Bawdeswell Parish Council Update

First of all can I offer a massive vote of thanks to all those villagers who took the time to voice their opposition to the planning application for 40 new houses in land off Hall Road. We had a strong case but in the end we were defeated by Breckland District Council Planning Committee. They chose not to listen to the voice of the people most affected by their bad decision, namely the villagers of Bawdeswell and in particular the residents closest to Two Fields Way. We can only hope that they will keep their promise that under the latest Local Plan, we will not have further large scale development in our lovely village.

Your Parish Council is committed to preserving the look and character of the village and will continue to fight for it. Whilst on the subject of thanks, I should like to thank Jo Porter of The Street Bawdeswell, who at her 65th Birthday Party at the Village Hall, requested that no presents were given, but instead asked for donations for new play equipment for the Children's Play Area at the Recreation Ground. She raised the sum of £325 which was gratefully accepted by the Parish Council and will be ring-fenced for use only for the good of the play area. The Parish Council this week has had maintenance carried out on some of the play area equipment, but will be looking to add to the existing equipment.

I would also like to congratulate the management team of the Bawdeswell Youth Football Club for their efforts on behalf of the youngsters in the village. We all wish their teams well for the upcoming season and I'm sure the home matches at our Recreation Ground will be well attended by supporters.

Whilst it was disappointing that Breckland did not support our planning objections, they will not deter us from remaining what we are, strong, determined and proud of Bawdeswell.

Book Club "Waterland" by Graham Swift

A watery tale narrated by Tom Crick, a history teacher, whose childhood home was a lock-keepers cottage nestled deep in the heart of fenland. He now teaches at a London School. Staring redundancy in the face, Tom delivers his final lessons based on his personal and ancestral fenland memoirs.

Tom's stories jump to and fro between three Centuries. The order is not chronological and requires concentration to remember how we left a character, chapters previously, when we re-join them. We learn a lot. How the Vikings were able navigate all the way to Ely. How the lodes, drains, cuts and dykes were created by the Dutch in the 1600s. We also learn a lot about human kindness and frailty.

This novel has something for everyone; geography, history, superstition, fairy-tale, murder, incest, kidnap, madness and more information about eels that you imagined existed! For someone who had never actually lived in the fens, Swift paints a vivid picture of the landscape. We were all agreed on that point but the construction of the book proved a sticking point for some.

"The Essex Serpent" by Sarah Perry

The novel is set in 1893-4, partially in London and for the most part in and around a fictional village on the Blackwater Estuary. The unorthodox heroine is Cora Seagrave; privileged, newly widowed (thankful to have been released from a difficult marriage) and free to follow her interests. She relocates to Alwinter after hearing rumours of a serpent on the marshes of the Blackwater. She is enamoured with the idea of finding evidence of living fossils. After a series of mysterious events, the village feels oppressed by a monster.

The book is packed with ideas, events and characters, perhaps too many to make it a convincing narrative. The final reveal of the mystery of the serpent was considered to be an anticlimax by some readers but perhaps reflects the author's intent to demonstrate a late Victorian view that superstition and mysteries can be resolved by the application of rational thought, observation and the application of science.



PARISH COUNCILS

Foxley Parish Council Meetings held on 27th July 2017

Present: N. Mears (Chair), J. Harvey, N. Hatch, G. Bambridge (District Councillor), Mrs L. Rose (clerk) and 9 parishioners

1. Co-option of Mark Watson as councillor on Foxley Parish Council: Proposed NM, Seconded DB Unanimously approved. The chairman welcomed Mark and he completed and signed the 'Declaration of Acceptance of Office' form.

2. Planning Matters: 18 dwellings on Old Fakenham Rd – still no decision although there have been several changes to the plans. NM suggested that the council ask GB to put the planning proposal before the planning committee of 4th September 2017. Council need to provide a member to speak on council's behalf.

3. Future of St. Thomas' Church. JH as Churchwarden is expecting to move away in due course. He reported on the situation arising. For many years now, the congregation has been small, as in many other rural churches. But, the problem is that we are all that much older! There is no one wanting to take on the jobs of warden, treasurer, secretary or deanery rep. So, with great regret the PCC feels that the process of transferring the church management to the Diocesan Churches Trust, which can take up to two years, should be started. The first step is consultation with Foxley Parish residents, hence tonight's Agenda item. This will be followed by a letter and a Public Meeting on 25th September in the village hall.

Under DCT management there will be about six Services a year, plus weddings and funerals, there will still be a need for some cleaning and flower arranging and Linda Rose kindly offered to lead a "Friends of St. Thomas'", should this come about.

Should some younger churchgoers arrive in the village, as has frequently saved the day during my 25 years here, then the DCT route can be aborted.

4. Bus stop/shelter: It has now been moved to the Chapel Road crossing and poles with bus stop flags have been erected. A small sub-committee (NM, MW and LR) to look into the suitable design and location of a bus shelter.

5. Members of the public again raised the verge on the corner of the Old Fakenham Rd and Mill Road which has not been cut – Clerk has reported this to Highways and this is being investigated as they do not recognise this as council land. Leaves on the z-bends of Old Fakenham Rd. Pot hole in Mill Rd on bend and mud on the road around the post box.



On 18th October, the Church celebrates the Feast of St Luke. Of the four gospelwriters, Luke is the great story-teller, drawing pictures for us about Jesus' life and ministry. It's a joy to read, as well as conveying Jesus' teaching in a very engaging style. At its heart, Luke's gospel is careful to be inclusive, with many stories about prominent women, as well as men, and always with a great concern for the poor and marginalised of the society of the day. For Luke, the good news of salvation is for all, regardless of gender, social position or nationality.

But what do we know about Luke? He didn't know Jesus whilst he was alive on earth, but he was a great friend of the apostle Paul. In fact, Paul mentions him three times in his letters and describes him as "the beloved physician". So, a doctor – small wonder, then, that he was concerned about those who got a rough deal in life.

Luke wrote two of the books of the New Testament – the gospel that stands in his name, and The Acts of the Apostles, describing their activity and the early days of the Church. We know that he researched his material meticulously, as both books begin with a salutation to Theophilus (lover of God) and describe the lengths he went to in order that he could "set down an orderly account of events". Luke was a Gentile (non-Jew) and tradition has it that he wrote his gospel in Greece, finally dying in Boeotia at the age of 84!

So, we give thanks for Luke as we enter the final quarter of this year. Also in October, of course, we continue our Harvest Festival Thanksgivings and end the month with a celebration of all the Saints (29th at Bawdeswell). We are also planning a service to commemorate the departed on 4th November, 4pm, at North Elmham St Mary, where people will be invited to commemorate a loved-one: names will be read and candles lit. Please do let me know if you would like to have a loved-one remembered in this way.
