



Anybody wishing to help in the garden or with reading - please do give us a call. You would be more than welcome.



Book Club

"Tigers in Red Weather" by Lizza Klaussmann

This first novel by Lizza Klaussmann tells the story of two cousins who have grown up spending summers together in the family holiday home on the New England coast of North America. With husbands of their own, they keep returning in the years from 1945 to 1969 to vacation with their families, seemingly repeating a yearly pattern of parties, cocktails, moonlight and jazz.



But all is not what it seems. Following the murder of a servant girl and the increasingly bizarre behaviour of Ed, Helena's only child, their world starts to dissolve.

The novel met with a mixed reception from the group who fairly universally disliked the characters. However, this generated a good deal of discussion.

"The Fish Ladder: A Journey Upstream" by Katherine Norbury

This book was listed for several awards and won the Telegraph's Best Book and the Observer's Rising Star in 2015. It follows the author trying to come to terms with grief.

Her memoire follows several of her walking journeys along rivers, from mouth to source, in different parts of England and Scotland. She writes fulsomely about the nature she encounters and intertwines her own story. Raised by loving adoptive parents she is searching for her birth parents.

The Book Club was less enamoured than the awarding bodies. Whilst it is an account of different walks it was deemed to be rambling and very self-indulgent. Her parenting skills brought lively criticism, as she describes her journeys with her 9 year old daughter with rarely more than an apple and a bar of chocolate!

Although many of the group found themselves bored with the author's hugely flowery descriptions, I can reveal that she did trace her birth mother, but instead of her fantasised re-connection with her birth mother, she was able to move on and relish the beloved relationships with her adoptive parents. Then, Dear Reader, she went home to her husband.

The Book Club meets in the 'Lounge' outside the Workhouse Bar on the first Thursday of every month at 8pm. We mostly obtain books from the library so there is not the expense of buying new books. We are currently reading "The Beautiful Indifference" by Sarah Hall for discussion at our meeting on 3rd October. 

Bawdeswell Parish Council Meeting held on 5th September

Present: B.Cunliffe (Chair), J. Mallen, A. Toomey, A Hartley-Walder and R. Read, Mrs. J Boxall (Clerk); Members of the public: 0

County Councillor B. Borrett and the Police were not in attendance, no apologies were received. Norfolk Constabulary July newsletter confirmed that speed checks had been carried out in the Bawdeswell area. District Cllr G. Bambridge was unwell and sent his apologies.

Matters Arising

Play equipment Village Hall

Generous donations from residents meant that the Parish Council could consider purchasing new play equipment for the recreation ground. The Parish Council have been looking at the options available. As no application has been received from community groups applying for grant funding, the Parish Council propose to use the recycling funds towards providing new play equipment at the recreation ground. This would mean that there was currently £3,300 available, but an anonymous donation means the Council can consider providing play equipment to the value of £10,000. HUGE THANKS! are expressed for all donations received!

A working group was set up to look at the possibilities and following discussion the Parish Council have agreed to the working group's proposal to install an activity trim trail (which will cater for all ages) and a piece of equipment specifically designed for the smaller residents! A further site visit from the play company has been requested and it is hoped that a plan/quote will be available for approval in October. It is hoped that new equipment can be installed in the spring with celebrations to follow!

Unauthorised removal of a tree in the Churchyard

Concern was expressed following the unauthorised and unnecessary removal of the May tree in the Churchyard. The incident was reported to Breckland DC who were considering prosecution. Following discussion the PC agreed that any action regarding the tree should be taken by Breckland Council but that Bawdeswell PC should make further enquiries regarding the churchyard boundary and the planting of three saplings in the boundary area.

Other matters

Joyriding/Hare coursing was reported which had led to a suggestion from the landowner to put a gate across the common lane to prevent vehicles accessing the lane. As it is a confirmed bridal way, subject to access being maintained for horses and pedestrians, the PC had no objections to a gate being installed given the circumstances.



Dear Friends,

October is the month for Harvest Festival services, which are taking place across the Heart of Norfolk Group of Churches.
