



Bawdeswell traffic issues -an update

I can now update on developments on the wind farm cabling projects since my article in the August/September edition of The Reeve's Tale.

Vattenfall - They have now decided that due to "significantly deteriorating market conditions in the last year" ... they have "taken the very difficult decision to stop the current development for the Boreas wind farm part of the scheme". Work on their other wind farm project - Vanguard, will continue as planned. This scaling back chimes with the recent announcement that, in common with all other potential developers, Vattenfall did not bid for any of the 7 new contracts to build wind farms around the coast because they believe the Government price per megawatt hour offered means that it is not financially viable.

They have now released some details of the construction works for Vanguard which will entail a cabling corridor from Happisburgh to Necton. Work on the 20km Western-most section from Necton to the River Wensum (nr Bylaugh) will commence first with ducting due to be installed from March 2024. The main work for the remaining 40km will start from September 2024, although enabling work such as Archaeology and surveying will start before then. I have examined their interactive map of the cabling route in some detail and the closest this currently tracks to Bawdeswell is at this end of Well Lane in Sparham, then taking a cross country route near Banningham before reaching Happisburgh. Whilst I can see no reason for construction traffic to use the B1145 through Bawdeswell, I will press them once again to release their Construction Traffic Management Plan so I can check this.

Hornsea(Orsted) – No change since last report - their CTMP shows zero traffic on the B1145 between Bawdeswell and Reepham in either direction. I will continue to monitor this.

Sheringham Shoal and Dudgeon Offshore Wind Farm Extension Projects - this is a 3rd wind farm cabling project. This is yet to receive a Development Consent Order although the developers (Equinor) have now published outline details. As is the case with the other 2 above, it will mean substantial on shore cabling from landfall, which in this case will be West of Weybourne, and will be in 2 separate trenches travelling 60kms to a high voltage onshore substation near to the existing Norwich Main Station, via sub stations on route.

The outline HGV map for the construction works shows substantial activity on the A1067 although the B1145 from Bawdeswell to Reepham is not currently shown as a designated route. I will continue to follow updates on this closely.

I will advise with further news when this is available. David Coles

Bawdeswell Village Hall Update

As I write this early in the month the weather has been glorious for the last few days and summer feels like it is here to stay. However, by the time you all read this at the beginning of November I am sure that the winter chill will have made itself known and all thoughts of summer will be long gone. 
Book Group





Community Car Scheme: Bawdeswell, Bylaugh, Foxley

Thank you to our wonderful volunteer drivers and our Parish Clerk Jo Boxall for their service so far this year, we truly live in the presence of angels! It has been a pleasure to be your coordinator.

We have seen a noticeable upturn in requests for help from the Community Car Scheme in 2023. So far we have completed 41 journeys in the first half of the year or almost 2 a week. It is good to see that the scheme is being utilised and providing a valuable service for local residents. I heard recently that it cost £40 to travel to Cromer by taxi for a medical appointment, so there is a cost saving too at just 20p per mile paid by the passenger and of course the return journey too.

We are very fortunate to have this scheme which is funded by our parish councils and we welcome new passengers and drivers. For new passengers there are just a few questions to answer, such as the mobility of the passenger (we can't help with wheelchairs) and general health. Drivers are reimbursed for mileage expenses at 45p per mile but give their time freely.

Do keep the requests for assistance coming in <u>with as much notice as</u> <u>possible please</u> and we will try our best to help if a volunteer driver is available. Thank you.


A grant of £118 was awarded to the Little Monkeys Toddler Group for new equipment.

FOXLEY PARISH COUNCIL held on Thursday 12 October 2023 at 7:30pm.

Present: Nicky Mears (NM), Giles Blatchford (GWB), Mark Watson (MW), Gillian Blyth (GB), Linda Rose (LR) Ali Blatchford (Clerk). Members of the public – 1

- 1. Apologies for absence Gordon Bambridge (Breckland Councillor).
- 2. Declarations of interest by Council Members in items on the agenda and any applications for dispensation: No new interests declared.
- 3. The minutes of the meeting held on 3 August 2023 were approved and signed.
- 4. Items raised from last meeting and on the minutes and not on this agenda report progress:
- 4.1. Drains on The Street Opposite Church Farm Barns and Lawrence Place; though the drain had been cleaned out it still does not drain. Highways are investigating this. NM highlighted that the drains on the street are covered in straw and not working in heavy rain. Clerk to contact Highways, cc Bill Borrett as this seems to be an ongoing problem.
- 4.2. Lay-by on A1067 going towards Fakenham regarding cutting back of vegetation Highways have visited Lay-by, a report is to be completed and then they will get a quote for work. Clerk to monitor and chase.
- 4.3. Straw and Mud on the Street. Highways was contacted regarding the overhanging hedges/trees on "The Street" as they are pulling off straw from passing vehicles. Highways asked FPC to send letters to residents that have hedges/trees that need trimming before they take any action. Clerk sent letters to residents and many hedges/trees have been trimmed.
 - 4.3.1. St Thomas Church has a TPO on the Yew Tree and is in the process of getting this looked at and Planning permission applied to cut back the Trees.
 - 4.3.2. The Oak Tree on the boundary of Cranfield House and Jaydee, is not owned by either property so Highways to be advised of this.
- 4.4. The lay-by signages from Breckland for Dog Fouling and Fly Tipping, a Breckland representative visited the two lay-bys and confirmed that new posts would be need FPC to purchase, Clerk to purchase two Aluminium Posts at cost of £140.90. Clerk to check with Breckland if there was any preferred place to site the posts/signs.
- 4.5. Mobile Surveillance Cameras Breckland District Council have been advised that we are very keen to have these cameras in our lay-bys Clerk is still awaiting to hear back from Breckland DC.

GWB will go through the new survey to check if there were any significant changes from the previous survey completed.
 - 10. Matters raised by the residents A resident is concerned by the speed of traffic going down Mill Road once the 20MPH speed limit ends. He highlighted that this Road (Lane) is now very narrow with an increase in traffic travelling at speed which is hazardous for, pedestrians, cyclists, etc as vehicles cannot give the new Highway regulations of 1.5mtr distance from cyclists/pedestrians. They asked if the Council could help in:

Church Letter

Dear Friends,

November is a strange month. It's the eleventh month of the year but its name is derived from the Latin "novem" meaning nine. The reason for this stretches back to the Romulan calendar of around 730 b.c. which started with March, and when the calendar that we now use came into being it remained as November, as do the other months in the year related to numbers. At the end of the month the Christian year begins with Advent looking forward to celebrating once more the birth of Christ. So November is the month that comes at the end the Church's year. It has also now become synonymous with remembering.

The first day of the month is dedicated to All Saints. Three of the churches in the benefice have that name. It is a day when we bring to mind all those Saints that have no day of their own. The next day is All Souls' Day when all those who have died are prayed for. Then just over a week later comes Armistice Day/ Remembrance Sunday. I am sometimes a little concerned about how the remembrance is carried out. We must ensure that it does not become a glorification of war. To do so would I believe be an insult to those who "for our tomorrow gave their today".

Jesus gave us two commandments. To love God and to love our neighbour. By neighbour he wasn't talking about the people next door or those in our communities, but each and every person we meet and even people we don't. We have to remember that every person is made in the image of God and for this reason we must show love.

Humankind however seems unable to learn from the mistakes of the past and as a whole sometimes shows a disregard for loving their neighbour. I hope that even if you are unable to attend any of the services of remembrance around the benefice that you will take some time to stop and remember those who gave their lives for others. I pray that you will find yourself keeping the commandment of love for all.
