JOHN MALLEN RIP

Before retiring to Norfolk, John pursued a full and varied career in education, leading to the point when he became the Director of Education in Harrow. Once he, and his partner Roger, moved to Norfolk, John became closely involved in local politics, and I stress the word 'local'! Having been a very successful district councillor, he was very narrowly defeated by our current councillor, Gordon Bambridge, and John and I often laughed at my conviction that I would have voted for John to save the day had I been around at the time, despite his claim to be a 'champagne socialist' while I was slightly to the right of Genghis Khan! But the point of the tale is not to highlight political differences, but simply to stress that John was dedicated to local issues rather than party politics. His whole *raison d'être* seemed to be local issues, affecting local people and for the benefit of the local community.

During my 20 years in Bawdeswell, John Mallen was always 'there', at the forefront of everything 'community'! I managed 2 brief stints on the parish council, but John was there for 20+ years, either Vice-Chair or, more recently and right up to his death, as Chair of Bawdeswell Parish Council; continually doing his level best to ensure that the people of Bawdeswell not only received the best support from higher authority but also that their concerns were duly represented to that authority.

But his forte didn't stop at the local council; John brought his influence to bear everywhere in the village. He was one of the mainstays in organising the new village hall project, and, for the last ten years, he has been one of the stalwart volunteers, both in making and keeping the Village Hall at the centre of community life, be it organising events or just serving coffee and cakes; John was always at the heart of it all! When we found out that Bawdeswell, coupled with Foxley and Bylaugh, could benefit from a community car service for medical transport assistance etc. John, again, was at the forefront of organising what has since become the envy of many in Breckland!

John's philanthropy did not stop at just offering his service and many talents either. When the new village hall and children's play area projects became a financial reality, you can guess who was at the forefront of digging deep into his own pocket!

John, you will be sadly missed by everyone; not only for your dedication and commitment to our community, but also for your sparkling wit, good nature and friendly attitude to all. God keep you safe until we meet again.

Sadly, my friend there are not too many people of your calibre around! I feel privileged to have known you!

Fakenham Choral Society to perform Louis Vierne's *Messe Solonelle* and Matthew Coleridge's *Requiem* at its Spring Concert

At its Spring 2026 concert Fakenham Choral Society will be performing Louis Vierne's *Messe Solonelle* and Matthew Coleridge's *Requiem*.

Vierne's *Messe solennelle*, composed in 1899, was scored for choir and two organs. It was published in 1900, before it was first performed at Saint-Sulpice in Paris in December 1901. It was later adapted for a single organ, as most churches could not provide two such instruments.

Matthew Coleridge is a UK-based choral composer whose music is regularly performed by amateur and professional choirs around the world.

His *Requiem* has become one of the UK's most popular new choral works and is a regular fixture in the upper reaches of Classic FM's annual Hall of Fame. Rosemary Dear, Chair of Fakenham Choral Society, says: 'We really like the idea of complementing a new work with something older and more traditional and chose these particular pieces of music as both require an organ accompaniment rather than our usual use of an orchestra. We are hiring an organ for the concert and the organist will be a previous FCS accompanist, James Mooney Dutton.

'The Coleridge has become very popular on Classic FM so, although it is a relatively new work, many people will have heard some snatches of it already. The Vierne is a big and bold work that will fill the church with the sound of both voices and organ.'

The concert will take place at Fakenham Parish Church on Saturday 21 March at 7.00pm.




Book Group

"Orbital" by Samantha Harvey



Although only a slim volume, it certainly packs a punch and is unlike any other work of fiction. This is our(as readers), opportunity to understand what 24 hours on the Space Station is like. Samantha Harvey has clearly undertaken a great deal of research and immersed herself into the world of astronauts and space. Whilst she does not have personal experience, I can only marvel at the time and energy she must have put into her research. She describes what it is like to be launched into space, to see and feel the various wonders of earth and beyond. She portrays this experience vividly through the differing aspects of the individual astronauts. I found the book very poetical, and in a way got from it the same feeling that I sometimes experience when reading from the Book of Psalms or Book of Revelations in the Bible or one of Shakespeare's sonnets.

One important theme I got from the book was the spirit of co-operation between the Astronauts. The views described from space, their effect on each individual and how it impacted on them personally are well and sympathetically described. They were allotted specific tasks and different areas to be in, but, in reality, they ignored these. Barriers between cultures and one another were broken down. If only this could happen in our world today. We concluded it was a very well deserved winner of the Booker prize!

