NOT SUCH A DEAD END!

Sadly, all of us do and will experience death in our lives and we bury loved ones in graveyards, cemeteries or scatter their ashes in a myriad of places.

Our village, Bawdeswell, has its own graveyard, situated on the Norwich Road, with the land bequeathed to All Saints Church in 1889 by the Lloyd family who were local landowners. This followed on the closure of the graveyard at the Church in the same year which under the Burial Act 1853 passed to the responsibility of the Parish Council for its on-going maintenance. The Church since that date has the sole responsibility for paying for its upkeep and maintenance. The cost of just each monthly grass cut is £120!

This is why on a warm sunny day in May, you would have espied frantic activity carried out by a small group of volunteers, armed with a plethora of garden and industrial equipment and tools, pruning, lopping, weeding, mowing, edging around graves, hedge-trimming and undertaking an annual tidy-up.

The volunteers, both women and men, some of whom have past and current medical conditions ranging from recent heart attacks, on-going cancer treatment, pacemakers to replacement knees and aged from 50 to 87 (yes, you read right EIGHTY SEVEN) were not only Churchgoers but also villagers, responding to a welcome request from our Parish Council, who came along to preserve and help maintain a valuable village asset. There was even someone who was visiting from America! So, a very big heartfelt thank you to all of them and to the ladies who provided coffee and bacon rolls for on-going sustenance.

Occasionally, sadly, the Church is criticised for the Cemetery looking unkempt but frankly All Saints is solely dependent on the income from its attendees and the very small and decreasing amount it charges for the cost of burials and cremations. So if you feel you are able to help in any way (has anyone got a ride on mower to help cut the grass please /a low cost Tree surgeon would be an asset) or if you would like to make a donation towards the upkeep, do please contact Robin Taylor, the Churchwarden. Or maybe next year, come along as a volunteer to help preserve a valuable village asset and one which one day may be the resting place for you or those near and dear to you.

You would be warmly welcomed, would benefit from the fresh air and exercise, and would be treated to a scrumptious bacon roll!

In the meantime if you want to experience peace and tranquillity within the village, why not visit the graveyard:- a young soldier aged 20, who lost his life in WW2 is buried there:- you may find the grave of a forgotten ancestor, or just look around and savour the wonderful trees.

Friends of Bawdeswell School (FOBS)



CHURCH NEWS

Reverend Richard Reflects

August is generally a time when people are on holiday. Perhaps that's a school holiday, perhaps it's annual leave booked off work. Maybe you're going away for a week or two this month, or maybe you're planning on staying at home and having days out. Maybe you always have your holiday in September once the schools have started back...

For me, August is now a time for hosting the Lyng parish barbecue and for getting involved in God's work in the form of the Beach Mission. Every time the Beach Mission comes round, I tend to give some thought to what we might be able to do in our local parishes for children and young people. This subject even formed the theme of one of my sermons last month.

I believe that people are often interested in, or sympathetic towards, the Christian message of love and hope. I think that there are plenty of people who want to hear that message, and explore what it means for them, outside the context of traditional church services. And, from what I have observed on Beach Mission and in the schools that I work with, this is especially true of children and young people. There's an interest and an openness to learning more. The main issue with children, of course, is that they can't usually get involved if their parents or carers don't bring them along. And it's that generation that can be hard to reach.

The more I think about it, the more I realise there aren't any easy solutions or quick fixes. People 'outside' the Church often think those of us 'inside' the Church just want more 'bums on pews.' But actually, our motivation is far more important. We believe that God loves us so much that he sent his Son to die for us and rise again. We want as many people as possible to know this for themselves and to come into a closer relationship with God. If that means more people on a Sunday morning, that's great. If that means more people getting involved in a completely different way, that's great too!

So, my thinking about opportunities to spread the good news in the eight parishes of the Bawdeswell Group of Churches continues. It is an ongoing process. But if you are someone who thinks they might like to find out more about the Christian faith, or get involved in some way, why not have a chat with me? If you think you have a child or young person at home who wants to know more or get involved, have a chat with me about that too. Jesus welcomed everyone, and tried to find ways of including everyone. We want to do the same whether its holiday time or not.
