on view and yet the only audience for worship is God. Of course we want to get things right in our worship, but for whom?

In the same way in our daily lives we take care to make sure our behaviour is acceptable to others and the approval and admiration of others remains a powerful force in our lives. But we have heard the word of Jesus: It is not people we must

impress; it is God we must honour. We are not to seek our neighbour's approval but we are to faithfully serve the purposes of God.

What we say and do as Christians seeks not the approval of people but the honouring of God. It is not public recognition and approval that should be our first concern – but rather the mission of God in Jesus Christ. No doubt that may prompt some to see what we do as perverse or maybe even hypocritical. But we are to hang loose to our reputations, neither out of false modesty, nor the blithe disregard of how may look to others but in sure and certain dependence on God's righteousness alone.

Lent is a wonderful opportunity for some extra reading and reflection. If you do not fancy doing this on your own why not join one of the groups which will be meeting? I have certainly found over the years that the more I am able to do in this respect the more wonderful the celebration of Easter becomes.

Do use Lent positively!


Deanery Lent Services


