THE JOHN LEEDS EDUCATIONAL TRUST

In the December issue of the Reeve's Tale, Mr Mears gave brief details of the recent history of this trust and asked for applicants for grants.

Thank you to all those who contacted him. These grants have now been paid. We now need applicants from **2022** and **2024** to contact him.

After an enormous amount of work over the past two years, particularly by Mary Derbyshire of Brown & Co who administer the land upon which the charity is based it has been possible to re-establish the Trust and gain access to monies in the bank.

I am writing to explain where we are now and notify you of the recent decisions by the new Trustees.

Five Trustees were appointed in line with the amended Trust regulations of 1922. These were appointed by **office** to avoid the Trust repeating the position of 2022 when the sole trustee died leaving the Trust unable to function:-

The Chair of Bawdeswell Parish Council The Chair of Foxley Parish Council The Vicar of Bawdeswell and Foxley A member of NCC Education Authority Mary Derbyshire

The Trustees agreed to continue the practice of giving grants towards school uniforms to the parents of Year 6 pupils from Foxley and Bawdeswell. They do not have to be attending Bawdeswell Primary School but must be from Bawdeswell or Foxley. Grants will be made for **2022** and **2023** as well as the current year at the rate of **£350** per pupil. We do not know how the present system evolved to become a grant towards school uniforms but will for the time being continue this practice. In future we hope that with the permission of the parents, the school may be able to supply us with the data needed for the grants, but details of the scheme will be posted each year in the Reeve's Tale with a closing date in May of that year.

The Trustees also have no way of establishing who "is in need of financial assistance" as required by the original will and therefore grants will be given to parents who apply and meet the other criteria. It would be very helpful if parents in both villages who have children in the relevant age group mention to neighbours and friends that grants are made to all parents who meet the criteria. We know that not everyone reads their copy of the parish magazine!

In future, grants may vary from year to year depending on the monies available and the Trustees have the power under the terms of the trust to change and extend the scheme to other support. Such changes will be advised through the Reeve's Tale. Housing Development in Bawdeswell: Keeping You Informed

Breckland Council has a house building target allocated to its area by Central Government, as is the case across the country, and in response they invite potential developers and others to suggest sites for housing development.

We, in Bawdeswell, have had 5 sites suggested for new housing,

Land along **Common Lane** opposite the end of The Street.

Along the **Swanton Morley Road** between Loran and Meadowbank

Land off Paradise Lane opposite Adam's Pit

The Field off the **Reepham Road** behind the Village Hall and Bowling Green.

The land opposite The Old Rectory located behind The Old Police House and Tilney Farm.

The Parish Council have already made their views known on these sites and Breckland Council this month assessed the sites and has ruled out those it felt are not feasible, these will go forward for decision in May and the Parish Council will be informed.

Please do not assume, when Breckland Council's decision is known, that housing development will go ahead because there are many more stages to go through including actual planning permission.

Local children need support from the Bawdeswell and Foxley community.

Foster carers Tim and Bev share their passions for fostering and why they continue to provide positive outcomes for children and young people amid the foster crisis.

When we first met, we discussed fostering and adoption before we married. Still, it wasn't until 18 years into our marriage, whilst on the weekend away in a shepherd's hut that we remember the morning well, Bev was in the shower and Tim was reading the book and came across a story of a lady who fostered children straight from the hospital with life-limiting conditions.

That had such a massive effect on Tim that he could not speak for several minutes, and Bev came out of the shower thinking we had just had news that somebody had died. Such were Tim's emotions!

From that moment, we were both on the same page, which was important for us. From there on in, it was all systems go. We spoke to our daughter, who was afraid of change at the beginning, but we made sure we talked in depth with her about what would change. We needed to move as we did not have a spare room to foster, and we also lived on a farm. The risk assessment for that would have been interesting, to say the least. We have cared for several children over the past two and a half years. We are very blessed that our daughter, who is 21 and lives at home, loves us fostering, and we are a team of 3. With fostering, you are fighting for what is right for the children, and winning that battle is important to us.

