

Bawdeswell Village Hall

Happy New Year! We're looking forward to spring, but we're guessing it might be a few more dark months first.



Unsurprisingly the Hall was quiet over the Christmas period but we were very pleased when we totted up all the uses and hirers that the Hall has fulfilled during the year. We have had over 720 hires during the year, ranging from meetings of 2 to 120 people, and that's excluding all the football and bowls activities. We've hosted lots of different events; local family celebrations for birthday parties, anniversaries as well as, sadly, wakes. We've also looked after a myriad of different groups from a national gardening society, nature groups, a ploughing society, a regional model train exhibition to WI meetings.

We recognise that we must keep the hall in good condition because this is part of its appeal, but comments from our hirers indicate that they also appreciate the welcome they receive and the help given by all our volunteers and we feel this is reflected in how well our hirers treat the hall. We've said it before, but it can never be said too many times: many thanks to all our volunteers who contribute so much to the running of our village hall.

In December we took delivery of 'a big bit of kit'. We have invested some of our income into buying a stage. But it's better than 'a stage' because its clever technical design means that we can use it in different formats and in different positions. It folds into sections and is stored on a trolley which is then used to move the sections into position. Whilst it is light, it is very strong and stable. We're very excited that we can now provide a stage for different events for example, along different sides of the main hall or we could even erect it down the centre to give us a cat-walk. At the moment its first 'tester' will be lan McMillan of BBC Radio 3's The Verb; BBC Breakfast; Pointless Celebrities; Coast; Countryfile and The Yorkshire Dales plus Channel 4's The Lakes for his live comedy gig Between You and Me on Friday 22nd March.

As the months roll on we plan to look into further ideas to give us more flexibility and ways to enhance our hall, for example, round tables, table trolleys, patio doors and keeping the hall well decorated.

CLUBS AND SOCIETIES





This novel divided the book group: some thought it too long at over 500 pages and could not commit to finishing it; some read and disliked it: some read and loved it.

This is a Gothic tale, gripping and erotic in parts, which twists and turns in three sections. It is linked in style and content to 19th century novels and the group recognised Wilkie Collins' The Woman in White and Dickens' Oliver Twist among others. Sarah Waters takes many of these writers' plot devices: baby-farming; a hidden will; the swapping of babies at birth; child criminals and the incarceration of women in lunatic asylums, but gives a gritty realism to the issues. Character and plot are detailed, some said overly so. There is a brutal middle section in the asylum. Lower class London is depicted as a place of ruthless greed and emotional abuse.

Susi had been kept "soft" by baby-farming Mrs Sucksby, partially we hope due to affection but also because there is a deeper purpose. Maud, in upper middle class seclusion lives a life of stultifying ennui enlivened only by classifying and reading her uncle's pornographic literature for his "gentlemen friends". Linked by the caddish "Gentleman" who courts Maud, the plot of duping and double-duping unfolds.

This is a feminist text and love story between the two female protagonists who are the survivors in a world where women are manipulated and abused by men; it is a real insight into the reality of Victorian England. Waters is adept at utilising the physical restraint of women's garments to mirror the physical and mental restraints on their lives: she milks the sensuous use of gloves, stockings and rustling skirts. She can tell a good story but is also a skilled writer and this combination gripped some in the group. The novel engendered heated debate among the book club members and a lively evening was had by all.

In December, we agreed to do something different. We had our own version of a Secret Santa. We each wrapped a favourite book into brown paper, obscuring all identifying marks, then wrote a few lines on the story as an introduction. Everyone then chose a book for Christmas. It's really difficult, when all the usual lures are missing; no title, no author, no graphics! At our January meeting we each introduced our book, explaining what we'd thought as we'd made the initial choice and then what we had thought of it. We had an enormously wide selection of books between us which we'll continue to offer to each other alongside our monthly reads.





Bawdeswell Parish Council Meeting held on 6th December

Councillor Resignation

Councillor Anthony Smith handed in his resignation. The Council would like to thank him for his work on the Council. In accordance with section 89(3) of the Local Government Act 1972 as the vacancy has occurred within six months before the day on which the councillor whose office is vacant would regularly have retired, an election shall not be held under Section 89(1) of the above Act, and the vacancy will be filled at the next ordinary election of councillors on 2nd May 2019. The Council have chosen to fill the vacancy for the period until that election by co-option.

