Bawdeswell traffic issues - an update

I can now update on developments on the wind farm cabling projects since my article in last month's edition of The Reeve's Tale.

Vattenfall -they have now provided dates for the Public Information Events ahead of the main construction works starting on the cabling ducting installation and onshore Substation in early September 2023. The nearest for our village is at Cawston Village Hall on Friday 7th July and Reepham Town Hall on Monday 10th July. In both cases these run from 9.00am to 9.00pm.

In preparation, I have contacted my colleagues on Cawston and Reepham Parish Councils who have responsibility for this and we plan to meet up beforehand and attend together if possible. I intend to question Vattenfall closely regarding their Construction Traffic Management Plan which has not been revealed up to this point and would expect that they should be able to share this at these events. These events are open to all residents and if you would like to attend, I would suggest that the event at Reepham on 10/7 would be more relevant as we have a shared interest in the use of the B1145 running from Bawdeswell through to Reepham.

Hornsea(Orsted) —In contrast, we are close to completing the information gathering from this developer. In my last update in June, I mentioned that the revised Construction Traffic Management Plan (CTMP) was submitted to and approved by Broadland District Council and this continues to show zero construction traffic on the B1145 between Bawdeswell and Reepham in either direction. Moreover, the revised CTMP no longer has any construction traffic using the A1067 from Fakenham to Guist to Bawdeswell and onto Lenwade. This should eliminate the risk of "accidental" turn off onto the B1145.

There is one additional point I have questioned them on and that is to expand on the "emergency" circumstances, that may cause maximum construction traffic numbers to be exceeded without agreement from the council. I have also sought confirmation that, in any event, this will not impact on the use of the B1145 between Bawdeswell and Reepham as they have explicitly ruled this out in their CTMP. I am awaiting their response on these points

I will advise with further news when this is available.

"How it All Began" by Penelope Lively

This book begins in uncharacteristically violent fashion for a Penelope Lively story: "The pavement rises up and hits her. Slams into her face, drives the lower rim of her glasses into her cheek."

Charlotte Rainsford, a retired schoolteacher, is mugged by a petty thief on a London street and the consequences topple like dominoes across the lives of her family, acquaintances and strangers.

A marriage unravels after an illicit love affair is revealed through an errant mobile phone message. A posh yet financially strapped interior designer meets a business partner who might yet prove too good to be true. An ageing historian tries to recapture his youthful vigour with an ill-conceived idea for a TV mini-series. And a middle-aged central European immigrant learns to speak English and reinvents his life.

This is a story using the back drop of *chaos theory*; the idea that a flap of a butterfly's wings on one side of the globe might create a tornado elsewhere. The author explores the idea that chance can alter everyone's lives and our paths can be altered irrevocably by somebody we will never even meet.

We are currently reading "Girl A" by Abigail Dean for discussion at our meeting on 13th July.


Our next book will be "The Silence of the Girls" by Pat Barker for discussion in August.

Annual Parish Meeting

Elections

There was a further uncontested election in Bawdeswell which saw David Shannon and Anni Hartley-Walder automatically elected to join Roy Reed on the Parish Council.

As the Council were quorate, meetings could be held. At the Annual Parish Council Meeting four applications were received to fill the remaining vacancies by co-option. The Applicants were invited to introduce themselves and answered questions. It was unanimously agreed to approve the co-option of John Mallen, Carolyn Good and David Cockburn. As apologies were received from the fourth applicant, it was agreed to defer consideration of their application until they were able to attend the meeting.

John Mallen was elected as Chair with David Shannon elected as Vice-Chair.

Finance

The balance of the Community account as at 31st May 2023 was confirmed as £26306.46, Business Money Manager (Earmarked reserves) was £38948.65. A claim for the refund of VAT for the year 2022/23 totalling £1713.31 had been received. Budget figures were circulated to Council for consideration and are published on the website.

The Council approved Section 1 of the Annual Governance Statement, Section 2 of the Accounting Statements 2022/23 and the period for the exercise of public rights. All documentation has been published on the website. The accounts have been submitted to the external auditor.

Diamond Jubilee of Bawdeswell Church

July 21st marks the Diamond Jubilee of laying of the foundation stone of the present church in 1953. There has been a church here since 1313 and over the centuries it has had a chequered history.

In 1739 the tower fell down and ruined the church. The four bells were sold to raise money to rebuild it and a brick tower was built. But in 1828 that fell down. Less than 20 years later, the church was in such a bad state

that a fund was formed to raise money to build a new one. At a public meeting in 1843 it was agreed to levy a 6d rate on the parish, raising £150 towards the estimated cost of £1400. The remainder was met by donations. Then during WWII a Mosquito aircraft returning from a mission over Germany, iced up and loosing height crashed into the church setting it on fire and destroying it.

