

Police Notice

Every year burglary tends to increase during the autumn months as the afternoons get darker, making it easier to identify unoccupied homes which are often left unlit. You can help protect your home by following some basic crime prevention advice such as:

- Use timer switches on a lamp, radio or TV so they turn on as it gets dark in the afternoons.
- Make a habit of checking that ground floor windows and doors are closed and locked when you leave the house or go to bed.
- Upstairs windows should be closed and locked when the house is unoccupied.
- PVC doors should be locked by lifting the handle and turning the key to ensure all the security features are in place.
- Car and house keys should be kept out of sight in a safe place. Don't leave them on display on window sills, in porches, hallways or kitchens.
- Secure your rear garden by shutting and locking any gates.
- Burglars can use garden tools, like ladders to break in, please ensure you always lock away tools after use.

We know that our bookings will quieten down a bit as we get nearer to the festive season when we'll all have a bit of a breather, ready to start up again in the new year.







The novel opens in 1979, with the narrator Phyllis looking back on her earlier life during World War II. The story goes back to 1938 when Phyllis, her husband and children return to Britain after living and working abroad. Initially, they stay with her sister Patricia and become involved with her upper class friends and the politics of the time.

An incident occurs during a Ball at the house of her faithful friend Sarita and this results in a tragedy the following day, which stays with Phyllis for the rest of her life.

Her sister Nina, introduces the couple to Sir Oswald Mosley, the charismatic leader of the Party Peace Campaign. This leads to an eventual betrayal by Nina and the pair are imprisoned for the duration of the war. Hard times are described, firstly in Holloway and then a more relaxed internment on the Isle of Man. This gave Phyllis a certain freedom from the upper class restrictions of her life and she found some contentment during this time.

After the war, Phyllis finds she has lost the love and respect of her children and sisters. Following the death of her husband, she becomes isolated from everyone and takes employment as a companion to an elderly lady,

This book was enjoyed by the majority of our group. It showed a certain naivety, especially of the women involved with British fascism. They just wanted to believe in peace and prevent another war. Later when the awful atrocities were revealed to the world, Phyllis still considered Oswald Mosley to be an "honourable" man.

"After the Party" was a clever title for this novel. It had two meanings, firstly referring to the tragedy that took place at the Ball and secondly the dissolution of the political party..

The Book Club meets in the 'Lounge' outside the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books each month. We are currently reading "All the Light We Cannot See" by Anthony Doerr for discussion at our meeting on 5th December. Matters Arising

A request was received from Bawdeswell Youth Football Club for them to be able to install an electricity supply to the container on the recreation ground with the intention to provide semi fixed floodlights and lighting in the container. It was confirmed that the Club would only use the lights for training once a week for a couple of hours and that the lights would not cause a nuisance to neighbouring properties. Following lengthy discussion and with an agreement in principle from the Village Hall, The Council agreed to the request, subject to the contrainer painting being completed, a risk assessment being carried out by the contractor prior to the installation of the electrical supply, full certification of the supply by the contractor and the signing of a formal agreement.

Grounds Maintenance

The Parish Council decided to renew the contract with the current contractor and request the first cut of the season to include the collection of cuttings, Subsequent cuts to be made using a cylinder mower, which as long as the grass is cut regularly would produce a better surface for the Youth Football Team to play matches and would not incur additional costs to the Council.

Trustee of Allotment to Former Highways Surveyors account

The Council agreed to begin the process of opening a bank account for the Trustee of Allotment to Former Highways Surveyors funds (ring fenced for maintenance of Adams Pit) with the Co-op Bank as it was not possible to meet HSBC safeguarding requirements.


