# Popular Choir returns for Summer Choral Concert at Salle Church

Reepham Rotary Club is arranging a charity concert on Saturday 8 July in St Peter & St Paul Salle, Norfolk at 7.30pm.

The concert will feature the popular Tarantara Choir who will be re-visiting Norfolk from their base in the West Midlands. The 60 strong choir has a wide following around the country, carrying out many charity concerts. They visited last in 2019 and their return to Salle has been eagerly awaited.

Tarantara performs a wide variety of music, spanning songs from musicals to the classics, from old to new, from serious to not-so-serious. The Salle concert promises a delightful evening in inspiring surroundings. The choir will be performing without charge so that maximum funds can be raised for charity. The event is in aid of Rotary charities. The Club has sent substantial funds for relief in Ukraine, Pakistan and Turkey. This concert is now aimed at rebuilding funds for local projects. Locally, the Club runs a successful cafe for those with memory difficulties, supports a wide range of projects in our schools, and organises an annual food and drink festival. Replenishing funds sent to emergencies will allow more community projects to be supported in the year ahead.

#### Bawdeswell traffic issues -an update

Following my previous articles in The Reeve's Tale, I wanted to update you on the latest news on the wind farm cabling projects as they affect our village.

**Vattenfall** -the last update I received from them was mid-April. They repeated that they are preparing to begin construction of the Norfolk Offshore Wind Zone. Once, operational this will provide power for 4.6 million homes and will entail approximately 60 kms of shared underground cabling which will connect the power produced offshore with the on-shore substations that are co-located near Necton.

They have not produced any detailed information at this stage on the impact this will have on towns and villages but have repeated that they are committed to community engagement and local dialogue. They now expect the full onshore works programme to start around September (later than their last estimate) and have said that in the summer "we will be holding a series of drop in events for communities located near to the onshore cable route and landfall area". I have asked them to let me know as soon as these are scheduled and I will certainly be examining their proposals in detail and will be closely questioning them if this affects our village to see if additional mitigation to relieve any adverse impacts should be put in place.

Hornsea(Orsted) –by contrast we have much more detailed information from this developer. In my last update in April I mentioned that a revised Construction Traffic Management Plan (CTMP) was being finalised –this was submitted to Broadland District Council on 4th April and approved by the Assistant Director Planning on 3rd May. Whilst this runs to 11 volumes and 479 pages, the relevant parts as it affects our village continues to show zero construction traffic on the B1145 between Bawdeswell and Reepham in either direction. A beneficial change for Bawdeswell (and Reepham) is that the revised CTMP no longer has any construction traffic using the A1067 from Fakenham to Guist to Bawdeswell and onto Lenwade. This should eliminate the risk of "accidental" turn off onto the B1145.

Orsted have responded in part to my detailed questions regarding route non-compliance and HGV movements in exceptional circumstances. On the first point, they have said that "to ensure compliance there will be a combination of QR code/online self-sign in and fully manned vehicle tracking at each access gate. The data will be shared with the Developer and compiled for a monthly compliance report for NCC".

On exceptional circumstances, they have stated that "agreed numbers will not be exceeded without agreement from the council except in an emergency". I feel we need to see this "emergency" use tightly defined and now intend to take this up with Orsted.

I will advise with further news when this is available.





#### 'Old Baggage' by Lissa Evans

The protagonist of Old Baggage is Matilda Simpkin (Mattie), who in her youth was a militant suffragette. We meet her in 1928, when, at last, the suffrage is to be extended to women over 21.

Mattie, now in late middle-age, is searching for purpose in her life. A chance encounter prompts her to question current young women's political views. She is appalled by what she sees as the lack of knowledge and interest that the younger generation of women seem to have. But, Mattie, a veteran of the women's suffrage movement, believes she has the answer. She will start an open-air club for disadvantaged women, involving healthy activities - "Javelin throwing. Archery. Use of the slingshot." Membership grows, and Mattie's scheme is a wild success until a rival club for boys and girls, organised by right wing admirers of Mussolini, begins to encroach.

There's a lot of 'old baggage' in this book. Not just as a description of Mattie's bag that houses her old wooden club or the insult from a young man, but there's the emotional sort too. Mattie is a flawed character, who makes mistakes but she does own up to her errors. Our group's favourite character is the Flea (Flossie Lee). She tempers Mattie's exuberance whilst being wise and profound.

This might be 1921 but the issues are contemporary. The text explores gender expectations, loyalty and the significance of social class. It is interesting to look at how society has and hasn't moved on and this book is an enjoyable way to gain insight into the suffragette movement from an 'insider', even if she is a fictional one!

We are currently reading "How it All Began" by Penelope Lively for discussion at

our meeting on 8<sup>th</sup> June. Our next book will be "Girl A" by Abigail Dean for discussion in July.

The Breckland Mobile Food Store will be at the Village Hall on Tuesdays from 11am - 12.30pm.

## Public Works Board Loan (PWLB) application

It is understood from the Village Hall Trustees that due to personal donations, grants and savings, the Trustees will not need to borrow any money from the Public Works Loan Board. A massive THANK YOU to all those who have contributed personally to the fund and to the Trustees for their efforts to secure grants and successfully manage what has been a challenging situation.

## **Elections**

There was an uncontested election in Bawdeswell as only Cllr Roy Reed put himself forward from nomination and was automatically elected. As the Council need a minimum of 3 Councillors to be quorate, this leaves the Council with a shortage of Councillors. Breckland Democratic Services have confirmed that a second election will be held for Bawdeswell in the hope of additional candidates coming forward to fill all or some of the vacancies. The Notice of Election will be published and it is understood that the same process is followed as per the previous election. If after the second attempt the Council remains inquorate then Breckland will review the situation and may appoint individuals to run the Parish Council in the short term.

It's important that Bawdeswell Parish Council finds new and enthusiastic councillors who reflect and represent the community they serve, and have a broad range of skills and life experience. You don't have to be highly educated or have a profession. Skills gained through raising a family, caring for a sick or disabled relative, volunteering or being active in faith or community groups can be just as valuable. While you don't need any special qualifications to be a councillor, having communication skills, team working and the ability to engage with your local community will help you in the role.

Please don't worry if you don't feel that you have all the skills to be a councillor, the Council provides support, information and offers / funds training for new councillors.

## **Church Letter**

I do hope everyone enjoyed the Coronation weekend and was able to make the most of the extra Bank Holiday!

Much has been written and said about the Coronation Service at Westminster Abbey and I imagine we'll be talking about that day and the whole weekend for some time to come.

One thing that particularly struck me about the Service was that the very first words were spoken by a child, Samuel Strachan (Child of His Majesty's Chapel Royal). Samuel said:

"Your Majesty, as children of the kingdom of God we welcome you in the name of the King of kings."

To which King Charles replied:

"In his name and after his example I come not to be served but to serve."

The King went on to make a number of oaths and promises, not least to maintain the Laws of God and the true profession of the Gospel – as a faithful Protestant. But I want to dwell on the servant nature of his kingship.

We know that, as Prince of Wales, King Charles was tireless in his charitable work; he founded The Prince's Trust in 1976 to help vulnerable young people get their lives on track; he has pioneered apprenticeship schemes, giving people skills that will last their whole lives. I'm sure I am just scratching the surface here, but I have no doubt that King Charles will continue to use his privilege and position in service to God and his people, with Queen Camilla at his side.

To those of us who are involved in the ministry of the Church, we are reminded that all ministry is centred on the needs of those to whom we minister. We try to follow Jesus' example and, in so doing, lead people gently into his love and fellowship, which lasts for a life-time and beyond.