Architect James Fletcher-Watson, a Norwich architect who had designed the Bishiop's House in Norwich was commissioned to draw up plans for a new church.

"It's the centrepiece of a very attractive Norfolk village, built in flint and brick which is the usual material used," he said. "There's a feeling of Georgian architecture in the whole village and so I particularly wanted the church to blend in with that."

So James included a range of Georgian-style features throughout. "I particularly wanted them to have a three-decker pulpit. That is a combined feature of a pulpit for

the parson to preach his sermon, a reading desk for him to take the service and another reading desk for people to do the readings. There are very few three-decker pulpits in England. And the parish council were very worried about it. So I said we'd design it so it could be dismantled and broken up into three parts. They agreed to go ahead with it — and consequently they've never wanted to alter it. They've grown to like it." He explained there were also three types of pew in the church, to make them comfortable for all.

The architect returned to Bawdeswell Church as guest of honour on 17th December 2000 as we villagers celebrated our Millennium

Project – the 'completion' of his church with the installation of a tower clock and a toilet.

We are planning a Service of Commemoration and Celebration on the evening of Friday 21st July and an Anniversary Concert on Saturday 29th July. Do join us on these special occasions.

Our Churchyards

Many people comment on the peace and solace they find when they visit our churchyards, whether to remember a loved-one who is buried there, or simply to sit a while in reflection.

Mowing churchyards in the summer months is clearly essential and we are grateful to all those who mow and, in other ways, work hard to keep the churchyards looking beautiful, including leaving some areas 'wild' for the benefit of our local flora and fauna.

We have noticed over the last couple of years that some graves are hampering maintenance and mowing and would like to remind people of some key points in the Diocesan Regulations:

- Kerbs, railings, fencing and chippings are prohibited.
- Objects such as statues, toys, wind chimes, windmills, photographs and candles are also prohibited. These will be removed and the family advised either directly or by a notice on the grave, including how to arrange collection.
- Bulbs and small annual plants can be planted in the soil of the grave (directly, or in a removable sunken container). It is the family's responsibility to keep this tidy and the PCC retains the right to mow over any planting that becomes unsightly.
 - Wreaths or cut flowers may be laid direct on any grave or in any vase incorporated into the base of the memorial. The PCC will remove any wilted flowers and wreaths (e.g. Christmas) once they become unsightly. No artificial flowers other than "silk" flowers, i.e. polyester/cotton mixture. The PCC retains the right to remove other artificial flowers without notice.
- Finally, the maintenance of the memorial is the responsibility of the family.
 Occasionally, graves sink, which may cause the memorial to lean. The PCC has no responsibility over these matters, or indeed, storm or other damage.

These Regulations may sound prohibitive, but they are in place to ensure that our churchyards continue to be beautiful places of peace and solace for generations to come.

Church Letter

Dear Friends

I am writing this letter, sitting outside my motorhome on a campsite in the Lake District experiencing a totally different landscape to that of Norfolk. Magnificent mountains surround me and I am reminded of the wonders of the natural world and creation. From the Genesis creation it should be noted that humankind was the last of God's creations, following all the other creatures that we share this world with, as if we might just have been an afterthought. If, perhaps he might be regretting this afterthought! God gave us dominion over the natural world not for us to exploit all its riches, but to be shepherds of all creation.

I am currently reading "Silent Earth" by Dave Goulsen. It is a treatise on the decline of the insect population around us. Those of us who are older may remember that in days gone by, at the end of a car journey, our windscreens and number plates needed to be cleared of insects, something not so prevalent now.

Some might say so what, but we have to remember that many insects play a vital part in the web of life. They act as pollinators not just of flowers but also of many of the plants that feed us. One of the declines that most of us will know of is that of honeybees which of course affects those who enjoy the product they give us. It is our actions, such as the use of neo-nicotinoids, that are contributing to a rapid fall not just in numbers but also in species. In his book, Goulsen quotes the biologist E. O. Wilson "If mankind were to become extinct, the world would regenerate back to a rich equilibrium but if insects were to vanish, the environment would collapse into chaos".

I hope you will be able to enjoy a wonderful summer and all its glory but please remember we are part of the natural world not its masters. We need to tread lightly on this earth considering the words of Jesus, "consider the flowers in the fields and the birds of the air" and pass on what is normal to us to our children and our children's children.
