

Dorcas Downs

15/08/1934 - 25/09/2017

The funeral of Dorcas Downs was held at All Saints' Church, Bawdeswell on the 9th October. She died peacefully at home on the 25th September after bravely fighting Alzheimer's Disease for a number of years. Her funeral was very well attended – a reflection of how well she was thought of.

Dorcas was born in Swannington, the eldest of four children, and lived in Bawdeswell for most of her married life. Last year she celebrated 60 years of marriage and her family – husband Peter, children Lorna and Paul, and grandchildren Tom and Sophie – were the centre of her life. Although her memory had started to deteriorate in the last few years, she still knew and recognised her family and friends, and enjoyed their company.

Before her marriage, Dorcas was a hairdresser at Plumes in Reepham, and also ran the Sunday School at Swannington, where, when younger, she was responsible for "pumping" the Church organ in the days when manual effort was required to enable the organist to play!

She was a keen and skilled flower arranger, and it was her suggestion that she and Peter start growing flowers on their land next to the bypass, and selling them at prices such that people could afford to have them at home, and to remember loved ones in church and in the graveyard.

Peter, Lorna and Paul would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for their kind words and sympathy since Dorcas' death. She will be sorely missed but fondly remembered.

Dates and times can be found on the Practice website (www.elmhamsurgery.com). Each PPG meeting is attended by practice staff, usually the practice manager, Judith Wood and one of the doctors and on occasions by a guest speaker (e.g. local MP, NHS and/or Norfolk County Council Social Services).

The main purpose of a PPG is to ensure that patients are involved in decisions about the range and quality of services currently provided and those either being initiated by the practice or imposed by Government policy via the NHS England and South Norfolk Commissioning Group (CCG). The necessity to integrate medical care, particularly mental health with social care involves Norfolk County Council.

PPG members are not allowed to discuss their own state of health at meetings although they can usefully provide feedback/suggestions about their own "surgery experience" and comments gained from other patients

PPGs are an important point of contact for the NHS South Norfolk Clinical Commissioning Group (SNCCG) which is the GP led authority that commissions, plans and purchases health care for the 220,000 people living in South Norfolk. This authority allocates NHS funds on behalf of the Government and in the current financial climate decides which areas of Health Care to prioritise and which to change (www.southnorfolkccg.nhs.uk). Your PPGs have built up a good working relationship with the SNCCG by attending workshops and hosting talks locally. The North Norfolk MP and former Health Minister Norman Lamb has much appreciated our Practice's efforts to lobby for integration of Health with Social care, with an emphasis on mental health and the increasing needs of an ageing population. The Swanton Morley PPG has organised a public meeting attended by over 50 people with the local MP George Freeman to express their concerns over underfunding and cuts in the NHS and Council funding.

Elmham and Swanton Morley PPGs are seeking new members, so contact Roger and/or Gina by email or telephone for more information, and consider joining us for a first meeting, your views will be greatly appreciated by our members and surgery staff.

"Swimming Home" by Deborah Levy

A family and friends summer holiday in the south of France. What could go wrong? A lot! This isn't a typical story; it's not a summer murder or even love story. It's far more. An indication of its depth is that, as you begin to read, you realise that this thinnish book is going to pack a lot in. It doesn't start at the beginning, instead, as we read, we begin to understand that the events described in the first few pages are going to happen in the future.

I suppose it's fair to let you know that our group had different feelings about this book. 'Like', doesn't come into it, which is why it provided us with a really long discussion, unpicking the characters and the plot.

At first glance, it's a quick read, but as you get to the last page, you realise it's much, much more complex. The ending is a shock and it made me go straight back to the beginning. I began to read it again, slowly, to pick up on the clues that I'd missed. A lot happens 'off the page', between the chapters and you have to work out what is happening although it is not being openly said.

So here are the bare bones of the story:

A famous poet, Joe, is on holiday in a rented house near Nice with his wife and daughter. They also have two friends staying with them. His wife, Isabel, is a war correspondent, often away on assignment with the result that Joe has been the stay-at-home parent during Nina's childhood. She's now 14 and is on the brink of early womanhood. Their friends have a business selling antique guns and artisan goods. Into this uncomfortable house comes a young woman, Kitty Finch. She gate-crashes into their holiday with the hope that Joe will read her poem. Her arrival starts, or may be it just coincides, with a chain of events that will change all their lives.

None of these characters are 'loveable', it isn't easy to identify with any of them and it's hard, as the reader, to be on anyone's side. They all have histories and flaws. Some more devastating than others. I don't want to spoil your chance of reading this, so haven't needed a 'spoiler alert'. I just hope you might want to read it yourself: then you and I could really talk about it!

The Book Club meets in the 'Lounge' outside the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading "This must be the Place" by Maggie O'Farrell for discussion at our meeting on 2nd November and will read "The Noise of Time" by Julian Barnes for our discussion on 7th December. 

PARISH COUNCILS

Foxley Parish Council Meeting held on 12th October 2017

Present: N. Mears (Chair), N. Hatch (Vice Chairman), D. Barrett, M. Watson, L. Rose (Clerk) and 10 residents

Apologies for absence: G. Bambridge (District Councillor)

Co-option of councillor:

Gillian Blyth was co-opted as a councillor on Foxley Parish Council. For the first time in many years Foxley now has its full quota of councillors.

