The Trust was formed with the proceeds of the sale of The Hunstanton Convalescent Home which was founded in 1872. The capital from the sale of the Convalescent Home is invested by the charity commissioners and the interest from this capital is administered by the trustees of the Convalescent Trust.

The money is used to help people on a low income who are physically or mentally unwell and in need of a convalescent or recuperative holiday. It can also be used to help their carers. The money can sometimes be used to provide other items, services or facilities which are calculated to alleviate the suffering or help the recovery of such people.

Preference is given to people who live in Norfolk or Cambridgeshire.

Our March Book Choice: "Eleanor Oliphant is Completely Fine" by Gail Honeyman

This is a debut novel, and what a debut! It was published in 2017, immediately winning the 2017 Costa Debut Novel Award. Since then, it has won other awards and sold over 2.5 million copies.

Eleanor is a young woman who lives a very simple and very timetabled-life. She knows exactly what she will eat, drink, and do on every day, because it will be the same as every other day in her past. And there is a lot of 'past'. However, one single act of kindness begins to help her unravel her life and her choices. Eleanor makes some very funny observations about life as she sees it, as well as giving us some sad and haunting sentences: "Time only blunts the pain of loss. It doesn't erase it."

#### **PARISH COUNCILS**

MEETING OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON THURSDAY 7th APRIL 2022 AT 7.00pm

Present: J. Mallen (Chair), A. Toomey, D. Coles, A Hartley-Walder, K. Ewing and R. Reed. Mrs. J Boxall (Clerk), Members of the public – 1

Planning applications -

3OB/2022/0007/OB - Application to discharge the planning obligation on 3PL/2018/0993/F - To confirm that the Open Space has been transferred to the Nominated Body together with the associated commuted sum. At Land off Hall Road Bawdeswell — An email was sent to Breckland confirming the transfer was complete and the commuted sum was received. This was subsequently APPROVED

Other matters – Adams Pit - A small piece of board needs replacing. Highways were suspected to have felled trees and whilst this was not aesthetically pleasing, it was acknowledged that this has opened the area up.

**Public Open Space** - Concern was expressed by a resident affected by ball games being played on the public open space. Whilst the Council sympathised with the issues, it was acknowledged that it was necessary to encourage children to get out of the house and exercise. As the land is designated as an open public space it would not be appropriate to restrict its use. The Council agreed to consider planting additional trees at the end of play area, in the hope of providing some screening.

**HGV's on Reepham Road** - Although it was acknowledged that the volume of HGV traffic seems to have reduced over the past few weeks, it was agreed that there was still concern over the level of HGV traffic in general on the Reepham Road. Cllr Coles circulated a report via email updating the Council and recommending that a traffic survey be carried out to evidence the issue. Following discussion with Reepham Town Council it was hoped that they would recruit volunteers for the Reepham end of B1145 traffic survey. The Council agreed for Councillor Coles to arrange for the traffic survey to be carried out subject to an appropriate risk assessment being in place and confirmation that the data collection meets data protection requirements. It is hoped that the results of the survey would be available for consideration at the May meeting.

#### **Finance**

The balance of the Community account as at 31st March 2022 was confirmed as £43,123.96, Business Money Manager was £8899.18. The Project Bawdeswell account has been closed. £2258.86 in the business money manager account will go into earmarked reserves for the play area. The balance of general reserves was therefore confirmed as £15881.27.

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Thursday May 5<sup>th</sup> at 7.00pm with the Annual Parish Council Meeting at 7.30pm. These meetings will be held at the Village Hall. Members of the public are warmly invited to attend. The Council usually meet on the first Thursday of every month except for January & August.

#### PARISH COUNCILS

Minutes of an informal meeting of FOXLEY PARISH COUNCIL on THURSDAY 31st March 2022 at 7:30 pm in Foxley Village Hall

Present: Nicky Mears, chair, (NM) Mark Watson, (MW), Gillian Blyth (GJB), Giles Blatchford (GWB), L Rose (Parish Clerk). Residents: 3 had sent emails to the clerk prior to the meeting with their views and 4 attended the meeting. It was particularly helpful to have a young man who travelled on the school bus and he was able to provide very useful information.



An informal meeting of Foxley Parish Council was held to discuss the future of the old wooden bus shelter, which had been blown upside down during storm Eunice. Prior to that concern had been expressed about the state of repair of that bus shelter.

Several options were discussed as it could be:

- Righted and repaired
- Replaced with a new shelter on that site
- Removed and not replaced

Councillors and members of the public at the meeting had differing views about what should happen to the shelter.

Councillors were unanimous that pupils should not have to cross the busy A1067 to catch the bus but it was felt that the pick-up/drop-off point at the grass triangle was far from ideal. The clerk had contacted Sanders about this as the school bus is gouging out a hole in the verge as most drivers find it difficult to turn a large bus around that grass triangle when returning pupils. The bus also either blocks The Street or makes it hard for cars see when trying to turn onto the A1067 at the morning pick up time.

It was decided to contact Sanders Coaches, who do the school run to Reepham, about the possibility of changing the pick-up/drop-off point in Foxley East to the service bus shelter at the point where Chapel Rd crosses the A1067. There were thought to be several advantages to this although it will require the agreement of Sanders Coaches. The clerk has contacted them and we are now waiting to hear from them in this matter.

Foxley Parish Council's next meeting will be on Thursday, 12<sup>th</sup> May 2022 at 7:30 pm in Foxley Village Hall. This will include the Annual Parish Meeting and Annual Parish Council Meeting as well as May's Parish Council Meeting. All welcome. It is a time to review what has happened over the last year as well as saying if there is anything you would like to happen in the future.


