

Bargain hunters can browse amongst the tables throughout the afternoon and enjoy tea, coffee and cake which will be sold by the Lions. Visitors will also have the opportunity to buy tickets for Reepham Lions' annual prize draw. Money raised by Reepham Lions is donated to good causes, mostly in the Reepham area.

During May, members of the club presented a cheque for £275 to the First Responders group in Fakenham. The money will be used to fund licences for a phone app that allows rapid communication both from the emergency response controllers to the responder unit, and from the responders themselves to the controllers when requesting additional support. The licences are paid annually and this is the second year that Reepham Lions has provided the funding to cover them. The First Responders are all volunteers who attend emergency situations in the local area providing early care in the time before an ambulance or paramedic arrives.

### **Bawdeswell Village Hall Update**

Every month sees a small keen group of Volunteers meet up at the Village Hall to plan for the next four weeks. The meeting is chaired by Carolyn, minuted by Colleen with Jo sitting alongside with her diary of events that have been booked but which need all types of cover. These range from volunteers who will open and close the Hall at differing times ranging from a very early start to a late-night closure; an invitation for people to make Soup and Puddings for the monthly Soup and Pud event; setting up the various rooms, sometimes very simply with chairs and tables but occasionally with a range of more technical equipment which people have requested together with any refreshments as well. These can vary from providing a breakfast whether it be a bacon sandwich or a basket of pastries along with the ubiquitous cup of tea or coffee or just tea and biscuits. Surprisingly nothing appears to phase the Volunteers! There is no shortage of people who say 'yes, I can do that', ' leave it to me', and often people buddy up when there is a more challenging or complex request. 




## **Book Group**

Present: D. Shannon (Vice Chair), C. Good, A. Hartley-Walder, M. Bailey and R. Hannent, Mrs. J Boxall (Clerk) Members of the public – 3

#### **Annual Parish Meeting**

David Shannon (as Vice Chair) gave a brief report on the Council's past year. The minutes from this meeting can be viewed online.

The Managing Director of Abel Homes gave a presentation on the proposed site North of Foxley Road (opposite the school).

He confirmed that they were having conversations with Breckland and carrying out tests on the site. 50 – 60 dwellings were proposed with a mixture of bungalows / chalet style bungalows (positioned on site to maintain existing views of the church tower) and two storey dwellings. Affordable housing would account for 25% of the scheme. Access was proposed from Foxley Road, to the left of Tilney Farm (it was suggested it may be better for access to be on the straight part of the road) with a proposed drop off point for the school accommodating 30-35 cars. They would look to introduce / improve traffic calming measures as part of the scheme. Public open space was proposed in a loop around the outside of the development and it was confirmed that drainage would be dealt with on site (Anglian Water had confirmed there is capacity). Electricity would be supplied from a UKPN cable, with a substation on site.

Concerns were raised about access and the need for traffic calming (The PC were chasing the 20MPH outside the school) There was the question of who would maintain the public open spaces as it was acknowledged that the Council's ground maintenance contractor may not wish to take on additional space. The need for additional infrastructure in the village was highlighted.

Bawdeswell Heath - In order to pursue the option of renting the Heath (including PC land) to the Norfolk Wildlife Trust (NWT) further legal advice is required to ascertain what maximum lease the Charity Commission would accept (without considering it similar to a sale) and what minimum lease the NWT would accept. Current suggestions of an annual rent of £400/year for the whole Heath would not bring in much income for the PC, but as there was no current financial benefit this was not a major issue.

### **Planning**

No planning applications were received. It was understood that the Solar Farm at Pettywell has been approved.

### **Local Plan**

No date had yet been received for the Council's meeting with Breckland. As it was expected that the next consultation would be open until the end of July, it was agreed to defer formulating a more detailed assessment of the possible Bawdeswell development sites until the next meeting.

### **HUGE THANKS**

The Parish Council would like to say a **HUGE THANK YOU** to all those residents who work hard, often behind the scenes, to make Bawdeswell the lovely community it is. They would like to Thank those residents who removed weeds and grass from the pavements outside their houses, in the absence of NCC Highways carrying out the work, to help keep the village looking nice.

