

BOOK Club "Mothering Sunday" by Graham Swift



11 O'clock on Mothering Sunday March 30th 1924, a secret assignation takes place between Paul, the youngest son of the wealthy Sheringham family and Jane (Jay) Fairfield, maid to the nearby Niven family. The couple lie naked on Paul's bed smoking

cigarettes with the ash tray conveniently placed over Jay's navel. Slowly and cleverly over the ensuing chapters Jay's elder self, now a successful author, recounts the previously untold story of this brief affair.

Paul the only surviving son of the Sheringham's is engaged to be married to Emma Hobday and has arranged to meet his fiancé before they proceed together to join their families for a picnic lunch. Paul is studying to be a lawyer and the reader begins to realise that he could be feeling some family pressures of expectation following the death of his two brothers in the First World War trenches. His gentle and thoughtful treatment of Jay makes one realise that this is not just a rich young man taking advantage of a vulnerable servant girl. He has previously acknowledged that she is 'clever', knows that she is an avid reader and has planned this final romantic assignation with considerable care.

Jay continues to lie naked on the bed and as she watches Paul dress slowly and assiduously prior to meeting his fiancé, she wonders if he is perhaps attempting to delay his departure. Subsequent events leave the reader many opportunities to piece together several possible narratives for his actions before and following this departure.

The book was universally enjoyed by members of the book group (not necessarily a common occurrence) and we generally appreciated the authors delightful, almost musical prose along with his ability to weave such an endearing story so succinctly. A wonderful, strongly recommended read.

The Book Club meets in the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading "The Light between Oceans" by M. L. Stedman for discussion at our meeting on the 4th May and will read "Number 11" by Jonathan Coe for discussion at our meeting on 1st June 2017. New members always welcome. Russell de Beer (Agent for Strutt and Parker LLP): addressed the meeting and was given the opportunity to respond to residents' concerns throughout the meeting. Peter Howell also given the opportunity to address residents.

Note: the documentation on-line incorrectly identified the site as Chalet Poultry Farm .

Concerns raised by residents

- Density of houses on the site a concern many residents felt that 24 houses were too many (government would allow 30 on that size site).
- Application is outside the settlement boundary
- Development would increase houses in Foxley by 17.7%
- Bats have been seen on the site
- Houses have very small gardens nowhere for children to play, there is no playground in the village and no provision for a playground on the site
- 40,000 square foot intensive poultry site with 39,000 chickens not shown on plans but only 70m from development (how close can housing development be to intensive poultry farm?)
- Does the village need 24 new homes?
- Traffic will inevitably increase on Mill Road and Old Fakenham Road. Both unsuited to any increase in traffic, Mill Road has blind bends and is single track.
- 9 of the 24 houses on the site are designated as 'affordable housing'. However, the number of affordable houses can be changed when detailed plans are drawn up. Some felt number of affordable houses should be greater.
- Concern about number of school places in Bawdeswell Primary School and Reepham High School. Not only this development but development also proposed in Bawdeswell.
- No provision for any bungalows in development but bungalows are often preferred by an ageing population.
- Foxley has few facilities for either young families or older residents
- Some happy with development but felt the size of this development was not in keeping with the 'modest' development desirable for a village.






