

Bawdeswell Village Hall Update

The month of April was a bit of a milestone for our village hall! The most exciting news has been the installation of 44 solar panels which are now commissioned and helping to keep our electricity bills down. The work was completed on the 31st of March in two days by Impact Services. Special thanks must go to Carolyn Good, the Chair of the Village Hall committee who spent hours researching similar projects, chasing possible funding organisations, filling out funding applications, negotiating with all and sundry, and keeping us all informed of progress. A shout out as well to Bob Kuczma whose knowledge, expertise and experience on solar panels ensured the best and most effective choice for the village hall. We have been fortunate in obtaining grants from both the Community Lottery Fund and Norfolk Offshore Wind Zone Community Fund totalling £22,500. Events held locally, donations, gifts, a grant from the Parish Council from monies raised from the Bottle Bank have raised further sums but we still need to raise a further £1.500.

A successful Quiz Night took place in March and an Italian evening and a cream tea took place in April. A village Family Barbecue is planned for the 21st of June. Do come along and support our fundraising. We hope to be able to now substantially reduce monthly electricity costs (some months were costing nearly £2000!) and from this month hope to be selling surplus electricity back to the National Grid. Let us keep fingers crossed for weeks of sunny weather.

The Village Hall continues to be well used by groups from all over the area, hosting a variety of different events. The recent screening of the third Paddington film saw the largest cinema audience to date, the Friends of Bawdeswell Church held a very successful Bingo night attended by around 70 people, the Norfolk Churches Trust met with over 100 people attending, but small groups ranging from 6-20 regularly book in to use our facilities, and local families hold functions as well. A wide range of different clubs and societies thank us for the facilities on offer, homemade cakes are particularly mentioned! Thank you once again to all the Volunteers who staff these events, making people welcome, providing refreshments and carrying out all the preparation, administration, organisation and clearing up.

The weekly Tuesday Coffee mornings are a chance to catch up so do feel free to come along. The monthly Soup and Pud for the cost of £5 (where else locally can you get such a bargain?) is well attended and if you don't have ready cash, we do have a card machine.

Please note that our next coffee morning in Foxley will be on Wednesday 4th June at 10:00 am.


Foxley Litter Pick




Book Group

Community Car Scheme: Bawdeswell, Bylaugh, Foxley

Once again, I must pay tribute to our amazing volunteer drivers who give up their time and energy so that this valuable local voluntary service can continue. Not all local villages are so fortunate to have such a scheme so we are truly grateful.

Service is often done by the few for the many, as of course in WW2, our very few brave airmen, soldiers and sailors gave their lives for so many of us to enjoy freedom today. Long may our local voluntary services continue.

We do however welcome new drivers who would like to give a few hours a month for the Community Car Scheme. It's a great way of meeting new people and gaining the satisfaction and wellbeing from volunteering.

The system operates by our volunteer drivers collecting 20p per mile from the passenger and the balance of 25p per mile being paid by Bawdeswell or Foxley Parish Councils, making up a total of 45p per mile. Interestingly the statutory mileage allowance increased to 45p per mile on 6th April 2011. Hopefully this will be increased again at some point!

Whilst we do our very best to help with a journey, there are the odd occasions we can't help, so do please **give as much notice as possible** and we will try our best to help if a volunteer driver is available. I am sometimes unavailable to take calls, so please leave a message for me and I will get back to you. Thank you.

About the NHS App

The NHS App gives you a simple and secure way to access a range of NHS services. Download the NHS App on your smartphone or tablet via the <u>Google play</u> or <u>App store</u>. You can also access the same services in a web browser by <u>logging in through the NHS website</u>.

You must be aged 13 or over to use the NHS App. You also need to be registered with a GP surgery in England or the Isle of Man. Find out more about who can use the NHS App.

What you can do with the NHS App

You need to prove who you are to get full access to the NHS App. With full access you can:

- order repeat prescriptions and nominate a pharmacy where you would like to collect them
- book and manage appointments



THE BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON THURSDAY 3^{rd} APRIL 2025 AT 7pm

Matters arising Local Plan

The final date for the new call for sites was confirmed as 28th April and it was anticipated that it would be late May for consultation with Breckland, possible end of year for approval of the Local Plan.

