

What a difference a month makes; last month we read what I described as "a quiet book; this month's choice was anything but.....

The book cover shows a quote describing the book as 'a psychological thriller', and it certainly lives up to that description. This is very much a 'page-turner', until it becomes almost too frightening to contemplate turning the page.

There are two family groups each with a child. The story is presented through short intense chapters.

What starts as a frightening possibility, a mistaken swop of their babies in a neonatal hospital ward, spirals into in an increasing nightmare. Seemingly innocent actions lead towards devastating consequences.

I must confess that some of us (me included), couldn't bear some of the suspense, to such an extent that we had to 'sneak a peek' at the end page to make sure that our heartbeats could sustain reading the remaining chapters.

We all agreed it was a well plotted story and a compelling read!

MEETING OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON WEDNESDAY 1st JUNE 2022 AT 7.00pm

Present: J. Mallen (Chair), A. Toomey, J. Lilwall, D. Coles, K. Ewing and R. Reed. Mrs. J Boxall (Clerk), Members of the public – 4

Village Hall roof considerations

Cllr Lilwall gave an update on the situation and confirmed that the Village Hall Trustees were looking to put £10000 of reserves into the roof fund, set up a crowd funding initiative and look for any grant opportunities to reduce the liability. It was confirmed there was a need to go to tender to understand the full cost; therefore the Village Hall Trustees were asking the Parish Council to support this by agreeing in principle to borrowings of up to a maximum of £75000. The Trustees confirmed that a sub-committee will be looking to come back to the Parish Council with recommendations, and would look at what terms the loan could be repaid without jeopardising the running of the hall. An open public meeting has been arranged for 21st June to inform residents on the situation and consult on the plans for funding the repairs and carrying out the work. The Council agreed in principle to approach the Public Works Loan Board for a loan of up to £75000 to support the Village Hall roof repairs.

Speeding / HGV's on Reepham Road

Cllr Coles circulated reports on his meetings with Dereham Police Beat Manager, Highway Engineer and Westcotec Manager. A summary of conclusions was presented to Council.

Cllr Coles kindly agreed to formulate a proposal for the purchase of Speed Awareness Monitoring units / Parish Partnership Funding application for approval at the July meeting. (If successful the Parish Partnership funding would meet 50% of the costs of the scheme). County Councillor Bill Borrett to be approached for any additional funding.

Windfarm

Cllr Coles gave a report following the Vattenfall Community Benefit Fund meeting. A report was circulated for consideration.

As 1000 HGVs per week anticipated on B1145 as a result of the work to install the cables, and concern was expressed about the impact the onshore cabling would have on the landscape, the Parish Council agreed they should actively participate in the opposition of the onshore cabling and write to various bodies as recommended by the Norfolk Parish Movement for an OTN.District ClIr Bambridge confirmed that no electricity generated from this scheme was going to be available in Norfolk despite there being a need and it was agreed to include this point in any letters sent.

Bawdeswell traffic issues -an update

Following the update provided in the last edition of The Reeve's Tale, Councillor Coles met with our Highways Engineer, the Dereham Beat Police Manager and the Technology Manager for the preferred supplier of speed monitoring equipment to the Highways Agency. The outcome of these meetings was presented by him to the Parish Council meeting on 1st June and the following is a summary of the outcome of these meetings and the next steps;

- Councillor Coles will have a further discussion with our Highways Engineer to firm up on our requirements for the advanced speed monitoring equipment part of this will be to agree the locations for the fixing posts as the cameras will need to be re-sited every 4 weeks. The 2 cameras can therefore monitor traffic across a number of locations in the village. The aim is that this will not be confined to the B1145 from Norwich Road to Reepham Road but could include the B1145 Dereham Road and The Street. The cameras can easily be reset to cover speeds from 20-40mph, and we will be able to download the data of speeding motorists for each location. As the Highways agency will be part funding the equipment, we have to agree the locations for the cameras with them.
- The Highways Engineer suggested we have village gates installed and that the ideal spot
 would be either side of the road outside the Garden Centre. This will also be covered by
 the partnership funding agreement with Highways and Councillor Coles will firm up the
 costs for this and the speed monitoring equipment and present this at the council
 meeting on 7th July in order that a formal funding application can be considered.
- During the visit by the Highways Engineer the existing 30 mph signage on the B1145 was
 examined. The number of these are in line with Highways regulations although some are
 faded and could be replaced by the new reflective signage. However, a number of the
 signs are partly or wholly obscured by hedges/tree branches and, in addition, some
 hedges are overhanging the boundary line of properties and obstructing pavements or
 footpaths.
- Norfolk County Council has a duty under the Highways Act 1980 to ensure that footpaths, pavements and road signs are not obstructed where they can pose a hazard to people who are disabled, visually impaired, wheelchair users and people pushing a pram or buggy. It is a requirement that anything overhanging a footpath must be at least 2.3 metres above the footway, cycleway, verge and 5.3 metres above the road surface. Could you please check if you have any vegetation fronting roads or pavements that does not meet this requirement and, if so, to cut them back to the boundary line. Understandably, Highways will not replace faded road signs if they are obscured in this way.
- As far as the data from the census on speeding infringements was concerned, the
 Dereham Beat Police Manager was sympathetic and during his visit (in plain clothes!) he
 saw for himself the number of motorists speeding past the 30mph warning equipment.
 He agreed that when we have the new speed monitoring equipment that enables us to
 download this data, they would attend our council meetings to discuss and agree ways
 to tackle this. In the meantime, they would add our village to those where they carry out
 random speed camera checks.



Church Letter

What a glorious start to June we had, with the Queen's Platinum Jubilee events and two weddings in our parishes. So much to celebrate and enjoy. We might ask 'how do you follow that?' Picnics with ma'amalade sandwiches, perhaps?

In our churches, we follow it with more weddings in July and August – I always get that tingle of excitement as I stand on the pavement waiting for the bride to arrive. That moment, when she pledges, as did our beloved Queen, to give her whole life to another. The only - and significant - difference is that the groom also makes this pledge, so that the couple begin married life with this balance of commitment to one-another.

Thinking of the wedding rings, there's a sense of eternity, as the band has no beginning and no end. A life-long commitment, which will go beyond the bounds of time. There's a point in the wedding ceremony when the priest pronounces the couple 'husband and wife' and wraps his/her stole around their hands to 'tie the knot': "Those whom God has joined together let no one put asunder".

I think that one thing that the Platinum Jubilee celebrations taught us is that we all do better when we work together; when we look beyond our own boundaries and think about how we can each contribute our 'bit' to make our communities work. I see this all the time in our villages: from cake-baking to giving lifts; from phoning someone who is on their own or popping in for a cup of tea.

I was in North Elmham School last month, leading an Assembly on "The Marvellous Picnic", or the Feeding of the 5,000, as some of us will know it. Not ma'malade sandwiches, but a couple of fish and five loaves of bread (John 6:1-14). At the end of a long day, listening to Jesus' teaching, the people were tired and hungry. The packed-lunch of a small boy was transformed by God's blessing to provide a picnic to fill everyone's bellies.

In this time of fuel-poverty and the struggle to put food on the table for some, please support our Food-Banks and initiatives such as the Church Larder at St Mary's North Elmham. Thank you.
