#### Bawdeswell traffic issues -an update

Following my article in the November edition of The Reeve's Tale, I can now let you know the developments on these issues for our village.

#### Wind farm cabling projects -Vattenfall and Hornsea

Vattenfall have now advised me that they are "at least 7 months away from beginning installation of the cable ducting across their cable route". They do not have any information regarding traffic management in and around Bawdeswell at this stage but will ensure that "this is discussed in person well in advance of the works commencing". I will follow up with them and have sent them a detailed list of questions regarding anticipated HGV levels, road closures etc, that they say they will respond to.

Hornsea – the cabling work with this developer is more advanced with roadworks and closures currently taking place in and around Cawston. I requested a meeting with Hornsea in November which, whilst they initially agreed to, then said they "would only meet with Bawdeswell Parish Council elected representatives". The PC minutes from November state that "future meetings with windfarm developers will need to be deferred until new councillors can be recruited". I would again urge the Parish Council to give this matter a high priority as they are in danger of missing the opportunity of influencing and mitigating the impact of these works on our village. I wrote to the Parish Clerk and Chairman on December 9<sup>th</sup> offering my help with the proposed meetings and it is disappointing that I have not received a reply. I have sent a detailed list of questions to Hornsea that they have promised to respond to. I will also be going to the Hornsea project team meeting in Cawston on 3rd February where I will be putting all the questions I have raised to them.

Advanced speed monitoring cameras - it was disappointing to see from the November PC minutes that the "speed reduction project (village gates and SAM2) cameras) will need to be deferred until the appointment of the new council in May due to the present lack of volunteers". Because of the timing of the funding applications this is likely to result in a 12 month delay. Again, this is a missed opportunity by the Parish Council to reduce speeding in the village and it is hoped that when the new Parish Council is in place in May they will have more time to devote to important issues affecting our village and residents.

2022 has been another busy year for the Community Car Scheme! We have covered over 60 journeys which is a fantastic achievement with very few volunteer drivers.

A very big thank you to our volunteer drivers who by giving their time to help others, contribute so much to our local community. I am especially grateful for the voluntary service of Liz Ollier, Phil Ollier and Roger Fryatt who after many years' service have retired from the scheme in 2022. Our heartfelt thanks to you all.

I feel strongly that, as the demand upon our NHS grows, we should help each other to attend medical appointments they are hard enough to get in the first place. I know that requests for help under the CCS are a last resort so it becomes doubly important to offer help if we can.

But my fear for 2023 is that <u>unless we can recruit some more volunteer</u> <u>drivers, then this scheme will not be able to provide the service we would all</u> like to provide.

So I would urge you to consider whether you could give a little time for an occasional journey to help a neighbour attend a medical appointment, whether it be to the N&N or a local doctor's surgery? You will be reimbursed for mileage expenses.

#### **Breckland Mobile Food Store**



This new community facility is available to Bawdeswell and Foxley Residents.

The Breckland Mobile Food Store will be at the Village Hall on Tuesdays from 11am – 12.30pm.

The store will follow a regular route around rural areas of Breckland, providing a way to shop for healthy, nutritious food and store cupboard staples at a reduced price. If increasing living costs or difficulty getting to the shops are problems for you, the store is a way to help.

The Breckland Mobile Food Store is funded by Breckland Council and Norfolk Community Foundation and run by local charity Kickstart. Friendly expert staff on the bus are also trained to offer wider support. If you need advice on things like debt management, mental health and wellbeing, chat to the staff and they'll connect you to a range of services.

To use the Breckland Mobile Food Store you'll need to become a member. You'll make a one-off payment of £3.50 per household and be issued with a membership card. Membership applications can be completed on your first visit to the bus, or online at breckland.gov.uk.

# **Bawdeswell Village Hall Update**

Happy New Year! And hopefully it will be a really good one for us all.

Our Village Hall is being used by lots of different people and community groups, and our feedback is that it is "well-loved".

However, we do have a problem with a faulty roof, leading to leaks. We have plans in place to 'fix' this in March. Please read the following letter. This is being sent to all our users, hirers and friends, explaining our fundraising appeal. We will have a huge bill to pay, but it's absolutely essential that we get the work completed.

#### Dear Everyone

I am writing on behalf of all our Hall Charity Trustees to ask if you can help us.

We all love our Hall and how it enhances and supports our wider community. We are also so pleased to receive good feedback from our many users. We are grateful to have a vibrant Volunteer Group who help us to look after our building and all of our users.

However, we have a problem. Unfortunately, a rather large one. We have a "leaky" roof.

Over the past 5 years (and our building was only opened in 2015), we have attempted to 'fix' this and have spent large sums of money on suggested ways to stop the rain leaking in above our Activities Room. However, none of these 'fixes' has resolved the issue.

