Fakenham Choral Society to perform Benjamin Britten's Saint Nicolas and Vivaldi's Magnificat at its Christmas concert

Fakenham Choral Society's popular Christmas Concert will take place in Fakenham Parish Church on Saturday 13 December at 5.30pm. The concert will include Benjamin Britten's Saint Nicolas and Vivaldi's short and lively Magnificat, together with other festive music performed by the choir and the chance for audience participation in some familiar and well-loved carols.

Although the Britten and the Vivaldi have contrasting styles, both have strong associations with Christmas. The Magnificat uses Mary's words of praise that she would be the mother of Jesus.

St. Nicolas famously became the Santa Claus much celebrated in Europe, and better known to us as Father Christmas. Britten's work tells the life story of St. Nicolas through a series of vivid episodes. It begins with his miraculous birth, described as an answer to prayer, followed by his early devotion to God. The narrative continues with his calming of a storm during a journey to Palestine, his appointment as Bishop of Myra, and the legendary rescue of the "pickled boys." It concludes with his imprisonment and a celebration of his long life filled with piety and miraculous deeds.

The concert is free with a retiring collection. Doors will open at 4.45pm and seating will be on a first come first served basis until seating capacity is reached. There will be wine and soft drinks to purchase in the interval and free mince pies to enjoy.

Bawdeswell Village Hall Update

As we look back over the past months, we feel a sense of pride that our Village Hall continues to be a real hub of the community. During July, August and September, regular clubs continued to meet and thrive; meetings took place; families held celebrations and get togethers covering all occasions from baptisms, birthdays and celebrations of a loved one's life; there was a Bowls tournament complete with shining silver trophies; the regular Tuesday coffee mornings continued to be well attended and the monthly cinema was held.

Over the period of the school holidays a loyal and stalwart band of volunteers opened up the Hall on weekday afternoons to provide families and young people welcome drinks, ices and snacks to ensure they were kept hydrated and could take advantage of the Hall's facilities. Some afternoons saw only a few takers but on others a steady flow visited. Overall feedback was very positive with relatives who had not been before remarking they wished they had a similar facility where they lived! A very big thank you to everyone who volunteered and gave up time to provide cover especially when the temperature soared.

A highlight during the late summer and early autumn is a visit to the Hall to discover what extra produce brought in from local gardens is on offer. It is free to take away rather than ending up on the compost heap or rotting under a tree! There was a veritable cornucopia of fruit and vegetables: tomatoes, plums and beans of various varieties, apples, pears, sloes. How generous of people to bring it in to share and contribute to people's health and well-being. Thank you.

You may notice as you stroll, walk your dog, drive or cycle through the village that the common areas of grass and hedges and the field at the Hall always look well cared for. This is due to the upkeep and efforts of a small band of gentlemen and lady villagers who regularly, mow, trim and prune them;- Chris, Dave, Den, Chris, Helen, Graham, Ron, Paul and Trevor together with the Muddy Badgers duo, Adam and Ali. Our grateful thanks to them all for the time and effort and expertise they employ.

The high temperatures during the summer months has paid dividends with the installation of the solar panels and we are now regularly selling back to the National Grid and looking forward to a decrease in electricity costs for the Hall.

A successful Last Night of the Proms and cinema showing took place in September as did the MacMillan Coffee morning. Thank you to all who attended and contributed to the latter by baking and bringing cakes and other goodies to share to raise funds for the charity which has supported several local residents.



He survives two disastrous campaigns before being killed in 1916, at the Battle of the Somme. He was 32.

Breckland Local Plan

A copy of the Council's submission to Breckland regarding potential development sites in Bawdeswell can be found on the Council's website (under minutes 2025). A further consultation is expected in October. Residents are encouraged to put their views forward to Breckland.

Following Breckland cabinet approval, Bawdeswell was confirmed as a primary parish (no longer a key service Centre). It was understood that the hierarchy 'will help inform the allocation of development within the district seeking to ensure that development is directed to the most sustainable locations. The numbers that will be required to be located within the rural areas have yet to be established. They will be dependent on existing commitments and completions of houses, the number and location of the Strategic Development Areas (SDAs) and the number of houses the SDAs will be able to deliver and the trajectory for that delivery.'

Community Car Scheme

The Community Car Scheme operates for residents of Bawdeswell, Foxley & Bylaugh. The car scheme caters for journeys which cannot reasonably be made by public transport or where the potential passenger would have difficulty in using public transport. The Car Scheme can only operate if it has the volunteers to provide the service and has recently had to turn down requests due to the lack of volunteers. The Scheme is currently looking for new volunteers to help out.

