Book Club

"The Beautiful Indifference" by Sarah Hall

This is such an intriguing title for this collection of short stories by Sarah Hall.

There are seven stories and each is wildly different from the last. Different characters, different places and different times.



These short stories are not just stories with fewer words or shorter plots, they are like glimpsing into a lit room as you go past on the bus, wondering 'Who lives there?, Why did they choose that wallpaper? Why did he have his hands round her neck?'. Without consciously thinking about it, you begin to create a rationale for what you've seen.

There are no real beginnings or endings. What isn't said or explained are the important bits. It's a bit like joining the dots and crossing the tees to understand what is going on. I don't mean that these stories are difficult, just intriguing. Your deliberations after each story are filled with 'So What Happened Then' or 'Where Did That Come From'. These stories are not scripts that go from A to B.

But they are definitely worth a read.

As to the title, my research suggests that it's a name given to a psychiatric condition; La Belle Indifference. Like being seemingly obsessed about something and then just not seeming to care about it. These stories all seem to have a thread of a character who is very engaged with a situation, only to then drift away. Just like someone in the last story, trying desperately to rescue a lover, only to give up and lose the will to continue.

The Book Club meets in the 'Lounge' outside the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books. We are currently reading "After the Party" by Cressida Connolly for discussion at our meeting on 7th November. Our next book will be "All the Light We Cannot See" by Anthony Doerr for discussion in December. **Enquiries:** Carolyn Good 01362 688944.


