Bawdeswell Speeding and Other Issues.

During the last year, Bawdeswell Parish Council has received complaints from parishioners regarding the junction 'layout' at Hall Road with Two Fields Way following the completion of Bluebell Rise, speeding vehicles in Reepham Road and Dereham Road, and the age-old problem of the speed limit signs on the road by Bawdeswell Primary and the pre-school. All these matters are the responsibility of Highways Department at Norfolk County Council.

We have made repeated requests to Highways Dept. asking for a senior representative to visit us to discuss ways of resolving these problems. Eventually we were offered a visit to the village by Tom Cox a Highways Technician. On 10th June I met Mr. Cox with fellow Parish Councillor Andrew Toomey, who is a resident of Bluebell Rise.

We met at the Hall Road junction which before Bluebell Rise gave priority to vehicles in Hall Road. Highways changed the priority for the duration of the building of Bluebell Rise to accommodate the heavy lorry traffic required for the construction site. We were able to demonstrate to Mr. Cox that traffic coming from the direction of the Garden Centre wishing to turn right to continue along Hall Road, could not see traffic coming towards them until they were actually turning right. Whilst we were discussing the matter three local residents joined us, and so Mr. Cox was able to hear the complaints first hand. He agreed that the junction was dangerous and so hopefully we will revert to the original junction layout.

We then went to the Primary School and pointed out the anomaly of having a 30 mph speed limit for vehicles passing the pre-school and the Primary School and as soon as that hazard was past, the speed limit became 20 mph. We suggested that the 20 mph sign should be BEFORE the two schools not after. He said that it was unusual to have a 20 mph limit on a road with no houses, but agreed with us that the safety of children was paramount.

Our third location was to the outskirts of the village driving from Reepham Road to Bawdeswell Garden Centre to show the existing speed limits and to point out the speeding situation especially around the bends near the junction with The Street. We also mentioned the speeding problem in Dereham Road. We explained that we had received so many complaints for Reepham Road in particular that we would consider 'Match Funding' (cost sharing) for any suggestions for speed reduction.

Mr. Cox took copious notes throughout our meeting and we were hopeful that some action would be taken by Highways. I'm grateful to Councillor Toomey for his input and I know we put a strong case on behalf of our parishioners.

HOWEVER - HOT OFF THE PRESS.

On 16th June I received an e mail from Tom Cox who remarked that we might be disappointed in the response from Highways. That was a massive understatement.

Basically, he said Highways would take no action on the speed signs covering the Primary school and the preschool section of the road and they believed parents parking outside the school was dangerous. They added that the school should stagger their school start and finishing timings, supervised by school staff.

Highways clearly would rather blame the school and parents parking rather than simply move the 20 mph signs 200 yards further towards Foxley. Wherever parents park their cars when dropping off and collecting their children, the area would be much safer it if was the subject of a 20 mph restriction rather than a 30 mph restriction. The injuries resulting from accidents involving vehicles travelling at 30 mph are massively worse than those where vehicles were travelling at 20 mph.

I'm frankly disgusted with their response.

They continue, saying there is no money in the Highways budget to target speeding. However, they did say we could apply to share the cost of a SAM 2 portable speed indicator. This would only record the speed of vehicles passing the SAM 2 - it does not record registration numbers, so is no deterrent. In the absence of any alternatives, the Parish Council will discuss this option but we were hoping for more help and advice from Highways. They have a duty to make our roads safe, irrespective of cost.

Finally, they are still considering the junction layout at Hall Road, I suspect that they are hoping that Abel Homes will finance reverting the layout to the original. Judging by their response to us, I believe if Abel Homes do not finance the project Highways will again choose finance over road safety.

These matters are not over, the Parish Council will continue to fight to make the roads of Bawdeswell safe and to ensure other authorities carry out their duties.

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

PARFITT CLOSE, FOXLEY

When looking to name the new road at the end of The Street Foxley, the name 'Parfitt' was chosen at random from the Inscriptions on the War Memorial which stands almost opposite on the other side of the Fakenham Road. The name commemorates Daniel Walter Parfitt who died aged 20 as a result of active service in Egypt during WW1.