Land opposite The Street

The Managing Director for Bayfield Homes produced an indicative plan for the site opposite entrance to The Street (site put forward for consideration by Breckland). A mix of 2, 3 and 4 bedroom homes built with a variety of materials (brick, render, and flint) was suggested and included affordable housing to meet expectations. A suggestion for bungalows was made. It was acknowledged that there was concern over the access to the site and a mini roundabout may be needed for safe access. Concern was raised about flooding on the site and the effect more building would have on neighbouring properties. Developer acknowledged the need to address flooding concerns and carry out ground investigations on the site with a view to exceeding the expectations of the flood agency. It was confirmed that the developer would work with existing trees and hedges, and where necessary trees would be replaced with heavy standards.

A suggestion was made to move the proposed open space from the rear of the site to the front to give adjoining / all properties on the site boundary a view of trees / fields.

Concern was raised about the lack of infrastructure for additional families (school places etc.). It was acknowledged that there is currently a housing first policy in the UK. The need for facilities in the village was highlighted. There would be further public consultation and the design for the site would be adjusted as necessary.

Play area

NGF Play attended the play area and replaced the safety chains on the flat swings as both had been tampered with. The Council agreed to purchase the container on the recreation ground from the Football Club for £500.



Highway Matters

Following an email to Highways the following response was received; 'The 20MPH speed limit, as previously explained to the Parish by the Engineer, is with the designer. Once completed it will go to NP Law. As this is a legal order it can take up to 12 months to deliver. The 3 issues mentioned (Sign, junction surface, white lines) are all programmed for work.'

Bawdeswell Heath

The Charity Commission had responded to the request to sell land at the Heath to Norfolk Wildlife Trust (NWT) with a lengthy document believing the sale is not best value for money. The Bawdeswell Heath Trustees are taking legal advice and exploring options to rent out the land to NWT for £400/year. It was agreed that the heath land held in trust by the Parish Council could be included in the agreement for a peppercorn rent.

Planning

Application PL/2025/0408/FMIN Proposal: Widening of existing entrance to improve access for HGVs Site: Cobb Breeding Co Ltd Elsing Lane, Bawdeswell The Council unanimously agreed that they had no comment or objection to the application.

Other matters

The Parish Council agreed to donate £300 from the recycling credits towards sponsorship of a solar panel at the Village Hall.

Finance

The balance of the Community account as at 31st March 2025 was confirmed as £14749.86, Business Money Manager (Earmarked reserves) was £38579.06.

The Annual Parish Meeting and Annual Parish Council Meeting will be held on the 1st May. These meetings will be held at the Village Hall. Members of the public are warmly invited to attend. The Council usually meet on the first Thursday of every month except for January & August. Please check the website or noticeboard for any changes.



CHURCH NEWS

Reverend Richard Reflects

By the time you read this, Easter will be over and done. At least, as far as the shops are concerned. There might still be some reduced price eggs available, but for the most part Easter will be forgotten about until next year.

But in the Church the season of Easter carries on. Our worship uses Easter phrases and imagery. We use Easter colours in our church buildings. Yet even then it is easy to forget the joy of Easter and return to 'normal.'

So, this year, I have decided to make use of something called 'The Stations of the Resurrection.' In the lead up to Easter, many churches have a tradition of following the Stations of the Cross. It is a way of reflecting on Jesus' journey to his crucifixion. The Stations of the Resurrection do a similar thing, but for the period of time following Jesus' rising. It is a form of pilgrimage, and so I aim to travel around to follow the stations.

There's something to be said for movement. Some of us find moving around quite difficult. Some of us find it difficult to stay still. But when it comes to worship, many people's idea of Christian worship is sitting still in uncomfortable pews and only moving in order to get up and sing the odd hymn. But worship expressed as pilgrimage engages the senses in different ways as you move from one place to another. It can be as simple as moving from one part of a building to another, where the light is different or the sounds change. It can be moving from one village to another, where you notice the slope of a hill, or the change in plant life as you travel.

Faith should be a journey. It can have periods of rest, where you stay in one place and focus on something for a while; but ultimately you move on. Hopefully your faith deepens as you journey. That's not the same as saying that your understanding deepens. It might. But it's a journey of faith, not knowledge. So, in this season of Easter, when we think about new life and new beginnings, may I encourage you to take some steps on that journey (however far you may already have travelled). And, as Harry Kim said on the final episode of Star Trek: Voyager, here's 'to the journey.'
