A bell ringing group will be visiting Foxley on Wednesday May 22nd to ring the bells from 10.30am for approximately 45 minutes.

Bawdeswell Parish Council - Update

On Monday 8th April Bawdeswell PC objected to the planning application for three new dwellings in Dereham Road. We were successful and these houses will not now be built.

One of our many objections to this development was that there is no need for additional houses in Bawdeswell given that building work has commenced on the 40 new dwellings in land off Hall Road.

Some concern has been brought to my notice that the builders have erected some fencing on the adjoining field. I am told that the builders are using the adjoining field to store 'top soil' whilst they build their houses and will then return the top soil to the gardens of the completed houses. No planning application for development on the adjoining field has been received and I am sure we would object to any such application.

The current Parish Councillors have been elected for another four years without the need for an expensive election.

Finally, our next meeting on Thursday May 9th will commence at 7pm with the Annual Parish Meeting, followed by teas, coffee and biscuits (supplied by the Chairman!) and at 7.30pm we hold our May Parish Council Meeting. All parishioners are very welcome to attend and we would be very pleased to see you.

Our speaker this month was Kate Wyatt. Kate is a very experienced nurse and has worked in both cardiology and the pain clinic. More recently she has been helping to train staff in Care Homes about a number of important issues including how to make a useful 999 call. Recognising that this was something we might all be called upon to do (if we hadn't done so already!), we invited Kate to come along.

Her talk was incredibly informative with lots of useful practical tips. She advised us to use something called SBAR to help structure the call. This is an acronym for Situation (describe the problem), Background (give any detail you know), Assessment (say what you think has happened) and Recommendation (what you would like to happen). Kate also said that it can be helpful to quickly write these details down before you make the call as it can be a very anxious time for the caller. Every one of us felt better equipped to deal with making an emergency call in the future.

The next meeting on May 13th will be a Social Evening and an opportunity to discuss the resolutions.

The Lent Course ended on the Wednesday before Easter week. We explored the Prophetic Voice of the Church and looked at stories from India where there are 30 million Christians. Despite many injustices and much poverty, the course gave examples of the good being done by the church in India.

One of the stories highlighted was a Christian school called St Hilda's at Ooty in the Nilgri Hills in South India. The school is taking part in The Green School Programme, set up by the Church of South India to inspire a new generation about the importance of safeguarding the environment.

The school is a shining example of what can be done. Rainwater is collected from the roof and stored in tanks to be used in toilets and gardening. The school kitchen uses gas generated by its own biogas plant. They eat off palm leaves or stainless steel plates, not plastic or paper. Computers and lights are rigidly switched off when not in use.

It was particularly interesting for me as I attended St Hilda's School as a boy in the days of British India.

The course ended on the subject of Hope, and that the church had something to offer in our modern secular society.


Funeral of Mary Jarvis aged 84

② WHAT'S INVOLVED?

Each month, we collate all the news, letters, posters and events information for the following month. Most of this arrives by email. Sometimes we have to take notes from a phone call. We then have to lay out and arrange all of that content to fit within the pages of the magazine. We send the magazine to print and liaise with the delivery team to make sure it gets through people's doors. There are calls, emails and enquiries that come in throughout the month that need answering. We also maintain the website thereevestale.co.uk, adding events and the archive of past magazines. Most advertisers are taken care of at the end of each year, when we get in touch with them all and rebook and invoice for the coming year. Sometimes this takes quite a lot of management. New advertisers also join throughout the year.

⑦ HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE?

In total, it probably takes around 2 days per month, but this is broken up into lots of smaller chunks of time. It generally takes around 5 hours to lay the magazine out each month. There's a greater time commitment during the time when ads are being rebooked for the coming year.

② IS IT PAID OR VOLUNTARY?

We've been running the magazine as a voluntary community project. This helps keep advertising costs low. However, the magazine would be yours. You may choose to run it as a profit-making business.

⑦ HOW IS THE MAGAZINE DESIGNED?

We currently design the magazine using professional design software called InDesign (because that's our day job). You can use another package if you prefer. The important thing is to be able to produce a file that a printer will be able to use to produce the magazine.
