Woe betide any of the kitchen staff Rob caught not complying with Health and Safety Regs, and you could not put a glass a centimetre out of place on a table without a reminder from Rita! They loved the Friday Sagalouts evenings, and Rob enjoyed fishing for relaxation.

Together Rob and Rita were real assets to the village and it is a pity that more people didn't try to dissuade them from leaving.

Rita is currently staying with her daughter's family in Dorset and the move will probably be permanent, so she is in good hands.

We will always remember how much Rob and Rita did for the village and especially Bawdeswell Village Hall.

#### **Reepham Rotary Club**

HMS Gloucester - Discovery and history.

Public talk on 16th October.

Reepham Rotary Club is hosting a talk about HMS Gloucester by Professor Claire Jowitt and Julian Barnwell.

HMS Gloucester, which sank off the Norfolk Coast in 1682 has been described as 'Norfolk's Mary Rose'. The talk will cover the history of the ship and its passengers, the story of the years of diving to find the ship and recover many fascinating artefacts.

James Duke of York and Albany, brother of King Charles II, was returning to Scotland on the Gloucester with more than 300 passengers and crew on board. The ship ran aground on a sand bank off the coast of Gt Yarmouth. James survived but more than 150 died as the ship sank in less than one hour.

Professor Jowitt of UEA is co-curator of the exhibition which has been running at Norwich Castle Museum. She will explain the historical background to the voyage and the items found. Julian Barnwell, with his brother Lincoln, has been exploring the sea bed since they discovered the wreck back in 2007. He will tell the story of the dive and update us on discoveries from this year's diving.

The talk will take place at Reepham 6th Form College at 7.30 pm on 16th October 2023. The tickets at £10 will include a glass of wine or soft drink. The evening will be raising funds for the Trust to preserve the remains of the ship and Rotary Charities.



The Book Group meets in the Village Hall. We meet on the **second Thursday** of each month, starting at **7:30pm**. Each member pays an annual Group Subscription Fee to cover charges for our room hire and library charge.

New members are welcome and will be able to come for two meetings before deciding to join the group and pay their subscription.

We read two very different reads over summer! One a fictional account of a female character from Homer's The Iliad and the other, which might be described as a gothic fantasy:

#### The Silence of the Girls" by Pat Barker

Our group had the benefit of someone who knew The Iliad, 'inside and out'; consequently we were able to 'dissect' this story against its original, in detail. It is perhaps one of the most viscerally chilling books that we have read as a group; its descriptions of mutilation, rapes and killings are brought alive. Some of us needed to skim-read some passages!

Briseis, Achilles' concubine is the woman awarded to Achilles, the greatest Greek fighter, after his army sacks one of the towns. Agamemnon, the most powerful warrior, although not the bravest, of the Greeks (and in this story, a character whose downright nastiness comes across powerfully), seizes Briseis from Achilles. Achilles' vengeful rage against Agamemnon along with the subsequent vast death toll of the Greeks and Trojans, is the central theme.

This is also a way of telling how stories about the past and the present, and at how anger and hatred, play out in our societies. "The defeated go down in history and disappear, and their stories die with them." Some might say that this book is a 'feminist version' of Homer's epic poem. It certainly focuses on the cost of war to women.

#### "The Binding" by Bridget Collins

This is an imaginative story in an unspecified time. It divided opinion, like 'marmite', some loved it, whilst others didn't.

The book suggest that hurts, harms and wrongdoings can be hidden away with consequent burdens of guilt thereby lifted. 'Wrongs' are written and bound into a book, then secreted away forever. However, if the unscrupulous get their hands on such "bindings", then great mischief should be feared. The fable is simple; the good are essentially noble and their enemies unambiguously wicked. And to keep you reading, there's an intertwined illicit love story.



# Community Car Scheme: Bawdeswell, Bylaugh, Foxley

Thank you to our wonderful volunteer drivers and our Parish Clerk Jo Boxall for their service so far this year, we truly live in the presence of angels! It has been a pleasure to be your coordinator.

We have seen a noticeable upturn in requests for help from the Community Car Scheme in 2023. So far we have completed 41 journeys in the first half of the year or almost 2 a week. It is good to see that the scheme is being utilised and providing a valuable service for local residents. I heard recently that it cost £40 to travel to Cromer by taxi for a medical appointment, so there is a cost saving too at just 20p per mile paid by the passenger and of course the return journey too.

We are very fortunate to have this scheme which is funded by our parish councils and we welcome new passengers and drivers. For new passengers there are just a few questions to answer, such as the mobility of the passenger (we can't help with wheelchairs) and general health. Drivers are reimbursed for mileage expenses at 45p per mile but give their time freely.

Do keep the requests for assistance coming in with as much notice as possible please and we will try our best to help if a volunteer driver is available. Thank you.

#### **Grounds Maintenance**

The Council reviewed the Grounds Maintenance contract for 2024 and have agreed to separate the grass cutting / hedge trimming from the weeding / pruning on the Village Green and Jubilee Garden. #### **Planning**

3PL/2023/0660/EU - Certificate of Lawfulness for an Existing Use or Development (CLEUD) for the erection of stables and associated hardstanding for a period in excess of 4 years at Ambergate Farm Blind Lane Reepham Road.

The Planning Officer was not in attendance at the meeting following a recent site visit and subsequent meeting with Councillors. It was acknowledged that whilst the stables had been on the site for the past 4 years, the hardstanding had not. 
One of van Gogh's early paintings is 'Harvest' (which I knew from childhood, as a print of it hung in my family home).
