Bawdeswell traffic issues -an update

As I have tried to keep you updated with developments in our village over past issues, I thought I should let you know the latest news. The first point is a change to my status as I have decided to resign from Bawdeswell Parish Council. My commitment to supporting key issues affecting our village remains undiminished, however, and I have let the Chairman know I am ready and willing to offer my practical help and support on the points below.

Wind farm cabling projects -Vattenfall and Hornsea

Some of you may have heard that these developers have now been given the green light by the Government (granting of Development Consent Orders) to transmit power from offshore wind farms by way of cabling corridors through parts of Norfolk. This will mean road closures and increased traffic through our village particularly on the B1145 on the Reepham/Norwich Road. This work is expected to start end of Q1/beginning of Q2 next year although this is subject to change. Before resigning I invited both Developers to attend proposed meetings with the Parish Council so we can discuss their Construction Traffic Management Plan, the site of the sub stations as they pass around our village and the timetable for the excavation activity. I also pointed out that there are a number of features in our village where we must mitigate the impacts such as high school bus pick up and drop off times. This last point is important as Cawston PC has managed to achieve substantial reductions both in the number of HGV's and the length of the working day for the construction work against the developers' original plans.

I urge Bawdeswell Parish Council to follow this up with the developers as soon as possible and to see that sufficient resources are given to this vital project for Bawdeswell and its residents. I reiterate that I stand ready and willing to help with this work if requested by the PC.

Other HGV traffic through the village

Again, before resigning I provisionally agreed with my opposite numbers at Reepham and Cawston PC that we would try to carry out a HGV traffic census during w/c 7th November subject to recruiting enough volunteers. I feel this is important because there is evidence that some HGV's are using the BII45 as a cut through to the A140 in one direction and on to the A1067 in the other. The Highway's Manager has confirmed that "the road should only be used to carry traffic to market towns and between market towns on the B1145. It is not intended as a through route as this is the role of the Primary A Class network".

Bawdeswell traffic issues -an update continued:

During the full traffic census we ran on the 29th April, 60 HGV's were counted going up or down the B1145. In addition myself and my colleague in Cawston have both seen a very large car transporter going through our villages! In my view if we can take action to reduce unnecessary HGV usage before the additional traffic from the cabling projects, this will be very helpful. I would encourage Bawdeswell PC to pick this up and repeat that I stand ready and willing to help manage and to be a volunteer on the day.

Speed Monitoring Cameras (SAM2)

As reported in the August edition of The Reeve's Tale, at the July meeting of the Parish Council it was agreed that a funding application for the latest generation of speed monitoring equipment would be submitted to the Council. This will enable the Council for the first time to record all speeds and times of vehicles going past the devices which can then be downloaded and analysed and this data used to pursue with the police for corrective action to be taken. The devices are portable and will be moved every month so we can track incidence of speeding at key sites in the village. This is important as on our traffic census day in April we recorded 500 instances of speeding over 12 hours on the B1145 in one direction. During a covert police follow up operation they counted twice the number speeding in the opposite direction indicating well over 1000 instances of speeding per day on this one stretch of road! Speeding is, of course, a common concern across towns and villages in Norfolk, many of whom have installed the SAM2 cameras. Highways report that this new generation of camera is much more effective in reducing speeding compared to the old generation that we have in place. The deadline for the funding application to be submitted is December and I am sure that our Parish Council will ensure that they meet this. As before, whilst the new cameras require more work to maintain and to download data, I stand ready to help with this workload.

On a final note I would like to thank fellow residents I have met as a Parish Councillor, including on the traffic census day, for their encouragement and support. As a resident who will be affected by the work that the Parish Council do, I wish them every success for the future.





20MPH limit outside School

The Clerk sent an email to County Cllr Borrett. The response received confirmed that he had 'spoken to Highways, and given that there have been no incidents, this site is at the bottom of the long list of sites that are bidding in to the budget for the necessary works. It is therefore not going to succeed.' and he confirmed that 'If there is any change in the area, such as a planning application or other material developments we may be able to come back and ask that this anomaly be sorted as a result.'

Windfarm

It is anticipated that a meeting will be held with windfarm developers to gauge the impact that the increased traffic accessing the cable routes will have on Bawdeswell. The Council will approve further action as appropriate.

Other matters

Breckland – Local Plan call for sites – Breckland published information, as part of the transparent Local Plan process and confirmed that they were not formally seeking consultation on the sites at this stage but invited questions. There was no commentary from the District Council about suitability of any sites, and Breckland confirmed that just because a site has been submitted it does not mean it will form part of their Adopted Local Plan (2019). It was noted that to date four sites in / around Bawdeswell have been submitted for consideration. The Council will continue to monitor the situation.



BAWDESWELL VILLAGE GATES



Other villages have taken alternative approaches to slowing traffic. Installing gate-like structures on either side of the road where the speed limit drops from 50mph to 30mph, for example, giving drivers the message they are entering a 'community' in the hope that more notice is paid to the speed limit in effect. At the July meeting the Parish Council agreed to seek 50% Parish Partnership funding to fund such gates for installation outside the Garden Centre (The Garden Centre, when approached had expressed their support for the gates / speed reduction project) at a maximum cost of £4000 of which £2000 would need to be met by the Parish Council through donations or from Council funds.

Concern has since been expressed about the benefit of the installation of such gates so the Parish Council would like to hear from residents.

Please let the Council know if you are in favour or against the installation of village gates.

Church Letter

Dear Friends

The month of November will forever be associated, as it has been for over one hundred years now, with Remembrance. Throughout the benefice our churches will be holding Remembrance services on Sunday the 13th. In some of the parishes these will be held in cooperation with other denominations.

This ecumenical cooperation is to me one of the most encouraging things that could happen. It shows a willingness to move forward together. For far too long the different denominations have been at odds with each other and I often wonder just what Jesus would think about what goes on in his name. But it is not only in religion that there is this lack of cooperation. We find it in our personal lives, in our national and international situations. It seems to me that many who claim to be caring for others seem to do so on their own terms, that their way is the only way, not taking advice from anyone else. So what we have is not cooperation but confrontation.

Christ was no stranger to this way of life as the bible recounts many times of his confrontations with the Pharisees and other state officials. The difference is that he tried to reach out to them in love. Even on the cross he was able to show his care for others "Forgive them Father for they know not what they do ".

Throughout the world today there is little evidence of humanitarian caring from those in authority. There is a great need for an opening of arms in love and peace.

After November we will soon be celebrating the birth of Christ. Perhaps we need to take a leaf from him and open our arms in love and peace to those around us, even those who would not to always be in our social circle. This one small act could lead to bigger things and in time perhaps the words of John Lennon in his song from the nineteen eighties may come to fruition "Imagine all the people sharing all the world".
