





Update from the Bawdeswell Heath Trustees

The Trustees have been talking to the Norfolk Wildlife Trust about whether they would be willing to take over Bawdeswell Heath. For many years the NWT have provided expert advice on the management of the woods and heather areas. The discussions are taking place recognizing that the Heath is of great importance to the local community and needs to be maintained and improved to keep this valuable resource for the next generations.

NWT has significant expertise as well as resources (both financial and manpower) and recognizes the potential for improving access, initiating more learning events for local schools and upgrading facilities. It would be an absolute condition of any transfer that access to walkers and their dogs remains free at all times.

The Trustees have recognized that obtaining grant funding for such a small area is increasingly difficult and the current volunteers and Trustees are difficult to replace. No commitment has been made at this stage and it will be important to have discussions with the Parish Council as well but it seemed important to let the village and surrounding interested parties know the direction of travel. If you have any questions do feel free to talk to any of the Trustees

Our May Book Choice: "Redhead by the Side of the Road" by Anne Tyler

This is a 'quiet' book. You could say that nothing happens. However Anne Tyler writes in such a way that our group was really involved in the minutiae of the characters' lives, especially in how Micah interacts with the other characters.

Within the first few pages Anne Tyler almost dismisses Micah, he seems so predictable and 'ordered'. We learn that Micah is in his 40s, and has created a 'suitable' life for himself, a direct opposite to his siblings' chaotic family lives. He moonlights as a caretaker, runs a home computer repair business, and has a relationship with Cass, his woman-friend (well, he couldn't call a 'woman in her late 30s' a girl friend). In fact, although it might be a bit boring, he's ok.

Two events shake him out of this, though.

A young man turns up on his doorstep wondering if Micah might be his father and Cass fears that she might be evicted from her apartment because she's adopted a cat, or rather a cat has adopted her.

Much of our discussion was about filling in the gaps. Why did he do that? Why did he say that? Why didn't he....? He could have.... Would she?

Only about 170 pages and it took us over an hour to talk about it.... a sign of a good book.

Bell Ringing at Foxley Church


Bell Ringing at Foxley Church

I thought you might be interested in this picture which hangs in the tower at St Thomas' Church, Foxley. The picture shows that the Foxley bells were restored in 2013 by John Taylor & Co of Loughborough who are still in existence making and restoring church bells today. The picture also gives the dates of the bells. Whilst they are not the oldest bells in existence, the bells date from 1751 which makes them 271 years old.

Thomas Gardiner was the bell founder, who was in Sudbury from 1709 to 1762 and also at the Brocandale foundry in Norwich from 1727 to 1747. He died in 1769 which would have made him a very old man, making bells for over 50 years. He is thought to have cast well over 259 bells, all bar one of which, are in East Anglia. His foundry in Norwich was purchased from Thomas Newman, son of Charles Newman. (Colne-Stour website, 2022).

History aside, we are keen to maintain our bell ringing tradition, so get in touch with me if you'd like to have a go. We now ring on the 1^{st} & 3^{rd} Sundays from 3.30 to 5pm at Foxley Church.

MEETING OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON THURSDAY 5th MAY 2022 AT 7.30pm

Present: J. Mallen (Chair), A. Toomey, J. Lilwall, D. Coles, A Hartley-Walder, K. Ewing, R. Reed, Mrs. J Boxall (Clerk), Members of the public – 4
The Chairman gave a report at the Annual Parish Meeting (held on the same evening). A copy of the report can be viewed on the Parish Council website (under minutes).

Election of Chair & Vice - Chair

Cllr John Mallen was reappointed as Chair and Cllr Anni Hartley-Walder was reappointed as Vice Chair.

Village Hall roof considerations

Cllr Lilwall reported to the Council as a representative of the Village Hall Committee that an initial rough estimate has been received for repairs to the Village Hall roof of £55000 + VAT. Initial enquiries suggest that it would not be possible to reclaim the VAT from the works. The Village Hall are unable to go to tender on quotes without securing funding and were seeking support from the Parish Council for funding. It was confirmed that as a worst-case scenario the Trustees would be looking for a loan (Public Works Loan Board) of £75000 to be repaid by the trustees from income. The Trustees are going to look for grants but are highly unlikely to be successful and have yet to agree what amount can be put forward from reserves. The Council agreed to table this as a formal agenda item for consideration at the June meeting.

Speeding / HGV's on Reepham Road

Cllr Coles gave an update on the traffic survey and circulated a report for consideration (A summary is attached to the minutes on the website). It was acknowledged from the results that there was an issue with speeding. It was agreed to endorse further action as suggested in the report. To Cllr Coles and all the volunteers who carried out the census, THANK YOU!

Other matters

It was confirmed that the Village sign will be restored and back in position by the Queens Jubilee. Councillor Coles with the help of fellow Councillors will be carrying out the work to replace the flower bed surrounds (using oak sleepers) on the Village Green. A contractor has been asked to carry out repairs to the walkway at Adam Pit. Driveway repairs have been carried out at the Village Hall.

Meeting of FOXLEY Annual Parish Council Meeting, Annual Parish Meeting and Parish Council Meeting held on Thursday 12th May 2022 at 7:30 pm in Foxley Village Hall

Present: N. Mears (NM), M Watson (MW), G Blyth (GB), G Blatchford (GWB), Mrs L Rose (clerk). Members of the public: 3

Annual Parish Council Meeting:

Nicky Mears was unanimously re-elected as Chairman.