#### **Finance**

As the end of year accounts have been prepared, the annual gross income for the year 2024/25 was £39609.29 and annual gross expenditure was £32527.41. The closing balance of cash books as at 31st March 2025 was £53328.92 with general reserves of £38579.06. The Internal Auditor's report has been received and published on the website alongside the accounting documents which were approved. The period for the exercise of public rights was agreed as 3<sup>rd</sup> June to 14<sup>th</sup> July. All documentation has been published on the website. The accounts have been submitted to the external auditor following approval.

The balance of the Community account as at 30th April 2025 was confirmed as £29,271.32, Business Money Manager (Earmarked reserves) was £38635.46.

The next Parish Council Meetings will be held on the 5th June and 3rd July. These meetings will be held at the Village Hall. Members of the public are warmly invited to attend. The Council usually meet on the first Thursday of every month except for January & August. Please check the website or noticeboard for any changes. ### **Finance**

The Annual Accounts 2024-25 were approved, and copies of these documents can be seen on the Council's website. The Council declared themselves exempt from Limited Assurance Review.

### The Chairman's annual report

The past year has seen a new Clerk appointed and we welcomed Jo Boxall, an experienced and qualified professional to keep us in order and guide us through the ever-increasing maze of regulations imposed on us by central Government. My thanks to our previous Clerk, Ali Blatchford, and to Linda Rose for stepping in to assist in the transitional period.

After many years of campaigning to improve the state of the two lay-bys in the village on the A1067 road, the installation of signs and the cutting down of vegetation has considerably reduced the amount of litter and fly tipping in these areas and my thanks to Bill Borrett for his help and persistence in achieving this, and also to Linda Rose for arranging our regular Litter Picks to try and keep the village tidy.

We have installed two new dog fouling signs in the village and repaired one dog bin to help with the ever-increasing number of dogs in the village.

A new Local Plan is being instigated by Breckland. The target for Breckland Housing has been raised from 625 dwellings per annum to 903 by Central Government which is a considerable challenge.

Only one site in Foxley has been submitted which seems to have been rejected as totally unsuitable in the initial review.

The population of Foxley has increased from 285 in 2011 to 349 in 2021, an increase of 22%, the highest percentage increase in any Breckland community.

Many people would feel Foxley has taken its share of development for a village with minimal facilities, although it looks as Bawdeswell is earmarked for yet another large expansion.

My thanks to the Village Hall Committee for their continued efforts to keep the Hall thriving and vibrant, particularly to Gillian and Linda who without their enthusiasm we would not see the Hall functioning at its present level.

My thanks also to Gordon Bambridge and Bill Borrett for the input and help and also to my fellow Councillors.



### **Reverend Richard Reflects**

As I write this, I am about to go away for two nights on a conference. It is an 'Incumbency Skills Conference' which is compulsory for all priests in a first-time incumbency post (or equivalent) and designed to help equip us for the tasks we may face in the coming years. The handout for just one of the sessions (financial and legal matters) is 93 pages long: I think I'll follow it on my laptop rather than print it out!

But it made me think about what people are expected to do in their daily role that is not necessarily something you might automatically assume was their responsibility.

When you become a vicar (or whatever the actual job title happens to be) you take on the cure of souls for a parish (or parishes). You know that you will have to attend PCC meetings. You know that you will take funerals, weddings, and baptisms, along with Sunday services. You know that you will be expected to pray daily. What is not normally advertised when you apply for a role, and is tacitly assumed that you will understand, is that you will probably become a trustee of a certain number of historic charities, and maybe a school governor, a children's worker, a social media content creator, and perhaps other things too. All of this is par for the course. But it is also generally assumed that a calling to look after the spiritual wellbeing of a group of parishes will automatically gift you with the skills and knowledge to navigate your way through church law, and through finance matters, and to be an expert on almost every situation that comes across your prayer desk.

Priests are not alone in this. Many other vocations seem to rely on the person being called having a skill set beyond the immediate and obvious demands of their role. Teachers are just one more example of this.

For my part, I know that I cannot do everything that is needed on my own. I also know, as it was part of my ordination service, that I don't do anything in my own strength, but with the grace and power of God. Still, it is reassuring to know that there are many people whose particular skills also support me in my calling. So, I would like to express my heartfelt thanks to all those people, and to all those who support and help anyone else in their vocation. You are invaluable. You are a gift. We thank you.