During January we had our Christmas Reads to enjoy, which we shared with each other at our January Meeting.

We are currently reading ***Remarkably Bright Creatures*** by **Shelby Van Pelt** for discussion at our next meeting on 12th February.

Andi

We are delighted that we now have Andi, our new virtual care navigator.

Andi is helping patients who prefer to submit their Anima requests over the phone rather than complete an online form themselves. This means that if you call the practice and need help submitting an Anima online request, Andi will ask you questions, just like the online form and will take down your answers. This will then be automatically submitted to our Triage team, and they will respond just as they would do if you submitted online.

How does it work and what this means for you

- If you would prefer to submit your request using the telephone, you will now be able to select the option and it will put you through to Andi, who will help complete the Anima request on your behalf.
- You can still submit your own request online through Anima as usual, this is our preference as we gain more information which is important to help triage your request.
- Your request will then be sent straight to the Triage team, ensuring it is handled quickly and efficiently.

Benefits for our patients

- Reduced phone queues – less time waiting to speak to someone as Andi can handle multiple calls at the same time.
- Easier to submit a request by phone – no need to go online if that is not convenient or you struggle with the internet/ forms.

Benefits for the practice

- Freed up staff time to focus on patient care.
- Improves efficiency in managing patient requests.
- Reduces waiting times and eases pressure on phone lines.

Summary

Whilst Andi is AI, he sounds quite natural so much so you may think you are speaking to a real person. As a Practice we are committed to making it easier for all patients to access our services whether online or over the phone.

Thank you for your patience and support as we pilot this new system.

MEETING OF BAWDESWELL PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON THURSDAY 4th DECEMBER 2025 AT 7.00pm

Present: D. Shannon (Acting Chair), A. Hartley-Walder, C. Good, M. Bailey, R. Hannent and P. Craven, Mrs. J Boxall (Clerk) Members of the public – 6

It is with great sadness that the Parish Council has to report that our wonderful Chairman, John Mallen, passed away peacefully just before Christmas. He will be sadly missed, not only within the confines of the Parish Council, where he served with distinction over many years, but also throughout the whole community of Bawdeswell where he was so widely treasured.

Breckland Local Plan

Concern was raised by residents over the proposed development on land North of Foxley Road. Cllr Shannon gave a brief update and confirmed the Council had submitted their objections to Breckland. Cllr Shannon attended the 'drop-in session' to push the PC's views. Breckland has suggested that there will be many changes in the final draft plan. The Managing Director from Bayfield Homes gave an update on proposed plans for development on land at Reepham Road and confirmed that they will be making representations, asking Breckland to reconsider proposals for the site with two options, one for 28 new homes and a commercial unit (with flexibility for use) and an additional proposal with no commercial unit but additional houses. The Parish Council were grateful that previous concerns regarding screening for existing houses had been taken into account and welcomed the addition of the commercial unit/s. The junction remained a concern although it was reported that it would meet the visual splay required. There was an option of further traffic calming measures to mitigate risk. Management of public open space remains a concern for the Parish Council in terms of future maintenance costs. The Developer confirmed that their intentions are flexible, it's possible to make a planning application but that would run alongside the local plan. It may have a positive impact on reducing / removing larger allocation.

Bawdeswell Heath

Cllr Shannon attended the Trustee meeting and gave a brief update. The Trustees are now contemplating two choices; taking advice from Norfolk Wildlife Trust (NWT) on a future management plan (which may be outside the initial remit of the charity) or seek permission from the Charity Commission to sell the Heath on the open market irrespective of what it becomes. Due to the Charity Commission's objections, the proposal to sell the Heath to the Norfolk Wildlife Trust is not an option as it would not be for full market value.

Planning

No planning applications were received.

Recreation Ground – PLEASE KEEP YOUR DOG AWAY FROM THE CHILDRENS PLAY AREA!

Sadly, despite the Council putting up numerous notices asking dog owners to keep their dogs away from the children's play area and to clear up after their dogs, it has been noted that some dog owners are just not listening, dogs are continuing to be allowed in the children's play area and dog mess continues to be an issue!