During last year we, with the help of our architect and roof manufacturer, conducted a major survey to pin-point the exact source of the leak. Extensive research and tests showed that the roof had been incorrectly installed. Further research identified that we have no redress as the construction company and roof sub-contractor are no longer in existence, and our building insurance will not cover any subsequent claim on faulty work.

We know we have to resolve the leaking roof once and for all; otherwise our beautiful Hall will deteriorate and become a sad version of itself. We need to keep our hall functioning as the centre of our community. To this end we have engaged a roofing company and corrective building work will start in March. Part of the roof will be lifted off, re-fitted, and at the same time, new gulleys will be installed.

The cost will be £65,000.

We have already committed £20,000 from our Hall's savings, and we have received a further £15,000 from generous donors and grants. We recognise that additionally we are going to have to borrow money through the parish council to make up the difference, but of course this will create a long standing debt against our Hall that we'll be repaying the loan from our income over many years.



# MEETING OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON THURSDAY 1st DECEMBER 2022 AT 7pm

Present: J. Mallen (Chair), A Hartley-Walder (Vice-Chair), A. Toomey and R. Reed, Mrs. J Boxall (Clerk). Members of the public – 3

District Councillor G.Bambridge, County Councillor B. Borrett and the Police were not in attendance

#### **Public Works Board Loan application**

A report was circulated to Council, a copy of which can be viewed on the Parish Council website. It was RESOLVED to seek the approval of the Secretary of State for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities to apply for a PWLB loan of £40000 over the borrowing term of 10 years for the repair to the Village Hall roof. The annual loan repayments will come to around £4913.80. It is not intended to increase the council tax precept for the purpose of the loan repayments as the Village Hall Trustees will be repaying the loan from income taken from the Village Hall.

#### Play area

The barked area under the climbing frame has been refurbished. HUGE thanks to all the Volunteers who helped move the large amount of bark.

#### Other matters

An email was circulated to Councillors confirming the Registration for project Sheringham and Dudgeon Extension Projects with the Planning Inspectorate.

It was confirmed there will be a meeting on 20th December at Breckland to participate in a presentation and discussion about the next stage of the Local Plan Update focusing on the Issues and Option consultation which it is anticipated will commence in early 2023.

A resident had kindly offered to make a donation towards the cost of a set of gates on the Reepham Road but the Council confirmed that they were not proceeding with the project at the present time.

The Village Volunteers have renovated the white stones on the Village Green, thanks were extended to them.





#### Bawdeswell continued:

#### **Finance**

The balance of the Community account as at 30th November 2022 was confirmed as £23,428.49. Business Money Manager was £36189.55 with £16.90 interest received 28th November.

**Precept requirements for 2023/24** - The Clerk circulated the financial report / budget. It was unanimously AGREED to increase the precept to cover all expenditure and request a precept of £27000 for 2023/24 in order to meet current financial commitments.

#### May elections

On 4th May the local Council elections will be held. Some of our Councillors have said that they will be standing down from office so it is going to be essential to recruit new Councillors and find residents willing to put themselves forward for election. If you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor, why not come along to one of the Council meetings and see what goes on? Or please contact the Clerk or one of the Councillors who will be happy to answer any questions.

The next meetings of the Parish Council will be held on Thursday 2nd February and 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2023 starting at 7.00pm. These meetings will be held at the Village Hall. #### **Church Letter**

I know it may a bit late but I would like on behalf of the Heart of Norfolk Ministry team to wish you a Happy New Year.

Christmas seems such a long time ago and life has swiftly moved on. In the Church Lent will soon be on us. Having it seems, just celebrated the birth of Jesus we now start to reflect on the end of his ministry on earth.

However, one of the great messages of Christmas comes from Isaiah "the people who have walked in darkness have seen a great light". Although we don't know if Jesus was born in December, it is probably no coincidence that the early leaders of the Church chose this time. It is just after the winter equinox when in the northern hemisphere (remember that in Jesus' time the Northern hemisphere was most of the known world) the days begin to lengthen, a sign of the light overcoming the darkness.

This is, of course, the practical darkness that we experience, but what about the other kinds of darkness we might experience?

There is perhaps the darkness within us. There is the darkness of war, of the refugee crisis, the cost of living problems, homelessness. The list could go on and on.

The message of Christmas, in fact, of Jesus' entire ministry is Hope. Hope is the light that shines in the darkness. If we lose hope for a better world then we will be dragged down into dark despair, something none of us want.

The New year brings us a new hope, a chance to repair damaged relationships, a chance to look forward and leave the cares of the old year behind

I hope and pray that as the light returns we will all find ourselves in a better place.
