Now up and running with some fantastic prizes to win:

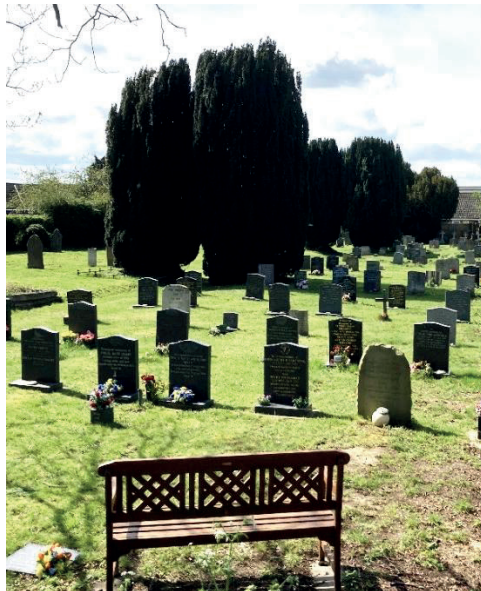

Councillor Vacancy

Breckland advised that the period during which electors might request an election to fill the casual vacancy on the Council has now elapsed, no requests were received.

The Council may now proceed to fill the vacancy by co-option.

If you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor, please contact the Clerk for further information. The closing date for applications is the 23rd May. The Council are hoping to co-opt a new Councillor at their meeting on 4th June.

Breckland Local Plan

There is no further update on the Local Plan. Residents are reminded and encouraged to submit their views to Breckland Planning.

Local Government Reorganisation

The Government has confirmed its decision on Local Government Reorganisation (LGR) in Norfolk. They have opted to replace current arrangements with three new unitary authorities, West, East and Greater Norwich. The following timeline was given; Later this year the Government will set out the legislation to enact this 'minded to' decision, this will include details of interim governance
May 2027 – Shadow elections take place for the new unitary councils.

31st March 2028 – Breckland Council will close.

1st April 2028 - The new unitary council 'goes live' and takes over from predecessors
It is acknowledged that Council tax will increase with no improvement in services due to the reorganisation and there will be disruption to services.

Play Area

Breckland District Council has advised as *'the parish council owns the recreation ground, it is entitled, as landowner, to set conditions for its use. This can include prohibiting dogs altogether or requiring that they are kept on leads. The council may also ask individuals to leave the land if they fail to comply with these conditions.*

Breckland supports the Council's use of clear and prominent signage and would encourage residents to report incidences of dog fouling;

The Council remains hopeful that dog owners will come together to form a proposal for the benefit of all recreation ground users.

Reverend Richard Reflects

This month sees our Eco Fair at Elsing church on 16th May. We hope that it will be a chance for everyone to explore different ways they can engage with caring for the environment and God's creation. It is also proving to be a great opportunity for people to volunteer.

The church, it hopefully won't surprise you to read, relies on its volunteers. Even large churches with paid staff rely on volunteers for many of the things that happen there, but the rural church couldn't survive without its volunteers. Almost everything that happens in our churches involves volunteering. We have volunteers who clean our churches; volunteers who decorate our churches with flowers; volunteers who tend our churchyards; volunteers who open and close our churches; volunteers who ring our bells for services; volunteers who sing for our choirs; volunteers who read in our services; volunteers who play the organ; volunteers who lead the services that I'm not leading; volunteers who take on our safeguarding roles; volunteers who represent their congregation on the PCC; volunteers who take on the role of churchwarden. And there are other volunteers as well! We have people who volunteer their time, and we have people who volunteer their financial support. The rural church needs all of these volunteers. Any building work or maintenance to a church building needs to be paid for by the local church itself: it isn't paid for by the Church of England centrally. Or grants have to be applied for by volunteers. The energy bills and insurance for our churches have to be paid for by the local church. The cost of ministry by the clergy is met by the local church. Without our volunteers, our churches would not survive.

So, this month, why not think about whether there is something you could do to volunteer to help your local parish church? There will always be someone happy to talk to you about volunteering opportunities and ways to support your church. Much of what happens each week goes largely unnoticed, but it would certainly be felt if it stopped. Our churches have sought to be at the heart of their communities for centuries, serving the people of their parishes. We pray that we will be able to continue to serve you all and to be there for you when you need us. Perhaps you can help us do that? Our volunteers are a real blessing, and I thank them all.
