Bawdeswell traffic issues -an update

Following on from my article in the last month's edition of The Reeve's Tale, I wanted to update you with developments on these important issues for our village.

Wind farm cabling projects –Vattenfall and Hornsea

Following the November parish council meeting, the Parish Clerk has written to me to confirm that "the council will be registering their interest with Equinor and all wind farm companies to ensure that information is received for consideration by the Parish Council". Whilst this reassurance is welcome for Equinor (who are entering a period of public consultation regarding their plans for the Sheringham Shoal and Dudgeon wind farm extension projects), it is inadequate for Vattenfall and Hornsea 3. As mentioned in my last update, these developers have been given the green light by the Government (granting of Development Consent Orders) to transmit power from offshore wind farms by way of cabling corridors through parts of Norfolk. This will mean road closures and increased traffic through our village particularly on the B1145 on the Reepham/Norwich Road.

Vattenfall have confirmed "any closures and increased traffic to be occurring towards the end of Q1/ start of Q2 next year" They also said that Hornsea 3 was ahead of this schedule. Whilst this timescale is not fixed and is subject to change, there is now an urgency to meet with these developers so we can discuss their Construction Traffic Management Plan, the site of the sub stations as they pass around our village and the timetable for the excavation activity. We then must seek to mitigate and reduce the impact as much as we can on our community. Through long and pain staking negotiations this has been successfully achieved by Cawston PC with substantial reductions both in the number of HGVs and the length of the working day for the construction work against the developers' original plans.

Before I left the Council I had arranged the first exploratory meeting with Hornsea 3 for mid October and it was disappointing to learn that the Parish Council cancelled this meeting. I have been consistently urging the Parish Council to be more pro-active and meet with these 2 developers. In view of their latest confirmation in the first paragraph above, former councillor Ewing and myself have now written to these developers asking them to meet us to discuss these issues. I have confirmed to them that information obtained will be shared with the Parish Council and, more importantly, with you the residents. I have invited the Parish Chairman to join us at these meetings although at the time of writing this update I have not received a reply. I do, again, urge the Parish Council to support the work on this vital project for Bawdeswell and its residents.

Other HGV traffic through the village

Following my last update regarding a proposed HGV traffic census during early November, my colleague at Cawston PC has confirmed that due to his workload, particularly with the wind farm developer meetings, he would not have the resources to conduct the census on the dates suggested. However, both Cawston and Reepham feel it is important to reduce HGV traffic on the B1145 where it is being used unnecessarily as a cut through. They have agreed to pick this up again in the new year, and I will be working with them on this project. Again I would encourage Bawdeswell PC to support this work.

Our October choice:

"The Prime of Miss Jean Brodie" by Muriel Spark

We went back to a 'classic' last month. The title is well known; written in 1961 and filmed in 1969, starring Maggie Smith. We were surprised that few of us had actually read the original book. And those who had read it before said how different it seemed with older eyes and more life experience.

The story follows the lives of six girls who are known as the "Brodie Set" because they are tutored by their influential teacher, Miss Brodie who we learn is in her Prime.

She believes in an education that is 'enlightening' rather than teaching facts or following a curriculum of study. Instead, she tells her girls about art, ballet, her loves and politics. She is a classicist who looks down on science subjects, with an admiration for Mussolini and sympathy for Franco. This is dangerous stuff for the 1930s. Whilst Miss Brodie is influential she is also manipulative and in the early pages of the book we're told she has been betrayed and in later life she continually seeks to identify her betrayer.

The story is not straightforward. It moves between different timeframes without warning. This is a very slim book, but not a quick read; you have to keep your wits about you.

For those who'd read the book in their youth, things are far more ambiguous. The manipulation of the young girls seemed far darker than when those who'd first read it.

Windfarm Development

Following discussion the Council agreed it would take no further action at the present time with regards to the pylons (East Anglia Green) unless there is a change in plans which affects Bawdeswell and the area more directly.

As details of the scheme are unknown, it was agreed that the Council would register as an interested party for Equinor's SEP/DEP.

Cllr Toomey volunteered to attend meetings as required and advise the Parish Council / seek approval on any further action necessary with regards to the windfarm projects. It was agreed that the Clerk would ensure that all correspondence received from windfarm companies was circulated to all Councillors for consideration and ensure that the Parish Council are registered for updates.

It was agreed that due to the change in Councillors, future meetings regarding the windfarms will need to be deferred until new Councillors can be recruited.

HGV traffic

Following discussion it was agreed that as a HGV traffic survey had recently been carried out and that had highlighted a less than expected number of HGVs on the Reepham Road, another survey be postponed until Spring 2023 and carried out as necessary in light of other matters e.g. windfarm construction traffic.



A little over 2,000 years ago, a couple had a baby boy. The mother was young and they weren't married when she fell pregnant. They also had to walk around 70 miles to register in a census, just as the baby was due, so all-in-all it had been a difficult time leading up to the birth.

A lot of claims were made about the baby and some really weird things happened around the time he was born – a new star appeared in the sky and angels were seen flying around. People were saying that this child was destined to become a king and that really upset the actual King! So much so that he ordered his soldiers to kill every male child under the age of two.

The family got wind of this (angels again) and took flight. They got out just in time and travelled hundreds of miles. They couldn't speak the language of their new country, so it would have been difficult to get work. After a couple of years, the old King died and the family were able to return home.

After their ordeal, things settled down and the boy grew strong. They say he was a quick learner with a charming personality.

They, too, arrive in countries where they can't speak the language; where customs and even food are unfamiliar.

As we are drawn towards Christmas and the great celebration of Christ's birth, let's spare a thought for our brothers and sisters who are suffering; for all those who are struggling to put food on the table or find somewhere safe to sleep.
