Book Group

The Book Group now meets in the Village Hall. We meet on the second Thursday of each month, starting start at 8pm. Each member pays a Group Subscription fee; currently £12, for the period April to December 2022. New members are welcome and will be able to come for two meetings before deciding to join the group and pay their subscription.

Our summer reading list:

"The Running Hare: the secret life of farmland" by John Lewis-Stempel

This was a change for us, because it was factual and was a memoire of one farmer's attempt to breathe life into some rather barren acres. He charts his care of the land and how he encouraged some wildlife to return. The author includes a lot of fascinating folklore and rural history. Did you know that it is possible to estimate the time from when certain flowers opened or closed their petals?

This farmer-author's description of farming using traditional methods is fascinating, especially for those of us who haven't been brought up in the countryside. We had one big question, as non-agricultural people, could it be possible for agriculture, tasked with proving quantity, to decide to adopt more sustainable methods? This book suggests, that if we don't, we are in peril.

"Lucky Bunny" by Jill Dawson

Queenie is our narrator although we're can't be sure if she's reliable, as she says, as young girl, she always liked making up stories.

She begins her story in a cottage on the Fens, followed by the explanation of how she ended up there. We learn about her 1930/1940s childhood; life in the East End of London; evacuation; the Blitz and how she learns to be very effective in 'hoisting', her terminology for thieving.

The author name checks many people from the 40s, 50s and 60s, and uses real events within Queenie's story.

We had a mixed reception to this book, but it did provoke wide ranging discussions on bringing up children, family loyalty, love, violence and power.

HGV's accessing Reepham Road

Cllr Coles confirmed that he would be attending a meeting on 29th September with representatives from Cawston and Reepham to further the proposal for a traffic survev.

Overgrown hedges / Trees causing obstruction

Cllr Coles confirmed that the majority of households had complied with the Parish Council's request to attend to overgrown hedges / trees. As it was understood that it was Highways responsibility to ensure that road signage is visible, and as a good response was received to the letters sent, no further action was proposed. It was confirmed that the overhanging hedge on Paradise Lane was Highways responsibility to cut back and this had been raised.

20MPH limit outside School

Cllr Coles raised the proposal to reduce the 30MPH limit to 20MPH with the Highways Engineer. They confirmed via email that there would be a 2 year wait and a £7000 cost to the parish council (not covered under the Parish Partnership scheme), the cost being legal and design with a small part for actual works. No costings were received in respect of the supply /installation of a flashing 20MPH sign (covered under Parish Partnership). It was agreed that the Clerk should write to County Cllr Borrett and highlight the matter.

Windfarm

Cllr Coles gave an update on developments regarding the wind farm / pylons. A response from Equinor confirmed that 'Equinor have sought to ensure that where possible traffic is routed away from the most sensitive communities.' and; With specific regards to the B1145 and the communities you mention, the proposed access strategy for SEP and DEP allows all HGV traffic to approach from the east (via the A140 and B1149). The only part of the B1145 that would be utilised by HGV traffic is a small section to the east of Cawston towards the A140, no HGV traffic would therefore travel west of this and through Cawston, Reepham and Bawdeswell.' Cllr Coles and Cllr Ewing intended to meet with Vattenfall and Hornsea contractors to ascertain the impact of HGV traffic on Bawdeswell.

Church Letter

Dear Friends

The death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II has left an enormous hole in the life of the Nation. Our prayers continue for King Charles III and all the Royal Family. The period of national mourning may be over, but grief continues.

I, for one, shall be very interested to see how King Charles' time as Sovereign develops; whether we'll see much change, or whether he'll model his own kingship on his Mother's 70 years as Queen.

As always when someone dies, we can look back and remember – and we have certainly had plenty of media coverage to help us do that! We can give thanks for this year's Platinum Jubilee, for all that we enjoyed about it, as well as the pleasure the celebrations gave to the Queen and the Royal Family. You may have personal memories of the Queen which you can treasure for ever.

Following the pledge the Queen made on her 21st birthday to devote her whole life to service, she went on to say:

"I shall not have the strength to carry out this resolution alone unless you join in with me, as I now invite you to do... God help me make good my vow and God bless all of you who are willing to share in it."

She knew, absolutely, that a mere accident of birth, coupled with her uncle's abdication as King and the upbringing she had, were not enough to equip her for the task ahead. She called on all of her subjects to join in the enterprise of sovereignty.
