'Breckland District Council is carrying out a public consultation on the Draft Plan from Friday 31 October 2025 until 23:59 on Monday 15th December 2025. This stage of the local plan (known as Regulation 18) sets out Breckland's draft policies and growth strategy and provides an early opportunity for communities, businesses, landowners, developers, partners and stakeholders to 'have a say' and comment on the draft Local Plan before it is considered further and then finalised for the next (Regulation 19) stage. Consultation will also take place at the Regulation 19 stage.






Book Group





Breckland Local Plan

The Parish Council encourages residents to submit their views to Breckland on the proposal for 140 dwellings on land North of Foxley Road. The Parish Council's latest (and previous) submission can be viewed on the Council's website (under minutes 2025).

Vandalism of play equipment and dogs on the playing field

Following concerns raised by dog owners, the Parish Council confirmed that they are currently researching options to prevent further dog fouling / damage to play equipment, acknowledging that this includes the legal possibility of banning dogs, but were not looking to ban dogs in the first instance. It was confirmed that as fencing around the play area would need to meet safety and regulatory standards (BS1722), it was not currently a financially viable option. Along with the new signage asking dogs to be kept away from the play area, the Council were looking to dog owners to promote good practice. The Council would seek to have further discussion / consult with dog owners should the current limited action not be successful.

Planning

PL/2025/1486/HOU – single storey side / rear extension and new entrance porch at Church Lodge, The Street, Bawdeswell. The Council agreed (via email) that they had no comment or objection to the application.

Appeal Decision for 3PL/2023/1145/F - Land off Reepham Road, Bawdeswell, NR20 4RX. – Appeal dismissed

Other matters

The Parish Council declined a request for an adult football team to use the recreation ground on a regular basis due to not being able to provide the facilities required.

Finance

The balance of the Community account as at 31st October 2025 was confirmed as £34115.62, Business Money Manager (Earmarked reserves) was £38798.89. Budget Figures were circulated for consideration ahead of the December meeting where the Council will set the precept for 2026/27 (the precept is the amount of money the Parish Council requires from Council Tax payers in Bawdeswell).

Present; Cllr N. Mears (Chair), Cllr G. Blyth, Cllr L, Rose, Cllr G, Blatchford and Cllr M. Watson, Mrs. J Boxall (Clerk) Members of the public – 13 District Cllr G. Bambridge & County Cllr B. Borrett were not in attendance.

Breckland Local Plan

It was confirmed that under the draft local plan, no sites for Foxley have been allocated. It was acknowledged that all parishes in Breckland which had not had sites allocated, would incorporate an increase of 5% in dwellings to 2042 (which would mean 8 additional houses in Foxley).

Residents wishing to comment on the Breckland Local Plan should use the Form that is available at the following link - https://breckland.govocal.com/

Planning

Planning notification (information only) – PL/2025/1223/PAH - single storey rear extension with mono-pitch roof at Foxs Den, Old Fakenham Road, Foxley, NR21 4QJ PL/2025/1215/FMIN - Proposed residential development comprising of 4 new build dwellings and 1 barn conversion (5 new dwellings total). Proposal also to includes access, parking to highways standards and private gardens for each plot at Street Farm The Street, Foxley, NR20 4QP.

Following discussion, during which residents were invited to speak, the Council unanimously agreed to object to the application for the following reasons and strongly disagreed with points made in the design and access statement. No safe access to/from the site and no satisfactory visual splay due to wall and hedge. The Street is a single width road, previous applications of a similar nature including back land developments have been refused, concern that the air source heat pump noise would cause a noise nuisance for neighbours and Ecology / Wildlife considerations.

Parish Partnership Funding application for pedestrian signage.

Norfolk County Council confirmed that pedestrian signage on the A1067 providing pedestrian signage on the A1067 at the junction of The Street with Norwich Road and Junction of Chapel Road with Norwich Road would cost around £2000 of which the Parish Council could apply for Parish Partnership funding of 50%.

Following discussion, it was unanimously agreed to apply to Norfolk County Council for parish partnership funding in respect of the pedestrian signage. It was acknowledged that the Parish Council's 50% contribution may need to be funded via a rise in the precept.

Foxley continued.....

Finance

The balance of the main account as at 30th September 2025 was £7496.75, the balance of the savings account was £2569.70. Budget figures were circulated to Council for consideration including bank statements / bank reconciliation.

The Council will consider the 2026/27 precept (A parish council precept is a tax levied by parish councils on local residents to fund their budget requirements for community services and operations.) at their January meeting.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on 6th January 2026 at 7pm. This meeting will be held at the Village Hall. Members of the public are warmly invited to attend. The Council usually meet four times per year. Please check the website or noticeboard for any changes.



Reverend Richard Reflects

When you work in the Church, December is a particularly special time of the year. Things get busy. Of course, things get busy for lots of people in the lead up to Christmas, but if you happen to be a member of the clergy responsible for multiple churches 'busy' takes on a new level.

Normal Sunday services continue as usual, but extra services get added in. Each church will want a carol service. Some will host additional services like Christingles or a Nativity. There will be events such as concerts and Christmas fayres. Some of the parishes have schools, which usually means at least one or two more carol services or nativity performances each, and it is a delight to be able to attend or facilitate these as a member of the local clergy. Then there's the Christmas Eve services and the Christmas Day services. Just a quick glance at my diary for December shows that it is busier than almost any other time of the year.

Yet the days leading up to Christmas are supposed to be a special time of prayerful preparation. The season of Advent should lead us in a reflective way into the season of Christmas. This time of year becomes special because we spend time reflecting on the birth of Christ, an event that meant God was with us in a new way; it also becomes special because we become even more aware that he is still with us today.