Highway matters

Motorbikes – It was confirmed that the Police stopped a young Bawdeswell resident who was driving anti-socially in Dereham and been given a section 59 Police Reform Act warning. It was confirmed that more details were needed to be able to take further action against offending motorbikes.

Parking Horkeys – Following complaints, advice was sought from the Safer Neighbourhood Team Leader, raising concern about parking on the edge of the road. The Police spoke to Horkeys warning them of the situation. The Police pointed out that unless they were creating a hazard, there was nothing further the Police could do

Overgrown hedges / parking on pavements

Overgrown hedges next to footpaths and roads pose a real hazard to people who are disabled or who are visually impaired and young children or other pedestrians who risk injury or damage to their faces or clothing from thorns or branches. It is an offence under the Highways Act 1980 to allow trees, hedges, shrubs and so on to obstruct the highway. Please cut back your hedges and trees to within your boundary and regularly maintain them so that they do not become a problem.

Cars parking on pavements continues to cause an issue for people trying to use the paths around the village. Mobility scooters and parents with prams are having to go on the road because cars are parked on the pavements. Please Park responsibly!

Vandalism of play equipment and dogs on the playing field

Unfortunately, there has been further vandalism to the children's play area by irresponsible dog owner/s who have allowed their dog/s to chew on the seats of several pieces of play equipment. The cost of replacement is expected to be in excess of £1000 and will need to be met by residents in the Council tax precept. Despite dog poo bags being available and warning signage, dog mess is still being found around the children's play area. The Council are now looking at options for excluding dogs from the play area, including the possibility of seeking a PSPO order banning dogs from the recreation ground altogether if the situation continues.

Finance

The balance of the Community account as at 31st August 2025 was confirmed as £22822.55, Business Money Manager (Earmarked reserves) was £38843.99.

The next Parish Council Meetings will be held on the 2nd October and 6th November 2025. These meetings will be held at the Village Hall. Members of the public are warmly invited to attend. The Council usually meet on the first Thursday of every month except for January & August. Please check the website or noticeboard for any changes.

They did a very thorough job replacing the crumbling 1950's roofing felt, all the wooden battens, other rotting timber where necessary, all the leadwork, and finally the relining of the stone gutters. The inspecting architect gave a glowing report.

The church was 70 years old this September and we can now be reassured that the roof will last longer than that in the future.

On Sunday 5th October, All Saints Church Bawdeswell will be celebrating Harvest Thanksgiving and will be collecting items for the Dereham Food Bank.

We would like to combine this event with a thank-you to all who worked on the church roof and to all our donors who raised the funds to do so.

It will be an informal Word and Praise service and we would be pleased to see you at 10.30am but if you feel unable to join in with that, please come along at the end of the service at 11.15 to join in with the refreshments.

Reverend Richard Reflects

'As we rejoice in the gift of this new day...'

These are words that feature each morning in the Common Worship liturgy for morning prayer. As a Church of England priest, praying morning and evening prayer is an expectation. But daily prayer is not something reserved for the clergy. When the Church of England was brought into existence and the Book of Common Prayer created, it was envisioned that all people would be able to join in with the morning and evening office: that's why it was called the Book of Common Prayer, and why the more modern liturgy is called Common Worship. The words, the prayers, are supposed to join us together across the breadth of the Church of England and across time. Of course, not everyone who prays will choose to use the formal liturgy. Many people say their own prayers in their own way and at whatever time they prefer. There are many prayer resources available: books on how to pray and what to pray, and about prayer that is answered and prayer that is unanswered; videos on the internet about the same topics; apps that you can download to help guide your prayers. Some people feel more prayerful in a building, others find it easier to pray outside in nature.

As I have grown in discipleship, I have found prayer increasingly important. It's not just for those times when we might want to ask God for something: dear God, please let there not be traffic on the way to the meeting this morning. It's not just for those times when we are sorry for something: dear God, forgive me for being grumpy with the delivery person. It's not just for the times when we want to say thank you: dear God, thank you that the weather held out for the barbecue. Prayer is for all times, all events, all situations. It is a way of bringing all aspects of our life to God; a way of rooting ourselves in Him.

I encourage you to pray more often and more deeply. It really does make a difference. I usually pray morning prayer in St Margaret's, Lyng at 9am on Mondays — Thursdays, and it is open to everyone. Why not consider joining me sometimes? I'm always happy to talk to people about prayer, so seek me out if you want to chat about it. Whatever you do, find what works for you so that you can have a relationship with our creator God.