The Council is making a final plea to the inconsiderate dog owner/s who think that it is acceptable to allow their dog/s to poop on the recreation ground, especially around the children's play equipment, and not clear it up. There is a dog bin and the Council has provided easily accessible litter bins into which you can place bagged dog poo. Dog poo bags are usually available in case you've forgotten your own. There is a risk to health from dog mess which should not be underestimated! Children really want to play on the park. It's an amazing facility and they just want to run around, play and have fun. Nobody wants to have to watch where they are putting their feet all the time, to have to check the area before letting little ones play. Nobody wants to have to clean dog mess from little one's hands or wash their clothes and scrape shoes because some dog owners are irresponsible, therefore **PLEASE** keep an eye on your dog at all times when they are on the recreation ground, keep them away from the children's play area and clear up when they do their business!

IT IS ILLEGAL NOT TO CLEAR UP AFTER YOUR DOG AND THERE IS NO EXCUSE NOT TO!

The Parish Council do not want to have to take stronger measures to control the issue but if the situation doesn't improve, further measures will need to be considered.

Finance

The balance of the Community account as at 30th November 2025 was confirmed as £30,128.36, Business Money Manager (Earmarked reserves) was £38,843.75. Budget figures were circulated to Council for consideration and can be viewed on the Council's website. An internal control check was carried out; no concerns were raised.

Precept requirements for 2026/27 – The Clerk circulated budget figures for consideration along with predicted end of year general and earmarked reserves.

Following discussion, it was unanimously agreed that in order to build a reserve for the future maintenance of the play area and include £500 for the future maintenance of Adams Pit, it would be necessary to increase the precept to £34250.

The next Parish Council Meetings will be held on Thursday 5th February 2026 and Thursday 5th March 2026. These meetings will be held at the Village Hall. Members of the public are warmly invited to attend. The Council usually meet on the first Thursday of every month except for January & August. Please check the website or noticeboard for any changes.

Parish Partnership Funding application for pedestrian signage. – an application was submitted to Norfolk County Council, no update yet received.

Finance

The balance of the main account as at 31st December 2025 was £5884.37, the balance of the savings account was £2577.20.

Budget Figures were circulated for consideration ahead of the January meeting where the Council set the precept for 2026/27 (the precept is the amount of money the Parish Council requires from Council Tax payers in Foxley) Following discussion it was agreed to increase the precept by 4% to £7778 as it was acknowledged that there was a need to build reserves for future maintenance to the village sign and war memorial. The reserves policy was reviewed and approved and can be viewed on the Council's website.

CHURCH NEWS

Reverend Richard Reflects

February starts with the feast known as Candlemas, when the church remembers the occasion on which Christ was recognised in the temple by Simeon and Anna. Both people meet the infant Jesus, and see something in him that appears to be hidden from others. They have a vision for the future, in which Jesus plays the central role. The beginning of February this year also marks the first anniversary of my taking on the role of curate-in-charge in the eight parishes of the Bawdeswell Group. The combination of those two things made me think that perhaps now was a good time to look ahead.

It is often quite tricky in rural ministry to think about planning ahead with a vision in mind. We're usually a small group of people in each individual church, trying our hardest to raise enough money to pay the utility bills, pay for ministry (for my job!), and to keep the roof on and the walls standing upright. And to be sure, there are some big tasks ahead of us this year in that respect: Foxley needs a major fundraising effort for essential building works to make it safe; Themelthorpe has significant issues with drainage, that seriously affects access at certain times; many of our churches need more routine repairs to roofing, guttering, and flooring, not to mention the items we would say we would love to have in an ideal world - heating, upgraded electrics, plumbing, and facilities for hospitality.

Our church buildings have been at the centre of their communities for hundreds of years, but the national picture is that many are now at risk. Few people realise that the costs of maintaining and improving them rest entirely on the efforts of the local community. With that weight on our shoulders, it's no wonder we find it hard to have a wider vision.

But that's what I've been thinking about at the start of this new year. Wouldn't it be wonderful to have a shared vision about how to share the love of Christ in all of our communities? Wouldn't it be great to know that we were in a position to think about more than maintenance, and to minister beyond our walls? I know, as do many of you, that the folk from our churches are deeply embedded in village life at all levels. For this, I want to thank them. And I want to encourage more of you, whether you attend worship regularly or not, to have an input into the vision of our churches. Of your churches. What could we be doing, and how could we do it? But more than that, I want to encourage you to share with us in the work that will need to happen if the local churches are to thrive and not just survive. Because I believe that a thriving, healthy church can contribute to a thriving, healthy community.

If any of this has struck a chord with you, I would be delighted to chat about it with you sometime.