Daniel was the eldest of 4 sons born to Arthur and Louisa Parfitt and he worked as a market gardener on the small holding owned by his parents in Mill Road, Foxley. He enlisted into the Norfolk Regiment in October 1915 and was posted to Egypt in early 1917, sailing aboard the Troop Ship Arcadian. Within weeks he suffered a gunshot wound and was hospitalised in Alexandria. He rejoined his unit in June and continued on active service until November when he became ill with diphtheria. As in other countries at that time, the conditions endured by the troops were unimaginable. Disease was rife, exacerbated by the dreadful conditions and heat in the rat infested desert trenches.

It was a terrible time for Daniel's family. Initially they received a telegram notifying them that he was 'seriously ill' with diphtheria but must have been overjoyed when a few days later they were informed that he was 'out of danger'. Their happiness was short-lived however, when 2 weeks later the telegram arrived giving them the dreadful news of his death.

Daniel died alone in an isolation ward of a Field Casualty Station on 26th November 1917 and is buried in the Kantara War Memorial Cemetery near Cairo. Now thankfully, he will always be proudly remembered in his home town of Foxley.

Summary of Foxley Parish Council Meetings: Monday 28th May 2021 at 7:30 pm in Foxley Village Hall

Present: N. Mears (NM), M Watson (MW), G Blyth (GB), Mrs L Rose (clerk). Apologies for Absence were received from Gordon Bambridge and Helen Hemingray. 0 residents attended

Nicholas Mears was re-elected as chairperson and Mark Watson as vice-chairperson. Giles Blatchford was co-opted to position of councillor, a position which had been vacant for some time.

The minutes of the previous Annual Parish Council Meeting, Annual Parish Meeting and Parish Council Meeting were accepted and signed.

Nicholas Mears gave the Chairman's report, Linda Rose gave the clerk's financial report and a report from the Village Hall Committee. All reports were dominated by the restrictions caused by the pandemic but despite this both the Village Hall and the Parish Council finances are in a very healthy state.

Planning applications

Demolition of 3 existing outbuildings and Erection of one single storey Office and Storage Building at Cyncoed, Mill Road NR20 4QU 3PL/2021/0140/HOU :Undecided

Councillors had no objections to the application, with one considering that we should be supporting the development of a small business and employment within the village. However, one was concerned that this could develop into a much larger business for which Mill Road is not suitable.

Proposed demolition of existing dwelling at Two Cottages, The Street and erection of pair of semi-detached dwellings 3PL/2021/0382/F: Undecided

None of the councillors have any objections to the plans for Two Cottages, although the windows do appear to be 'over-fussy' and not in keeping with the simpler design of the majority of the surrounding properties. However, there does appear to be some boundary issues with 'Two Cottages' and 'The Old Stores' to the rear and west of Two Cottages.

Foxley continued:

Finances

The annual accounts for 2020 - 21 were all accepted and signed and are available on the Foxley Parish Council website. The summary of accounts for the period from 10^{th} March 2021 to 23^{rd} May 2021 were accepted.

Cheques were signed for insurance, NALC, NPTS and Reeves Tale, St Thomas's Church for maintenance of the churchyard, clerk's salary and for the internal audit fee. However, concern was expressed at the large rise in insurance costs.

AOB

MW proposed that measures should be taken to improve the state of the **lay-by on the West side of the A1067** which is regularly used for fly-tipping. Action: clerk to investigate the present state of the lay-by and then to contact Matthew Skinner, the field owner, Gordon Bambridge and Breckland to propose a meeting at the site with a view to a) placing CCTV, or at least a sign b) thinning the trees on the main road to make tippers more visible and/or c) erecting a fence along the ditch in the gap between the shrubs to stop rubbish being thrown into the field. Hopefully these measures would deter the fly tippers.


The clerk informed the council of the local initiative to **reclaim Fox and Hounds Lane** for walkers and horse riders. At present this lane, which forms the boundary between Foxley and Themelthorpe, is closed by the council as it is has become impassable to walkers, most vehicles and horses. The campaign involves repairing the surface of the lane and reclassifying it as a footpath and erecting barriers to exclude the off-road vehicles which are doing so much damage to it. MW proposed a contribution of to the campaign and this will be added for payment at the next meeting.

Clerk reported on the progress with 'dog bins' given the increasing problem with dog fouling in village. The ownership of the verge by the Fishing lakes and outside Church Farm on Chapel Rd are holding up proceedings at present.

Residents have expressed concern at the speed of traffic along the A1067: clerk to contact Paula Gilluley our local police representative to request a speed check by police.