WW1 memorial bench

The Parish Council have reconsidered the place to put the WW1 memorial bench. As the existing benches on the village are in good condition and did not need to be moved, it was agreed that the bench should be placed in the Millennium Garden to be enjoyed by all residents.

Tree report and church wall

The Friends of Bawdeswell Church had agreed to contribute towards the repair of the church wall, the amount of contribution to be decided once final cost was known. The tree survey report was circulated for consideration. It was agreed to seek quotes for recommended tree works. Letter to be sent to contractors requesting quotes for repair of church wall.

Garden Town Development

Although recent threat of garden town development has abated, the land proposed is still available for development. Following discussion about the possible need to create a reserve for fighting future development, it was unanimously agreed not to allocate funds for this purpose but to continue to maintain an interest.

Precept requirements for 2019/20

Following discussion it was unanimously agreed to approve an increase in the precept of £5,500 to set a precept of £24,000 as proposed by ClIr Mallen. The increase was in recognition of the need for medium to long term planning including consideration of deteriorating play equipment, church wall repairs and need for future driveway maintenance. It was agreed not to put any money towards Highway matters, acknowledging that this will restrict the Council's ability to apply for Parish Partnership Funding.

Planning applications

7 dwellings with garages – land adjacent to Lawrence Place – Approved

Outline permission for 7 dwellings with garages – adjacent to Chalet Poultry Farm, Old Fakenham Rd. – Approved

There was disquiet expressed at this decision as the Planning Inspector in the Appeal Decision for the previous application on this site had stated he considered it totally unsuitable for development. Our District Councillor, Gordon Bambridge, spoke strongly of his support for this application at the Planning Committee meeting, despite the Parish Council and the majority of Parishioners objecting. There was also concern that the Planning Committee now seems to treat Foxley as a suburb of Bawdeswell, as Bawdeswell's facilities are within walking distance of Foxley.

Planning Development Guidelines and all the protection smaller communities had against any development proposals. Clerk to write to planning inspector and Breckland planning committee chair to express Foxley's concern.

Safari tents at The Hawthorns, Billingford Rd – Undecided

Modification of approved design of garage building for use as annex with addition of dormer windows. Longacre, Chapel Rd, West – Discussed Councillors: Objection if the roof lights are at such a height as will permit the occupants to overlook the neighbouring property or garden.

Councillors discussed the way planning applications are dealt with between meetings: for major applications a full public meeting should be called. However, for minor applications all councillors should be alerted about the application by the clerk, the printed copy from Breckland to be sent round, as now, but councillors to email their responses to the clerk who will summarise the responses and send to Breckland (and councillors) and record the decision at the next meeting.

Garden Town: The campaign group felt there was likely to be requests for development in the future. Associated with this is the request from North Elmham Parish Clerk to increase the precept in Foxley to allow money to be contributed to a contingency fund. Councillors were not happy to increase the precept nor to commit funds for an unspecified use. It was proposed that funds (£1,000) from the council's reserves be set aside as a contingency fund that could be requested as necessary and returned to normal funds if not required. Proposed: NH, seconded: NM, unanimously agreed.

Western Link Road: Clerk had been to meeting about link and outlined the four proposed links. Council were unanimously in support if route D which they believed would lessen the traffic on the A1067.

Correspondence: Election information – Foxley likely to have a vacancy for a Parish Councillor at May elections.

Police information next SNAP meeting will be on 30/01/19.



Church Letter

As I write (6th January) the Season of Christmas is officially over; most of us will have packed away the tinsel and baubles for another year. Everything seems a bit dull and monochrome after the festivities and we are faced with a long dormant period. But if we look closely we can actually see the first signs of spring. In the garden we have aconites just showing, the beginning of what promises to be a glorious display of gold among the decaying brown leaves of last autumn. Behind them will come the snowdrops and eventually the first daffodils and later the tulips.

The first bulbs of spring are sometimes referred to as "buried treasure" and they certainly are. Year on year, no matter how hard the winter, they break through the hard earth and display themselves in all their glory. The poem by Clay Harrison puts this well:

Beneath the snows of winter, spring treasures can be found, In seeds that lie there sleeping, below the frozen ground.