The Chairman's report, Clerk's financial report and a report from the secretary of Foxley Village Hall were read.

Annual Parish Meeting:

Andy Wells spoke passionately about the airmen killed in Foxley during World War 2. The councillors were happy to pursue the erection of an extra memorial to the airmen to be placed near the present war memorial in Foxley.

Kym asked if she could put a new bench in the village in memory of her daughter, Stacey. It was decided to replace the bench in Chapel Road East.

Foxley Parish Council Meeting

The minutes of the meeting held on 10th February 2022 and the informal meeting held on 31st March 2022 were approved. After the March meeting the clerk contacted Sanders Coaches. The pick-up point for pupils is now the bus stop at the Chapel Rd crossing. Sanders are happy with this arrangement and the **old bus shelter** can therefore be demolished and removed.

Planning applications

Two Cottages, The Street, NR20 4QP. Replacement dwelling 3PL/2021/1542/F No decision

Erection of Agricultural dwelling Old Fakenham Rd 3AG/2022/0007/AG This was discussed, in principle the council had no objections but it was queried as to whether the building would have drying equipment which could prove noisy for nearby residents.

Update on **Litter and Dog Bins**. These are installed and being well used. It was queried whether more bins were needed in other locations in the village.

Finance: The Summary of Accounts for the period from 10^{th} February 2022 to 11^{th} May 2022 were approved and cheques signed. The Annual Accounts for 2021-22 were approved and signed.

Request for additional **funding** for the **Reeves Tale**. This was agreed in principle. Clerk to discuss amount with Bawdeswell Parish Council.

B1145 Traffic Census Bawdeswell - an update

With the help of a small band of volunteers the census went ahead on 29th April. We covered the period from 6.00am to 6.00pm and monitored the traffic going up the B1145 from A1067 into Norwich Road and Reepham Road. Also, down the B1145 from Reepham Road to Norwich Road. All the data relates to 29th April except 11.00am to 1.00pm which used data captured on Friday 22nd April as part of the trial of the census form. This data matches that obtained one week later.

Summary of data gathered.

- a similar number of vehicles travelled up the B1145 as travelled down.
- nearly 500 vehicles exceeded the speed limit on the up section of the road-triggering the 30mph speed warning sign.
- from observing the speed of vehicles travelling down the road, where there is no speed warning
 equipment, this was similar and therefore there was likely to be around 1000 speeding
 infringements over the course of these 12 hours.
- the number of HGV's using the road was lighter than expected at around 20 in each direction.
- whilst limited data is available on the throughput of HGV's from Bawdeswell to Reepham and vice versa -there was some evidence of this both with agricultural vehicles and HGV's.
- both motor cycle and agricultural traffic was light over the 12-hour monitoring period.
- there was evidence of speeding from some of our residents using the B1145.

It was agreed that Councillor Coles would take the following steps and report back at the next Parish Council meeting on 1st June in order that the council can discuss and agree the action to take to improve the traffic issues through the village.

Next steps

- meet with our Highway Engineer on site to run through the data with him and walk the road
 from the Garden Centre to the Bawdeswell pavement boundary to give him a better
 appreciation of the issues we face.
- make a case for improved and more 30mph signage in both directions of the road.
- make the case for more up to date speed warning equipment on each side of the B1145 between Norwich Road and Reepham Road -this to display the speed of each vehicle and have a data download facility so we can measure changes to speeding infringements over time.
- Discuss the possibility of improved signage on A1067 and feeder roads to show that HGV's
 restrictions are in place at Reepham and HGV's using the B1145 should access only with through
 HGV traffic following major routes.
- meet with technology partner to discuss options, costs and timescales for enhanced speed warning equipment.
- meet with our police contact on site to run through speeding data and walk the road from Garden Centre to Bawdeswell pavement boundary. Make case for covert speed monitoring equipment to confirm data from these results and for mobile speed camera vans at intervals to act as a visible deterrent.
- to meet with the Police and Crime Commissioner who has made getting tough on speeding motorists and improving road safety a key priority in the new policing plan.

We are sure that residents will understand that the Police may be less sympathetic to our case for action if they see that some of our own residents are contributing to the problem by speeding through the village. It is worth remembering that a pedestrian hit by a vehicle travelling at 30mph has a 1in 5 risk of being killed, this increases to 1in 2 at 35mph whilst 9 in 10 will be killed at 40mph.



CHURCH NEWS

Church Letter

By the time this edition reaches you the celebrations for The Queen's Platinum Jubilee will be in full swing. THANK YOU to all those in our communities who have planned these and worked so hard to bring them to fruition. I have sensed a very happy atmosphere and a willingness to engage. After such a long period of covid restrictions it is so good to simply be together and to join in the celebrations.

We have in our Monarch an outstanding example of service. Most of us will not have known any other Head of State and comparisons can only be made with those (mainly elected) of other countries. By any account we have been extraordinarily well served by The Queen.

At her coronation the Queen made a solemn vow to serve for the whole of her life, however long or short and amid all the panoply of monarchy this theme of quiet, dignified service has been evident in all that she has done. I hope that this extended weekend of celebration will be a precursor of a great summer we can once again enjoy to the full.