You need to offer these children, unconditional love, to show them that someone cares about them and is rooting for them and helping them with routines, as often they might not have had any, and helping them grow and develop their potential; that is the biggest role of a foster carer – develop their potential. Each of our children has the potential, and our biggest job is drawing out the gold within them.

When a child comes to live with us, we feel very excited and nervous. Will they like us, our dog and how will everyone gel together? Lots of questions and factors come into it, but we prepare ourselves and try to meet the child before they come to live with us. We like to show them the home and their bedroom first and keep our 'about me' book up to date for the children. Trying to get as much information about their likes and dislikes before they come, and we give them their favourite meal the first day they arrive.

As a foster carer, you need to have patience and be willing to listen, someone who has an open heart and open ears. Hear what the child is saying, listen and be willing to go the extra mile to care for these precious children coming into our care. Fostering has been the best thing that has happened in our journey. We receive immense support and have great relationships with everyone, and the entire team is on board to support you.

We have improved our curriculum to make sure it is well suited to our children's needs in a variety of subjects. As we have improved our focus on reading skills, we have also restocked our library this year, and our children are beginning to feel the benefit of a range of different authors and genres to enjoy. We have also increased the opportunities outside of the curriculum, now offering clubs in Spanish, Ukulele, Dance, Chess, Science and different sports. We also now offer our families breakfast and after school 'wrapround' childcare, which is supported by our Bawdeswell Morrisons store too. To help our children understand different cultures, we have established link schools in Japan, Spain and Malawi. This month we are welcoming our Japanese Link school's Vice Principal, Shizuka Suzuki, and two of her teachers — this will be her second visit to Bawdeswell. For her first visit last year, Bawdeswell Garden Centre very kindly donated a Japanese cherry tree for our grounds which we planted with Shizuka to represent the beginning of our partnership



"Tail of the Blue Bird" by Nii Ayikwei Parkes



This book divided our group. Some enjoyed it, others were unable to move past the first few pages because the author challenges the reader by using a mixture of languages. Some thought Nii Ayikwei Parkes' editor should have encouraged him to lead us, as Western readers, more gently into the story before offering challenging pidgin dialogue, but he didn't. Meaning that we, as western readers must interpret some of what we are being told. Don't be put off, some parts of the story are written in 'plain English', which helps us fill in the gaps.

The book is a mystery, a *who-dunnit*, but because of its setting it's even more complex. This is a story set in the middle of the old and the new ways of living in Ghana, a clash between the new world of science and reason and the old world of folk tales and fables.

Some 'remains' are found, but what were they, whose were they? Kayo, a forensic scientist is forcibly recruited by a corrupt police inspector to solve the case. His problem is that witnesses speak via folk tales, not the 'CSI language' that the Inspector craves. Kayo's own life depends on finding a conclusion that will satisfy the inspector whilst respecting the village elders; a difficult task.

We are currently reading "The Appeal" by Janice Hallett for discussion at our meeting on 9th May.



Church Letter

Dear Friends,

The month of May marks the transition from Spring into Summer, with the days gradually becoming warmer and longer. It's a month full of promise and opportunity, with much to look forward to.

The Church calendar is also marking a time of transition this month. We're not quite finished with the Easter story because, following the resurrection of Jesus, he appeared a number of times to his disciples and others, even eating breakfast with his friends. Then, having commissioned his disciples to continue his work on earth, Jesus is taken into heaven. We remember this on Ascension Day, 9th May this year. It is followed by the Day of Pentecost (or Whit Sunday, 19th May).

Pentecost truly was a major transition for Jesus' followers! They were all together in Jerusalem, along with thousands of visitors from the known world who had travelled to celebrate the Festival. As Jesus had promised, the disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit and went out into the streets of Jerusalem and spoke to the crowds in their own languages. Peter addressed the crowd, testifying to God's power to free Jesus from death. That day, 3,000 people were baptized and day-by-day more were added to that number (Acts 2).

Often referred to as the 'birthday' of the Church, it was from this point on that Christianity began to spread and, because of Pentecost, the story of Jesus is still being told today.
