

Our July Book Choice: "Signs preceding the end of the world" by Yuri Herrera

This took us to a very different place. Definitely Another World. A Frightening World. The book has been translated by Lisa Dillman into English, but her use of words catapults us into a very alien place.

We can recognise the words, but do they have the same meanings? The story follows Makina as she crosses the Mexico-US border in an attempt to find her brother. MEETING OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON THURSDAY 7th JULY 2022 AT 7.00pm

Present: J. Mallen (Chair), A. Hartley-Walder, A. Toomey, J. Lilwall, D. Coles, K. Ewing and R. Reed. Mrs. J Boxall (Clerk) County Councillor Bill Borrett & District Councillor Gordon Bambridge. Members of the public – 3

Village Hall roof considerations

Cllr Lilwall confirmed that the work to repair the Village Hall roof was due to go to tender Friday (8th July). It was hoped to bring the Village Hall Trustee's recommendations back to the Parish Council for endorsement. Thanks to those residents who attended the open meeting on 21st June.

Speeding

The Council agreed to apply for Parish Partnership funding (50%) for Speed Awareness Monitoring / Warning devices and Village Gates, at a total cost of £11554. Locations for the units have been approved by Highways and if successful the units / village gate could be installed in spring 2023. CC Bill Borrett confirmed that a grant of £1000 was available to the Parish Council.

HGV's on Reepham Road

Highways confirmed that the B1145 was a main distributor route, with the role of distributing all types of traffic, and therefore not intended as a through route. It was acknowledged that the route is not promoted as a through route (only signposted to Bawdeswell and Reepham) and that there was sufficient advisory signage. Following discussion, it was agreed that Cllr Coles would carry out a more focused traffic survey (with support from Cawston Parish Council), documenting companies using the road as a cut through and writing to them highlighting the option of using another route.

Overgrown hedges / Trees causing obstruction

Following last month's plea to Homeowners, it was agreed that a letter would be delivered to offending properties highlighting the issue of overgrown trees & hedges, asking residents to contact the Council if they have any issues carrying out the work.

20MPH limit outside School

Highways confirmed that although the Norfolk Speed Management Strategy had the aspiration that all speed limits outside Norfolk Schools be 20MPH, there was currently no funding for this especially as there is no record of any accidents outside the Primary school. The Council agreed to find out the cost to change the speed limit and also the cost for part-time 20mph signs with flashing warning lights, to go outside the school (which could be purchased as part of the Parish Partnership Scheme). It was agreed to engage with the Primary School on the matter.

Windfarm

The Council have sent letters confirming their support for an offshore transmission network (ring main). It was agreed to ensure that discussion at Council meetings was focused on the aspects of the windfarm development directly affecting Bawdeswell residents such as the potential increased amount of HGVs / construction traffic accessing development sites via Bawdeswell. It was acknowledged that it was important not to make assumptions and to fully understand the issues before taking further action.

Other matters

Following the annual play inspection report, the sandpit has been removed following health and safety concerns. Further work would be carried out over the summer.

A schedule of the maintenance required for the green open spaces would be compiled and brought back to the next meeting for future consideration.

Finance

The balance of the Community account as at 30th June 2022 was confirmed as ± 22209.27 , Business Money Manager was ± 36144.89 after ± 1.53 interest had been received. Recycling credits of ± 336.52 have been confirmed, this money is set aside for local grants. Grants totalling ± 1000 have been paid to BEG towards the jubilee celebrations (± 500) and to The Reeves Tale for a community laptop (± 500).

The next Parish Council Meeting will be held on Thursday 1st September at 7.00pm. This meeting will be held at the Village Hall. Members of the public are warmly invited to attend. The Council usually meet on the first Thursday of every month except for January & August. Please check the website or noticeboard for any changes.

Bawdeswell Traffic Issues -- an update

Following the update provided in the last edition of The Reeve's Tale, we are pleased to confirm that at the July meeting of the Parish Council it was agreed that a funding application for the latest generation of speed monitoring equipment together with the installation of village gates would be submitted to Norfolk County Council.

Two of these SAM2 devices will be acquired under this application. This equipment has the advantage of recording all speeds and times of vehicles going past the devices which can then be downloaded and analysed and this data used to pursue with the police for corrective action to be taken. The devices are portable and will be moved every month –the 4 locations chosen for the fixing posts for the devices are:

1/ the downward section of the B1145 Norwich Road -opposite the gate to the Commonwealth War Graves,

2/ on a grass verge on Reepham Road to monitor traffic down to the entrance of the village hall and up to the village green,

3/ on The Street past the primary school,

4/ on the B1145 Dereham Road.

Norfolk County Council's decision on our funding application is expected to be made in March 2023 and as soon as we receive confirmation this has been approved, we will start the process to procure the equipment.

The location agreed with Highways for the installation of the village gates is either side of the road outside the Garden Centre.

Councillor Coles has now received written confirmation from Highways regarding the status of the B1145 as far as HGVs/long vehicles is concerned. As expected, this confirms that the intention is that this should be used to access Bawdeswell, Reepham and Cawston and not to be used as a through route to other outlying destinations. Highways has attempted to promote this by only referring to these destinations on signage leading onto the B1145. Councillor Coles has discussed this with his counterparts in Reepham and Cawston Parish Council and are now planning a joint traffic census of HGV/long vehicles to see the extent this is being adhered to and then consider what further action to take.

A further update will be provided in a future edition of The Reeve's Tale.

In the meantime, do enjoy the last of the summer and find rest just as Jesus did when he slept in a boat during a storm.