Planning Matters:

18 dwellings on Old Fakenham Rd – rejected by 6 votes to 5 votes.

Saffron Housing Trust – an enquiry about the possible development of 6 homes on Old Fakenham Road, continuing the line of houses on the East side down towards the war memorial, has been received. There was much support for the need for rented houses in the area. There was also some support for some shared ownership homes. However, concern was expressed that the houses would be outside the development guidelines and whether allowing 6 houses would then lead to more houses on that site. At the end of the debate a vote was taken on the motion that Foxley Council welcomes the possible development and would support it: the residents present narrowly voted against but the councillors voted for the scheme. Clerk to inform Saffron Trust, who may, or may not, choose to pursue the scheme and make a formal planning application.

Bus shelters:

A site meeting took place to consider the position of the proposed bus shelters. There is room behind both bus stops for a small shelter to be erected. The enclosed shelters would be made of clear polycarbonate with a barrel roof. The cost for manufacture and erection of the two shelters would be \$9,842.00 but hopefully the parish council could get a grant for 50% of the cost. It was decided that, on the condition the council get a grant, they should go ahead with the two bus shelters.

Finance:

The financial plan for 2018-19 was discussed but it was decided to defer the setting of the precept so that the councillors could seek further advise.

The following information relates to information taken from the July, September and October meetings.

BT Phone Box - Following discussion it was agreed that the Parish Council would not enter into a land lease agreement with BT. The phone box has now been painted and as it is located in a conservation area, the box will not be removed so no further action should be taken.

Planning - The Parish Council revised their Statement of Future Development. A copy of which can be found on the website.

3PL/2017/0035/F - Residential development of 40 dwellings, open space, associated infrastructure and vehicle access via Hall Road at Hall Road, Bawdeswell.

At the Parish Council meeting held on the 20th July, Councillors agreed unanimously to object to the above planning application. These objections were voiced by Cllr Cunliffe at the planning committee meeting held at Breckland on the 31st July where, despite the objections, the scheme received approval from the planning committee. Cllr Cunliffe has written a report which can be viewed on the Parish Council's website under planning.

As Breckland District Council will not be interested in taking on ownership of the proposed open space, the Parish Council will need to consider if they wish to take on ownership and responsibility. This will be considered as a future agenda item.

Confirmation that the application for 36 dwellings at Hall Road has been approved has now been received.

The Breckland Local Plan Pre-submission Document includes the Two Fields Way site already approved by Breckland Planning and is shown as within the proposed new settlement boundary. Following discussion the Parish Council unanimously agreed that they had no further comments to make with regards to the Local Plan document.

Finance - Expenditure for the year to date was £10,502.79, income to date was confirmed as £20,445.55. The Parish Council have begun to consider the precept requirements for 2018/19. The precept will be set at the December meeting. A Parish

We held a Harvest Festival service in October as did the School a little later in the month, and the church was full as many of you will know.

On 29th October we are scheduled to host a Benefice Eucharist for all 13 churches in our group, and on November 5th our Patronal Festival (All Saints Day) a Choral Eucharist with the Festival Choir followed by Bucks Fizz and light refreshments. Sounds worth attending!

It is demoralising for them and for us.

Options include grouping parishes, to share services on a rota, and/or closing down most churches and keeping open just two or three. Bawdeswell is not one suggested for closure, but Foxley is.

CHURCH NEWS

Letter from Christopher

In late September well over 60 people gathered in Bawdeswell Village Hall for an open meeting about the future of the 13 churches in the Heart of Norfolk Benefice. The meeting was called following the repeated failure of advertisements to attract a new full-time priest to serve as a colleague for Sally.

There was wide recognition that things cannot continue as they are with multiple, often very small, congregations struggling to maintain medieval buildings. There was also the feeling that we need to seriously re-engage with what it means to be "church". The comment was well made: "how wonderful it would be if all those gathered in the hall were able to come together for worship on a Sunday!"


The number of church buildings we have is an accident of history and, fine as they may be, the fact is that they have never been fully used as places of worship. Current registers show that the numbers worshipping in the late 1940s was little different to today.

As a result of the Bawdeswell meeting a steering group, representing each of the 13 parishes has been formed to look at how we can be more effective in our witness without being hidebound by so many buildings. Inevitably this will mean change.

In a recent address Justin Welby, Archbishop of Canterbury, said "changes are always very difficult to deal with, and in most generations we imagine that we are facing the most difficult changes that any human being has ever faced in the whole of history". The Archbishop went on to explain the account in the Old Testament book, Deuteronomy, of Moses being about to undergo the biggest change that can ever happen to a person, namely his death. Yet the account focusses not on Moses' death but about the process of handover and continuity and flexibility to be adopted by Israel if God's purposes are to be fulfilled.

It may be that some of the things that we cherish will have to change if the message of the Gospel is to be effectively handed on to the next generation. This may disturb us for a while but we must set alongside our own feelings the overriding and glorious commission to "share the good news". That is our principal task and our joy.
